

COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS.

CFR's are trained volunteers who are dispatched by the ambulance service to life threatening emergencies local communities. The volunteers normally work within a radius of 8 minutes drive from their location but depending on circumstances this could be further afield. They can normally get to a casualty before an ambulance can get there, assess the patient and start possible life saving treatment immediately. If the situation changes the CFR can update Ambulance Control to give them an updated assessment of the patient.

The Local area is covered by a CFR bag located in Langham (the bag was supplied by Stratford St Mary Parish Council) and also other bags in Dedham, East Bergholt, Capel St Mary and Manningtree. The bag is presently used by only one volunteer in Langham.

A volunteer can be on call whenever they want, if you are logged off duty, you do not get called.

At the moment the Stratford St Mary bag is not utilised as much as it could be and I would like to improve this. Ideally I would like some volunteers in the Langham, Stratford St Mary, Boxted and Dedham areas to complete the training and then join me in covering our area. The more hours we have the bag active the better cover we have for ourselves.

A Weather Watchers Report

Last March, the Beast from the East made headline news. This year, the sunny February with some record breaking daytime temperatures has made the news.

Firstly from my records, I will look at the winter of 2018/19 as a whole. The following are the monthly mean temperatures for the months November to February. Although November is classed as an Autumn month, on rare occasions it can be as cold as any Winter month. I have also included the total rainfall for each of these months:

November: Max temp 11.5C Min 5.7C Rainfall 59.2millimetres (2.30inches) **December:** Max temp 9.4C Min 4.7C Rainfall 46.8mm (1.84")

January 2019 : Max temp 6.7C Min 1,5C Rainfall 18.2mm (0.72")

February 2019 Max temp 11.5C Min temp

2.1C Rainfall 19.5mm (0.77")

February had an estimated total of 144 hours of sunshine, a record and the maximum temperatures for 25th, 26th and 27th were respectively 15.5C, 17.8C and 18.8C. 20C was exceeded in Wales. Some June days have been colder! However, there were 13 air frosts in February so the minimum temperature was only slightly above average, a large diurnal range resulting. The average barometric pressure for February was 30.38 inches. unusually high.

Looking at the rainfall totals for the three winter months, the total was 85.3mm which was 65mm less than the normal average and should be of concern because reservoirs depend on adequate winter rainfall to top up their levels

Quite extensive moorland fires broke out at Saddleworth in North Yorkshire at the end of February due to the unusual warmth and dryness of the heather there. Summing up; the winter of 2018-19 will go down in the records as very mild. December was exceptionally mild and day time temperatures in February broke all records.

Eastern Europe was colder than average in January and a record amount of snow fell. Austria and Greece also had heavy falls. Extreme cold occurred in Canada and Northern U.S.A. On several days in January, the midday temperature in Chicago was minus 25C and also minus 26C recorded in Montreal.

The jet stream is the conveyor belt for our weather, first discovered in Japan during the Second World War when American bombs failed to reach their targets. It is a stream of air several miles up in the atmosphere which flows west to east with the rotation of the earth mostly between latitudes 40 and 60 degrees, both north and south of the equator. If it flows more or less straight from west to east, it can often be referred to as zonal. It can reach 200mph and is responsible for the very changeable weather at the start of March this year. During January and February, it snaked up and down (meridinal) and was responsible for the extremes that occurred.

The end of February brought the butterflies out. On several days, I recorded a yellow Brimstone and also a Peacock. The Cabbage White butterflies are not usually about until mid April. Last year 80% of all the butterflies in my garden were Cabbage White, the caterpillars devastated my Nasturtiums. Bees and Ladybirds also emerged in late February but may not survive like the butterflies if the weather turns cold.

Please note that all the temperatures are values from my garden at Stratford St Mary.

RAYDON VILLAGE HALL

A public meeting was held at 8.00 pm on Thursday 14th March to discuss the future of Raydon Village Hall. A proposal to sell the hall was put to the meeting and a vote took place after extensive debate. The decision to propose that the hall be sold had not been taken lightly by the Committee but spiralling costs coupled with difficulty in fund raising, low usage and the inability of the hall to meet today's needs e.g. lack of parking and poor access and difficulty in recruiting new members, left little option.

The decision to sell the hall needed to be confirmed by at least three quarters of the inhabitants of the village aged 18 years and above attending the meeting. The voting requirement was met and the hall will now be put up for sale subject to approval by the Charity Commission. All funds raised, after costs, will be invested for the possible future purchase of another hall or some other charitable purposes for the benefit of the inhabitants of Raydon.

A letter from James Cartlidge

It is often said that these are 'historic' times in Parliament. However, most constituents would assume that word was referring to the passage of Brexit, with all its ups and downs. In fact, I would like to think that I recently participated in the passage of a Bill that could at least a little historic in terms of its future impact on social trends. I refer to the 'Civil Partnerships' legislation which I supported in its final stages last month, having also spoken at Second Reading (i.e. its very first debate).

A Civil Partnership is a way for two people to show their commitment to one another, and to gain most of the rights reserved hitherto for marrying couples, without using the 'traditional' route offered by civil or religious marriage. However, at present, this form of union is only legally available to couples of the same sex. The purpose of the Civil Partnership legislation is to extend this right to heterosexual partners.

When I first heard of this change my instinct was to question if this would be a 'commitment lite' way of conjoining. On reflection, and on hearing testimony from constituents and others who strongly support this option, I concluded that this would offer a new form of commitment to those who would otherwise probably make no such commitment at all.

I should clarify that my wife and I chose to be married in church, using the traditional service, but it is a fact of life that millions of couples choose to live together without any formal binding of their relationship. In my view, far from 'threatening' marriage in church or even a registry office, for those who see marriage as outdated or too traditional (and I do not agree, but many feel that way) a Civil Partnership offers a way to bring greater stability to their lives – and those of any children they have.

I also feel that this measure will become much more popular for generations to come. If that delivers greater stability and less family breakdown, that will be all to the good, and truly historic.

THE UNIVERSITY OF THE THIRD AGE

Have your say on proposed future speech, language and communication services

Parents and carers of children and young people in Suffolk with specialist speech, language and communication (SLC) needs have been invited to have their say on a proposed new model for delivering services. The integrated model was coproduced by education, health and care specialists in partnership with parent carer representatives.

All those involved have previously acknowledged that Suffolk services for supporting the development of children's SLC needs required urgent improvement.

The key areas highlighted as requiring improvement included:

- reducing the time children and young people had to wait to receive speech and language therapy
- better skills, training and tools for those working with children and young people in order to provide early support and a better understanding of when they needed referral to therapy, and
- consistency of support available across the whole of Suffolk.

It was these concerns, coupled with the findings of the 2007 Bercow Report into services for children and young people with SLC needs, that helped shape the new model for Suffolk.

Parents and carers have until Monday 22nd April to give their feedback on the model, which can be accessed via the Suffolk County Council website and searching in 'Consultations'

It is well known that if children do not get the help they need early enough in their lives, the negative impact on them and their families can be significant and enduring. In additional £1 million has been agreed over the next two years to recruit more therapists, invest in outreach and fund training and diagnosis tools to reduce waiting times. There has been a financial commitment to the significant investment that was desperately needed.







Dear Friends

Here we are thirteen days into spring already, and with spring I think daffodils, but this year, they have been flowering since the last week in February. I am reminded of William Wordsworth's poem. As he speaks of seeing a host of golden daffodils, their heads in sprightly dance, but little thought what wealth the show had brought, and ending, and then my heart with pleasure fills, and dances with the daffodils. How the humble daffodil in all it's glory cheers the heart after the dark winter days.

My thoughts then turn to the creator of those daffodils and the full splendour and mystery of the whole of creation. Matthew 6 v 28-29 compares the care God shows in providing for the lilies, with the care God shows in providing for his people, and Wordsworth's words come back to me – "how my heart with pleasure fills and dances with the daffodils", at the thought that God loves us all and has promised to care for us.

Ecclesiastes chapter 3 tells us – To everything there is a season and a time for every purpose under heaven.

Which brings my thoughts to The Easter celebration, and what it means to us. The feast day of Easter was originally a pagan celebration of renewal and rebirth. As I understand it the early Christians memorial of Christ's resurrection occurred about the same time and was merged with pagan celebrations which became known as Easter.

The venerable Bede, a monk from the 7th – 8th century wrote that in the month which early Christians were celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, had been called Eosturmonath in old English referring to a goddess named Ostrava or Eostre, goddess of spring and new life.

The word Pascal or Paschal which means 'relating to Easter', also Pesach or Passover is a spring festival which during the existence of the temple in Jerusalem was connected to the offering of the first fruits of the barley.

The Easter egg is an ancient symbol of new life likely linked to pagan tradition of decorating eggs for Easter and dates back to the 13th century, also rabbits and hares along with eggs are fertility symbols of antiquity, and no biblical connection with Easter. For the Christian, Easter is a time of reflection, a time when we may ask the question, Father how much do you love us? If you cannot tell, look up at the cross where He opened his arms and died, and I think his reply would be "I have done all this for you, this is how much I love you", in order that we turn from our own selfish desires and with newness of life to live as God intended
