Dear friends.

It's the time of year when we begin to look ahead to our APCMs (Annual Parochial Church Meetings), which will be held in the four churches of our benefice on different dates in May. It is wonderful to have four beautiful church buildings which are used by the regular worshipping congregations and by members for the wider community for weddings, baptisms and funerals. And we still have open churchyards in all our villages where generations of local families have been buried. And managing all of this and more is part of the role of the Parish Church. But a church does not run itself. It is hard work to keep everything going and in good order, and we would not be able to do this without the support and involvement of our volunteers who help and give of their time and talents on a regular basis and with great dedication. But as the saying goes, many hands make light work and I am askinng for your help. Stratford and Holton don't have enough members on their PCCs (Parochial Church Councils). The PCCs meet 4x per year and make decisions about the running of church. In Raydon and Higham, we only have one churchwarden whereas it would make the role so much easier if two wardens were sharing the role. In Stratford, Jonathan will be retiring from his role as churchwarden and we need one, if not two people to take his place. In Higham, we need to find a new PCC secretary as soon as possible. The secretary writes up the minutes during our meetings and helps us prepare for the annual meetings.

Running the church is not just about Sundays, but it is about being involved. Being a follower of Jesus is moving on from being merely a consumer on Sundays to becoming an active member of the church community.

Whether it could be a belated New Year's resolution or a feeling that God might be calling you to try something new, can I ask you to prayerfully consider whether you could become involved in your local church?

In the words of St Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 4:11-16, "The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup> to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ... speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

# Stratford St Mary Parish Council THERMAL IMAGING PROJECT

#### Helping You Keep Your Warmth In

The Suffolk Climate Change Partnership, which is made up of all the Local Authorities in Suffolk, have purchased several thermal imaging cameras which they are loaning out to community groups to carry out surveys in their areas for free.

Stratford St Mary Parish Council has booked a camera for **Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April to Monday 24<sup>th</sup> April 2023** 

Our aim in running the project is to raise awareness about insulation, and if possible, help you to improve the energy efficiency of your house. This could mean a reduction in fuel bills, better health and also reducing the total amount of carbon dioxide that we emit into the atmosphere which is important for stopping climate change.

#### What is thermal imaging?

Thermal imaging works by detecting the infra-red radiation emitted by a building and using it to determine the temperature of the surface of walls, windows, doors, roof etc. Objects at different temperatures emit varying amounts of infra-red and the infra-red camera translates these differences into an image with different colours representing cool (blue/purple) to hot (white/red) temperatures.

Infra-red radiation cannot pass through glass and so the camera cannot see through your windows, doors or walls. This means that a thermal imaging survey will not invade your privacy, and what we are seeing in the images is only the outside surface of the house. Glass actually reflects infra-red radiation, so any shapes

you may see in pictures of the windows will be due to reflections from outside.

A thermal image of the outside surface of your house is useful because it can show areas which maybe conducting heat from the inside to the outside of the house. Ideally insulation, either in a cavity inside the walls or in a laver in the loft, should minimise the heat loss through the walls or loft. However, if there are gaps in the insulation, or places where it has been bridged by a conducting structure, then we will see a hotter pattern on the outside surface. Similarly for windows and doors, we can see in the image if there is a poor seal around them that is letting warm air escape, or if they are poorly insulated (e.g. single glazed windows).

### What can you learn from a thermal imaging survey?

If your house is relatively new, already has insulated cavity walls and double glazing and feels warm – you might not learn much, except to get an even warmer glow after confirming your house is well insulated!

If your house is older and seems difficult to keep warm - you might learn exactly where the heat is escaping and get some ideas about where to insulate.

A thermal imaging survey might

- identify places which might have draughts
- detect whether cavity wall insulation is patchy or missing
- detect areas with less loft insulation (although roofs are tricky to image with the camera)

#### NEWS FROM KING GEORGE'S FIELD TRUSTEES

With the festive season out of the way, the Trustees have begun the daunting task of trying to raise the £500-600,000 that will be needed to build a new community building to replace the pavilion and the previous village hall. The proceeds from the sale of the village hall have given us a good start towards this target, but we still need to raise more than a quarter of a million pounds! We are already in discussion with the Parish Council and with Babergh District Council about grants from the Community Infrastructure Levy and have submitted an application to the Platinum Jubilee Village Hall Fund to assist with building costs. Other funding organisations have been identified and are being researched with more grant applications to follow in due course.

Meetings during January with the architect and with the project management company should give us a better idea of building costs, and what we can achieve for our budget, so that the architect can begin to produce some concept drawings. We will be engaging with the main tenants at the pavilion over the coming weeks to ensure that the new building will satisfy their future needs and by early Spring we hope to organise a broader consultation event with the village to present our initial plans and seek a wider input of views.

Whilst active fundraising continues we are also planning for this Summer's Farmer's Market which is scheduled for Sunday, 16th July.

With the cold snap before Christmas highlighting the need for us to look out for our neighbours, it's worth pointing out that our utility providers offer a priority service for vulnerable residents. Those eligible will need to register with their providers in order to qualify for the helpful additional support available:

If you're an expectant mother or have a baby under 12 months old – AW will contact you as a priority if your water supply is going to be interrupted.

If you're deaf, or have a sight, hearing, or speech impairment - AW can send your bills in large print, Braille, or audio formats. Or can send your bills to a friend or relative.

If you have restricted mobility or a disability - AW can offer to read your meter for you. And, if they need to visit, will know to wait to give you more time to answer the door.

If you have a serious or long-term illness – AW will look at the best ways to support you and give you priority during any changes to your water supply.

If you need mental health support - You can talk to AW over the phone, email, or live chat – and they will work out a way to support you.

If you're caring for a loved one -AW can add you to its nominee scheme, so you can manage their account for them. If your loved one is also signed up to AW's Priority Services Register, AW can contact you to let you know about any interruptions to your loved one's water supply, and work with you to get them the help they need. A nominee can also sign someone up for the Priority Services Register.

As in many other countries, the initial 6 months financial support has ceased and many are left wondering what will happen to them in the New Year, they can't go home but how will they stay?

As our CEO had travelled in advance taking the Charity Mini Bus we were also able to send all the goods we had collected locally back to Ukraine with the children when they left. So much of this was only possible due to the support of local people for which we are very grateful.







