

Dear friends.

The season of Lent will be upon us very early this year, starting on Ash Wednesday, 10



## Opportunity for Stratford St Mary to celebrate Her Majesty the Queen's 90th Birthday

Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2016 Stratford St Mary School Playing Field 12:50 to 18:00

### Magna Games and Birthday Tea.

Preparation is underway for this year's summer extravaganza in Stratford St Mary. This will be a village sports event followed by a communal tea party with music and entertainments, and ending witch country dancing to the music of the Haywainers.

Outline programme.

12:50 Event Opening, immediately following the flypast (on route to London) 13:00 to 14:00 – Live music, sideshows and amusements around periphery of the field.

14:00 to 16:00 - Magna Games on arena track

Based on the 2015 summer event (on which VillageLife received good feedback), the Magna Games will consist of a series of (slightly silly) competitive activities open to village residents, with medals presented to event winners. Activities will include a repeat of last year's events, Wheelbarrow and water race. Cabbage and spade sprint. Tossing the peat bale, Horseshoe pitching and the Magna endurance race. Planned additions to the programme include a 5 Kilometre 'fun run' starting and finishing in the arena but run mainly along footpaths through and around the village and also a 'dog joggers run' again starting and finishing in the arena but run mainly off-field. The VillageLife Kart fleet will feature in races around the arena

Refreshments (licensed bar, teas/coffees and soft drinks will be available throughout the event, but the main feature will be a Traditional Birthday Tea Party enjoyed by everyone at the same time. To enable this it will be necessary to ask that village residents book their tickets in advance. It will be possible to book for families and small groups, as well as for individuals and tickets will entitle partygoers to a seat at a table in the arena from which it will be possible to watch the Magna Games events, enjoy the birthday tea and entertainment and join in the dancing afterwards. A prize will be awarded to the most patriotically dressed partygoer.

We plan to erect as many gazebos and small marquees as we can around the inside of the arena to accommodate the tea tables and seating and provide some protection if the weather is not up to the standard of last year. 

# Raydon and District Gardening Club

Writing these notes on (18th Jan), after overnight frost but now winter sunshine just coming through, it all seems normal for this time of year, but it was only a week or so ago since we had record mild weather for our winter, which in turn has brought forward a lot of bulbs and odd flowers showing colour in some cases a month early.

In our garden the snowdrops are out 1st week January (18th of Jan normally) followed by early daffs, hellebore, aconites, Bergenia, Iris Reticulata etc. Whilst it's lovely to see these early spring flowers it begs the question will they flower longer? (as temperature has now dropped) if so will they burn up the bulb resources and weaken them so flowering not so good for next year ?? Nature is very clever so we will wait and see. Remember last year it was a cold Spring and things were late. (had to change date of Spring Show) to ensure we had flowers on bloom. The results of the IPSOS Mori/NHS England survey show that overall, GP practices in the NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk and NHS West Suffolk clinical commissioning group areas are performing better than the national average.

Patients were asked to rate their experiences of using their GP practice including the ease of making an appointment, waiting time at the surgery, satisfaction with opening hours and the trust in the care given by the GP or practice

nurse. Results for both CCG areas equalled or exceeded the national average in every category.

Dr Mark Shenton, a GP in Stowmarket and chairman of the NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group said: "For many people, their GP practice is the first port of call for medical help and advice, which is why the results of this survey are pleasing. They show that overall local people are receiving high quality services from their GP practice. Healthcare staff including receptionists, nurses and GPs are all rated highly for the level of care and support they provide. he high quality of NHS healthcare services in Suffolk."






