



Village Life Report

From the original Village Gathering held at Stratford Hills, the only event in the first year, VL has expanded its annual programme to include not only further Summer Fairs but also the Quintuple (Pub Games) Challenge at the Swan, The St Edmunds Pie Dances, The Christmas Light-up and the Stories by the Fire evenings (also at the Swan). In addition, in 2016, Village Life also took on the responsibility of maintaining the Millennium Garden as an ongoing activity.

In this connection, following the announcement of an 'Open Gardens' event in Stratford St Mary this Summer, VL have taken the decision not to hold a Summer Fair but instead to provide support for 'Open Gardens' with the specific intention of helping the event to become a genuine showcase for 'Life in a Suffolk Village in the 21st Century'.

Provisionally scheduled for late June, it is intended that the day will enable visitors and residents alike to not only look around Village Gardens large and small, but also to enjoy an exhibition of the work of local artists, demonstrations by local crafts people and a display of locally owned Classic Cars interspersed by opportunity to indulge themselves in a selection of locally prepared food and drink.

For the day to be the success that it can be will require as many residents as possible to contribute. Not necessarily by agreeing to open gardens but perhaps by submitting arts or crafts items for display, offering to help with refreshments or just making time available to undertake stewarding. Hall Farm support to the Village

Our Community First Responder Service is struggling to cover the number of hours it would like because of the difficulty of finding volunteers with available time.

One way of addressing this issue is to have public access to a life saving defibrillator available 24 hours a day in the village. Hall Farm have contacted us with an opportunity to provide just such a facility.

Just over 2 years ago a lady died at Hall Farm, in spite of great efforts to save her. As a thank you for those efforts the lady's family wish to donate a defibrillator to Hall Farm in memory of their mother, and also of a loved sister.

Although it is bequeathed to Hall Farm, and hence will be sited there, John, Myra and their family wish it to be available to the whole Community.

For this reason we are liaising with the Ambulance service to have it adopted as a Community defibrillator site. The defibrillator will be externally mounted in a heated box safe with a code lock which is accessed through the 999 service; Hence it will be available to all of us 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

However we will need to raise some additional funding for the external box, so are approaching the village community for help. We are organising a raffle with some very attractive donated prizes and selling them via a door knock which will also give an opportunity to explain what is happening. We will give you a draw ticket for every pound donated and then we will enter these into a raffle. If we are lucky enough to raise more than is required, the extra money will go to the ongoing village Community First Responder service. The Draw will take place on Saturday 1st April at the Race Night.

We believe this will be a key development for the village and we hope we can count on your support.

We would, however, welcome a few more volunteers into the scheme so if you could spare just 1 or 2 hours per month please consider joining us.





Celtic Christianity



Christianity originates Augustine (AD600) and (St) Patrick (circa AD400) and probably around 300AD, just before the Romans left England. Following their departure, the early Celts were pushed further and further West by the then rather more pagan Anglo-Saxons, ultimately leaving England for Wales and Ireland. There is archaeological and spiritual evidence of early links with Coptic (Christian) monks in Egypt, specifically, Antony. Subsequent key figures in Celtic spirituality included saints Alban and Columba, the latter living on Iona and from which the Iona Community was established, and which is active today. The Community emphasises Christian living in one's personal calling, including prayer, meditation and social service. Columba was also responsible for the beautifully-illustrated manuscript, 'Book of

Celtic spirituality is 'attractive' to many for three reasons. First, is its unifying style of spirituality and worship which, by reflecting its early links with the Middle East (Egyptian) Church and which preceded the subsequent denominational divisions, represents a fresh and open style of worship, free of ecclesiastical tinkering. Second, it is a spirituality that rejoices in and embraces the natural world. For Celtic Christians, creation reflected God's love just as much as his power and this is a constant theme in their prayers. Finally, it affirms women and their important - and equal role in both spiritual worship and decision-making. (St) Brigid is a major figure in Irish spirituality and with Patrick and Columba, comprise the trinity of its saints.

Celtic spirituality sits comfortably in both the Eucharistic and more reflective evening worship format. Silence, simplicity and reflection are important and valued elements of its worship.
