Stratford St Mary and Langham Community First Responder Group.

The group's responders are still limited to Stephen and Peter, a lot of training was put on standby for the last year and remains that way for the foreseeable future.

The group has been very busy during 2020, even with the pandemic disrupting things the group has continued to operate throughout the whole year.

The hours on call has again increased over the previous year. A total of 960.75 hours (compared with 575.5 hours in 2019) were recorded where Stephen or Peter were available for medical alerts issued by the Ambulance Service. This works out at an average of 80 hours a month, or just under 4 hours every day.

During these times when they were on call a total of 73 alerts were issued. 38 of these alerts were with patient contact. The remaining ones we were either stood down prior to arrival, we arrived at the same time as an ambulance or the ambulance had arrived prior to the responders.

Since March, both Stephen and Peter have been driving ambulances for the East of England Ambulance Service, both trying to do at least one shift a week, this is a voluntary job to help relieve some of the pressure on the Health Service.

Have you ever thought about becoming a Community First Responder?

Why not find out what it is about?

Look at the CFR link on the East of England Ambulance Services website. You can even apply on line! If you watch the training video - do not be alarmed - you are never expected to do mouth to mouth.

<u>The Village Emergency</u> Telephone

Stratford St Mary has, for a number of vears had a Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS) in operation. This is a system where, if a dedicated number is rung, you may reach one of up to 10 volunteers. These volunteers have had basic training in CPR and how to use a defibrillator. This number should only be called in the case of a possible cardiac arrest and after 999 has been called. If the number is rung and contact made, the volunteer will go to Hall Farm, collect the defibrillator and head to your location. They will the start basic life support. including using the defibrillator, until the emergency services arrive.

The village of Stratford St Mary and the surrounding areas are also covered by numerous Community First Responders, these are a different set of volunteers to the VETS people. These volunteers will be called by the Ambulance service to start treatment on patients who have life threatening conditions, this is a automatic function by the Ambulance service when you have called 999. These CFR have been given training by the Ambulance service and have equipment to start life saving treatment as soon as possible, these are people who live within our community and can give this life saving treatment prior to an ambulance arriving, they sometimes arrive on your door step within minutes of you calling 999. It is important to remember that the VETS and CFR individuals are all volunteers, giving up their time to help the community.

We are pleased that Raydon Parish Council is planning to introduce a Community Speed Watch, in response to the review undertaken some years ago when speeding traffic was the major item of concern to residents.

We are enthusiastic about this initiative and we already have a team anxious to get started. We would welcome any of our fellow residents who might wish to join the team. The equipment and training is being supplied free of charge by Suffolk Constabulary.

Well by the time these notes appear in the February copy of the Quartet we are getting used to another extended lock down and life indoors in winter time is going to be a bit harder for all. The good news is the daylight hours are extending once again and although the old saying: As the days lenghten the cold strenghtens, which very often seems to apply you also have the added benefit of increased sunlight and things in the gardens are on the move once again.

Bulbs have appeared, buds showing colour and starting to swell ready to burst out as the Spring progresses, bird song increases, the grass starts to grow and it will soon be time to start the cutting of lawns once again along with that lovely fresh cut grass smell. The birds towards the end of February are searching out nesting sites, with the early ones already started building and laying eggs ie blackbirds and thrushes, rooks will be seen swaying in the windy tree tops as the whole cycle starts over again. Another few weeks and we say good-bye to the field fare, redwing and then start watching out for early arrivals like the chiff chaff and listen out for the skylarks especially on lovely sunny days. Spring is a magical time for all and it is so good for the soul as it gives everybody such a lift after the drab days of winter. As gardeners I hope you have all had a good rest over the last 2 months and it's now time to plan ahead and start your veggie gardens once again. Rhubarb is growing well outside and it's time to start things in the greenhouse by planting seeds etc. Outside due to our garden being clay it tends to be too wet and cold to start much before mid March unlike some of you members who have the complete opposite (light soil) so are able to get going so much sooner. I normally get my seed potatoes chitting in egg trays indoors but timing is

important to have them ready to start planting out end of March. Another thing that cannot be planted out in the Autumn in our garden is sweetpeas (too wet over winter) so I always start them in root trainer seed trays in the greenhouse so they are ready to go out also end of March/early April just before the tulips are in full flower.

Garden club news is still on hold for 2021 as we are still unable to re-start meetings (normally February is our first) just yet, but as the weeks pass I am hopeful that we should be able to look ahead with more optimism each month as we progress through the year. April is always looked forward to as it's our Spring flower show but it may come just too soon to hold this event once again this year, but by the March Quartet wel may be able to either confirm or perhaps we may have to cancel the show. To keep you up to date the sale of the village hall (Old primary school) seems to be progressing and provided no hitches should be completed mid March latest. We will of course then re-locate to our venue at the pavillion on the King George V playing field once we can start meetings again. The venue may be slightly smaller but it will seat 80 persons I believe which should be more than enough room for our club monthly meetings but your committee will need to re configure the



Spring and Summer shows to fit. Good news is parking as this area has been fully re surfaced and of course will hold more cars (always a problem at village hall).

It's highly unlikely to start meetings before April but in the March Quartet hopefully we will be able to list speakers for the coming club meetings starting April !!! if situation allows. Also it would be great if we are able to have our annual coach outing in mid June but of course this is to be confirmed, however your committee may have to consider a mid summer or even a autumn outing instead. We hope to go to RHS Wisley gardens.

To all members as you have some extra time on your hands can you all give some thoughts to possible places of interest that we can visit on our coach outings (to be garden / house/castle orintated) ready for 2022 and with a 2/3 hour maximum driving time from Raydon. Also we need some new subjects and speakers for your committee to consider also for 2022. We always have to work 12 months ahead to make sure we book soon enough as many of the speakers get booked a year ahead. Also if you know of anybody who would like to join the garden club, had two people enquire last week which is great news so please let us know soonest. Remember no increase in membership fees this year once again.

Your committee looks forward to meeting you all again at some point in 2021 and feel certain once the uncertainty has gone away we will all be looking to "Get Out" and enjoy gardening together once again and celebrate our 41st year since we formed in 1980 with increased enthusiasm.

Higham Tree Planting

Over 200 native trees, oaks, field maple, wild cherry, crab apple and birch and the rare "wild service tree" (Sorbus torminalis) were distributed (largely thanks to the Woodland Trust) to 23 individual householders in the village and planted over the last weekend in November.

These plantings are in support of the County scheme (yet to be formally launched) to celebrate the Queen's 70th year on the throne in early 2022. By planting ours this autumn we hope that most of them will be firmly established and flourishing by then.

The Community Emergency Planning Team (CEPT) helps and supports vulnerable and shielding / isolating residents. This includes help with shopping, collection of medication, dogwalking, advice and simply for someone to speak with.

The CEPT uses a 'WhatsAppGroup' to share and rapidly cascade information to the village community. The village Facebook page also offers a valuable source of up-to-date information.

'If you go down to the woods today....'

Life is never entirely predictable and always full of surprises, wherever you look. Occasionally, if you look closely enough you might find a touch of logic or reasoning in some of its oddities and surprises. However, sometimes the surprise defies all sense or reason and you are left thinking, 'Why?'.

Walking slightly off the designated trail in a dense forest near Ucluelet on Vancouver Island in British Columbia (Canada) a couple of years ago, we came across this sign. It was three kilometres from any recognised human habitation and, as far we could tell, there was no Hansel and Gretel, Red Riding Hood's grandma, gnomes or fairies hiding nearby. It may be relevant that Ucluelet and Tofino are longestablished domains of the diasporic hippy communty of the 1960s with their trademark 'anything goes' behaviour.

Signs that state the blindingly obvious or ones that clearly indicate an order or instruction ('Thou shalt not...') are everywhere in the USA and, to a lesser extent in its less paranoid and trigger-happy neighbour, Canada. This sign goes to another level, trumping all others. We

were half expecting to hear a screamed reprimand or receive a fine through a recorded CCTV-footage of our infringement...This was clearly not a home-made, Blue Peter-style but a professionally-made sign given its identical appearance to those found in streets, parking lots and other public places.

So, why was it there? Possible explanations might include a new species of (or mutated) plant previously undiscovered in our natural world; the only remaining external evidence of a long-deserted township lost under centuries of flora and forestration; the end-point of some bizarre orienteering course or the subject of a lateral-thinking, existentialist philosophy dissertation



Or perhaps it was there to just make people smile.

Sometimes life really is that simple.

Do you need urgent NHS care in Suffolk and north east Essex?

Then contact NHS 111

A new system is being introduced for people in Suffolk and north east Essex who need urgent – but not emergency – NHS care.

Patients are being told to 'Think 111 First' and contact NHS 111 by phone or online at 111.nhs.uk to find out where they should go for treatment and when. These services are staffed 24 hours a day, every day.

Those individuals with very serious or lifethreatening health conditions, such as chest pain, severe bleeding or loss of consciousness, should still continue to phone 999 without delay.

People who arrive at an Emergency Department (ED) without a referral from NHS 111 may be directed elsewhere or have to wait until referred patients have been seen, unless they need immediate treatment.

This is a new way of accessing urgent care across Suffolk and north east Essex and will help the NHS manage the flow of patients, maintain social distancing and reduce the risk of infection.

Belinda White, Regional Manager at Practice Plus Group who provide the 111 service, explained: "Contacting 111 first means everyone will get the right treatment more quickly and probably closer to home as well.

Arrangements have not changed for people with serious or life-threatening illnesses or injuries. Please continue to dial 999, as before.





And so life can carry on as usual – well, in as far as we can say that while we are still in lockdown. Much as we want life to go back to some kind of familiar normality, we tend to have fresh hopes when we face a milestone like a birthday, a new school term, or a new calendar year.

At Christmas we celebrate that God's son came to live as a human being among us. God came to be with us, and now we have to take seriously the reality of living with God in our daily lives. God is not just for Christmas; he is there for us every minute of our lives.

In our busy world, the seasons seem to pass so quickly that we hardly take the time to think about their true meaning. Often we look towards the future, to what may happen tomorrow, next week, or next month, but we fail to stop and think about how today shapes what happens tomorrow. With the Covid situation changing daily, we do, of course, look at how the lockdown restrictions are beginning to bring the infection rates down, and we are looking forward to a time when the vaccinations will give us a level of immunity which will enable us to go out and see our family and friends again.

In the Church Calendar, we are beginning to count the Sundays before Lent, and with Ash Wednesday being early again this year on 17th February, the season of Lent is upon us before we've even thought about it. Being a Christian is not just about letting the seasons flow by, but it's about active participation. So this year, when we come to Lent, instead of giving something up, perhaps we could take something on. For every day of Lent we could put a donation for a local Foodbank into a box, or we could make a phone call or write a card to someone who is lonely.

Recently, I found the poem below and I'd like to share it with you:

"When the song of the angels is stilled.

When the star in the sky is gone,

When the kings and princes are home,

When the shepherds are back with their flock,

The work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost.

To heal the broken,

To feed the hungry,

To release the prisoner.

To rebuild the nations,

To bring peace among people,

To make music in the heart." By Howard Thurman

Let's use this Lent to show God's love in action and make the world a better place.
