Our country, like many others, has been battered by storms, we've seen severe frost, snow (lots of it) and flooding in many areas, and as I write this, winter storms are causing disruption for millions of people in the US state of Texas.

For us, here, at last, the weather has turned milder and we hope that spring is on its way. Many of the shrubs and bushes in the Rectory garden still look brown and lifeless, and it will be a while until I know what the garden was designed to look like. I was relieved to see that not just the snowdrops have survived being buried under the heavy snow, but now crocuses and clusters of daffodils are beginning to add some colour to the garden, and I know that other signs of new life will follow suit. The Church calendar doesn't take notice of the weather, and on 17th February we observed Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of Lent. Services took on a different format, being online this year, and we had to forgo the opportunity to be marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. This ancient custom symbolises repentance for wrongdoing and it reminds us of our mortality 'dust you are and to dust you shall return'.

Lent is the period of six weeks (40 days + Sundays) leading up to Easter. As Christians we remember the time when Jesus went into the desert to fast and prav before beginning his public ministry. This period in the wilderness is also a test of self-discipline and Jesus was tempted

several times by Satan, but was able to resist. Traditionally, Christians don't eat certain foods in Lent, such as meat, fish or eggs, and many others give up something they really enjoy such as chocolate, cake or alcohol.

This year, as we mark almost a year of Covid restrictions, we can look back and see that we have already given up so much: seeing family and friends, giving someone a hug, going out for a meal, worshipping together as a Church family, the list is endless. And as much as giving something up for Lent is a beneficial spiritual discipline, it's very worthwhile to take something up for Lent instead, perhaps a regular prayer routine, phoning someone who may be lonely or ill, asking whether your neighbour needs any shopping if you have booked a home delivery or are going to a local farm shop, or donating money to church or charity. The Covid-19 pandemic is hitting our Link Diocese of Kagera in Tanzania very hard; infection rates are high and the economic impact is severe in a country dependent on farming. Therefore the Bishops' Lent Appeal is more vital than ever before. Please check out the Diocesan website and give generously if you can:

STRATFORD ST MARY PARISH COUNCIL COMMUNICATION

The parish council has traditionally relied on the physical delivery of paper-based documents as its primary method of formally conveying important information to parish residents. Although official council documents are published on the council's web-site, some (e.g. notices and agendas for annual meetings, enquiries and surveys) are also delivered to households as paper -based documents so as to ensure that all residents have the opportunity to make themselves aware of those events.

The council is currently reviewing its methods of communication with residents and has concluded that in the interest of cost, efficiency, timeliness and effectiveness, transfer to primarily electronic communication methods would be appropriate. This is because the adoption of electronic communication in the community is probably now at a sufficiently high level to make this a viable, reliable option.

As a necessary first step in the introduction of this change, the council is delivering to every address in the Parish, a letter seeking support for its plan to create an electronic database of household e-mail addresses to be used exclusively for the delivery of formal council documents to households in the parish. If your household has not received this communication, or you would like an ecopy, please contact the Data Manager at

data.manager@stratfordstmary.org.uk.

The council recognises that there are those in our community who, for a variety of reasons, do not or cannot use the internet and for them, the option of delivery of paper-based documents will continue to be available for key documents such as

annual meeting notifications. However, it is hoped that a sufficient number of residents will support the plan to enable a trial of electronic document circulation to be undertaken, probably starting in April and running for 1 year.

Councillors are of the view that this change will not only enable more information to be made available to households in the parish, more promptly and at lower cost, but also be beneficial for the environment as a result of the reduction in unnecessary paper consumption.

Agreement to include e-mail for your household on the Council's database can be withdrawn, in writing, at any time.

Paper-based communication currently delivers one copy of a given document to each street address and accordingly, it is intended that the electronic database should contain one e-mail address for each household. However, recognising that it is possible for a street address to contain more than one household, the information requested on the form includes 'household identity'. It is for each household to decide what that identity should be. For an address containing a single household that could be, for example, house number, house name, or family name, whereas at an address occupied by more than one household it would not be appropriate to refer to the house name or number and the family name or other unique identity, would be required.

The Parish Council believes that enhancing communications in this way will help it to more effectively serve the community it represents. If you are able to access the internet and use e-mail, please support this scheme. Responses, on the form provided with the communication, are requested by not later than Friday 19th March 2021.

Lockdown Pub Quiz

As expected our February 23rd Fair Trade coffee morning was affected by the current

restrictions on social gatherings and we were not able to hold it.

However, last month I mentioned a Pop Up Shop and this is the result:

Are you fed up with excess packaging and single use plastic containers? If you care about what is happening to our environment, and want to do your part in helping to stop waste and landfills then look no further.

"Love Refills" is a zero waste initiative and will be visiting Raydon Fair Trade coffee mornings with their Pop Up Shop.

What can you buy from them? Well: Eco friendly products such as laundry liquid, soap, washing up liquid, shampoo and conditioner etc. Also store cupboard goods such as pasta, rice, lentils, oats, flour and tea. Other items like bamboo toothbrushes, re-usable Bee friendly food coverings, to name but a few of the items available.

Depending on social distancing rules then the plan is for a launch date of March 23rd at our Fair Trade coffee morning 10am-12 noon, and then at every coffee morning each month. I'll pin up a complete price list and goods available in the porch of Raydon Church. Then when you're out on your daily

exercise you can stop by and compose your shopping list. So start saving all those empty plastic bottles that you would normally recycle then get them refilled. (there are some available if you need them) also bring your containers for dry goods.

The mobile library van will hopefully be back on the round so what more could you want than a lovely cup of Fair Trade coffee, do some shopping and change your library books. And of course we hope our faithful fundraising Church stall will be open again with more treasures for you to find!

I do hope we'll be able to put this exciting plan into action, so please call me if you would like any further information.

An easy way to access your NHS number

Everyone invited to have a Covid-19 vaccination is asked to bring a copy of their NHS number with them to their appointment.

And, for those who do not know what their number is, they are encouraged to use the free NHS online service to receive a reminder of their NHS number.

You can access the service here - https://www.nhs.uk/nhs-services/online-services/find-nhs-number/

You can use the service either for yourself or someone else.

The NHS number is a unique 10-digit number e.g. 485 777 3456 and helps health care staff identify you correctly and match your details to your health records. You should usually be able to find the number on any letter or document received from the NHS, including prescriptions, test results and hospital letter or appointment letters.

Dr Mark Shenton, a GP in Suffolk and chairman of the NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group, said: "This is a really handy online service that is useful for anyone who cannot find their NHS number. Our GP practices are receiving a lot of calls from patients who do not know their number. While practice staff are always happy to help, it would make their already incredibly busy jobs a little easier if people would use this online service to get a reminder of their NHS n u m b e r

"And why don't you download the NHS app which has your NHS number and digital access to your surgery and record?"

At checkout select 'schedule for later' and choose the date of the village pop where you intend to collect from.


Don't forget to make a note upon check out to let them know if you wish to fill your own bottles otherwise, they will prepare your order in the best repurposed bottles they have available at the time.

In praise of the litter-pick

'Litter, litter everywhere...' Litter/rubbish is now an inevitable and in some areas, an almost indelible feature of our countryside. Unlike during the first lock-down, the amount of rubbish and its 'R' number have shown no signs of let-up; for every piece of rubbish that lies un-disturbed and unpicked on a road, path, hedge or verge, another ten will almost certainly appear over the following days.

Keeping our village clean is important for many reasons. There is reasonable evidence to indicate that a clean and tidy village does provide some deterrent to more rubbish appearing and thereby increasing its 'R' number. The same applies to the approaches to our villages. We are blest with so many walks that can be accessed from our villages; some pass beyond our immediate village boundaries but it would still seem appropriate to remove the litter en-route and not 'pass by on the other side'. A walk without picking up discarded rubbish could arguably be regarded as a missed opportunity. 'See a can and pick it up and all that day you'll have good luck...'

In Holton St Mary, the approaches include the B1070 from the Western signage of the village up the road to the footpath that leads back to Bacon's Green (the top arrow on the map, about 60 metres before Acacia Road), the lane leading from the T-junction with Brett Vale golf club to, and through Bacon's Green, Sandpits Lane, and the Higham road (B1068) leading from the end of Sandpits Lane to the A12. From here, a footpath will take you back to the village (the bottom arrow). For those intrepid and risk-averse litter-pickers there is the option to continue for 200 metres on the A12 to, and then down Stubbins Lane ... but beware the hurled urine-filled bottles by the side of the A12. I tend to clear this stretch and up to the slip-road three or four times a year. It is also surprising how much litter



accumulates on Stubbins Lane. The approaches and litter-picking circuit are completed by both slip-roads (at Four Sisters) and their hairpin footpaths that descend from the A12 to the underpass. These slip-roads have an 'R' number of at least 5 and the litter and rubbish are hazardous to wildlife and all road-users. Clearly, the slip-roads themselves are a hazard for litter-pickers, particularly on the East-bound one towards Ipswich.

For many years Riet Howard has organised a wonderful and very efficient village litter-picking team. However, most of its members have now left are or unable to continue and it would be fantastic to welcome some new people to maintain the village's cleanliness. I have been asked to take over the litter-picking organisation. I have already been adopted by the Countryside and Public Realm department of Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils to receive supplies of litter-picking sticks, high-visibility jackets, rubbish/litter bags and relevant (not junk) mail...

I would be very grateful if all current and enthusiastic new litter-pickers would contact me with your preferences when you would like to litter-pick so that I can set up a new rota. It would be wonderful if we can try to keep the rubbish in and around the village to a minimum and to maintain its 'R' number well below 1.

Ready, steady, census

The decennial census is almost upon us.

Households across Holton St Mary will soon be asked to take part in the nationwide survey of housing and the population. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

Information from the digital-first census will help decide how services are planned and funded in your local area. This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, housing or new bus routes.

Households will receive a letter with a unique access code in the post, allowing them to complete their questionnaire online. Paper questionnaires will be available on request. Census day is March 21.

Constable Country Medical Practice – Practice Update February 2021

Coronavirus Vaccination Programme

The practice is working closely with Hadleigh and Bildeston Practices and in early January both East Bergholt and Hadleigh sites were approved as vaccination 'Hubs'. This was a great achievement as only 12 other practices were approved across Suffolk.

The delivery of the Covid vaccination programme has been a complex undertaking. In January we took delivery 1170 doses of the Pfizer vaccine one week and 2,340 the following week. Hadleigh took delivery of the same quantities. We were given a week's notice and the vaccine needed to be administered within 3 days following delivery. This was a huge undertaking and consumed much of our resources, though we also had help from the CCG and other health professionals. We managed to book every appointment.

The vaccinations days were a real team effort. We are so grateful to our PPG and the many volunteers who helped; often in cold and wet conditions. We tried to keep queues to a minimum and generally the clinics ran smoothly and everyone was in good spirits – especially in the observation tent!

Thank you to everyone who helped us. We were overwhelmed when we sent out a call for volunteers and I'm sorry you have not all had the opportunity to get involved, though there is plenty of time as yet! Thank you also for the biscuits and chocolate which kept the team going, and thank you for the many cards and kind comments on social media.

Through January, we managed to vaccinate well over 90% of all patients over the age of 70, and our housebound and vulnerable patients. We also vaccinated patients from Bildeston,

Hadleigh and Holbrook & Shotley practices. Going forward, we still have a lot of vaccinating to do; administering the first dose to patients under the age of 70 and then the second dose. Unfortunately, we have no control over delivery schedules. We are informed of deliveries just the week before they are made, and only then can we contact patients to book an appointment.

Please only contact the practice regarding the vaccination if you have a genuine concern that you may have been missed. We have a rigorous process of calling patients and need to strictly follow government guidelines regarding the order in which we vaccinate, but we will contact every eligible patient in due course.

In addition to calling patients, we will be using a text message booking system. Please refer to our website, www.constablecountrymedicalpractice.co. uk, and facebook page for the latest information on the vaccination programme.

While all this is going on we are also providing regular doctor and nurse clinic appts so if anyone has any medical query apart from the vaccination, please contact us.

Thank you again for your support and consideration whilst we continue with the vaccination programme.






