

#### **Dear Friends**

Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar because we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead. On Good Friday, we remember that Jesus Christ died on the cross. When his body had been taken down from the cross, he was buried in a cave that was cut out of a rock. The tomb was guarded by soldiers and a big stone was rolled in front of the entrance so that no one could steal Jesus' body. After three days, on what we now celebrate as Easter Sunday, some women visited the grave and found that the stone had been moved and that the tomb was empty.

On that day, Jesus appeared to Mary and to some of his friends, and for forty days afterwards he was seen by many other people. From now on his followers believed that God had raised Jesus from the dead and that everything he had told them was true.

This time last year we were tentatively planning to reopen our churches after the lockdowns, and even though we were able to have some Holy Week services and Easter services in all four churches, everything looked still very uncertain and we were not allowed to sing. It is wonderful that this year we can look forward to our usual services, the Good Friday Walk, the Easter Vigil with Bonfire and to being able to sing those lovely Easter hymns! We are very fortunate that Rev'd Joyce Willis has offered to lead a **Quiet Day for Lent** for us. Those of you who came in Advent know wonderful it was to learn with Joy and to spend time in collective silence. We will be thinking about the significance of the cross of Christ throughout the ages on **Monday**, 4<sup>th</sup> **April at 9.45 for 10am in the Lady Chapel in Stratford St. Mary**. Coffee will be provided but please bring your own lunch.

Join us for the journey through Holy Week and then for a joyous celebration on Easter Day when we will have an Easter Praise service in Stratford St. Mary and an Easter Communion in Raydon, both at 10am.

We are also very excited that we have two groups of Confirmation candidates in Higham. The younger ones meet regularly for the Higham Hangout and both groups will be meeting for Confirmation preparation in the weeks leading up to their Confirmations.

Bishop Mike will be leading our **Confirmation services on Sunday, 14**<sup>th</sup> **August and on Sunday, 18**<sup>th</sup> **September.** Please come and support our candidates and their families, and pray for our young people as they prepare for this important milestone on their Christian journey. Did you know that adults can be confirmed, too? If you haven't been confirmed but would like to know more about this, do get in touch with me.

I wish you all a very Happy Easter.



### <u>On Friday 15<sup>th</sup> April (Good Friday)</u>

I will be leading a walk around the 4 Mary's Benefice (Raydon, Holton, Stratford & Higham) using mostly off road paths. Good footwear is needed as some footpaths may be muddy in places. Dogs on leads most welcome, and bring a packed lunch. Hot Drinks provided on route but bring a bottle of water. Easter is not all about Easter Eggs and who doesn't like a chocolate egg. !!! However, if you would like something different and more meaningful, then please come along and ioin us.

This year we start at Raydon Church, so please arrive at 8.45am for a short opening act of worship and <u>part 1 of the story</u> which unfolds as we reach each Church. We have time for a hot cross bun & coffee then leave Ravdon at 9.30 am and head across the fields to Holton Church which normally takes about 3/4 hour. On the way you may see Buzzards, Red Kite, Rabbits, Bluebells, and even perhaps a fox amongst other nature. Part 2 of the story, The great drama of the "PASSION" - the story of Jesus, arrest and crucifixion is told in Holton Church, then we have a toilet stop at village hall before heading for Stratford St Mary leaving 11.00am This will take about 1 hour so arriving about 12.15 latest. Another toilet stop available here, then Part 3 of the drama to unfold before setting off to the Parish Room (about 20 mins) for your own packed lunch, however hot drinks will be provided at this venue. We must leave by 2.00pm latest and head to Higham Church (3/4 hour) for the final part of the drama followed by some short prayers to finish off the day at approximately 3.00pm.

If walking all the route is not possible join in at any of the Churches, or come by car or bike, we would love to see you join us at each Church and Parish room (Don't forget your lunch).

ALSO :- On Easter Saturday at Raydon this year we hold a short vigil outside in the Churchyard at 7.30pm standing around a small fire, where you will witness the Lighting of the Paschal Easter candles, followed by a few short readings and prayers inside the Church. These candles are then taken by the Churchwardens back to their respective Churches to be used at Easter Sunday services plus any Baptisms throughout 2022.

All are most welcome to attend all Easter Services around our Benefice.

### A new Venture in Raydon

I have been given this opportunity to say hello and introduce you to my new home baking business, **Tarbins Bakes & Cakes**.

We moved to Raydon in August 2021 and received a warm welcome by our neighbours and other residents walking past our new home which we really appreciated. I grew up in Hintlesham and have some family in Raydon so I knew the village a little.

I have thought about starting a baking business for a few years now. I grew up in a house with freshly baked cakes each week, my gran always had freshly baked brown bread rolls and I developed my own love of baking. I have passed this love on to my children too who will often find their way in to the kitchen and whizz up a batch of cupcakes, cookies or brownies.

Moving to Raydon has given me the perfect opportunity to try and start my business. We had a lot of uncertain times during Covid, as most people did, our jobs were at risk (I'm an accountant by trade), home schooling for 3 children alongside working from home - things were busy, baking was a hobby and a lifeline in some respects. I remember my excitement at finding a source of yeast and flour when panic buying had fully taken hold and the baking shelves in the supermarkets were empty.

Thankfully, those days are gone. We now have a beautiful kitchen which can be shut off from the rest of the house so my young Labrador can stay well away from my bakes, my husband once again has job security and I've had to admit; I'm not getting any younger – so it's a now or never time to do what I love and I know how lucky I am to have the opportunity to pursue my dream.

Having followed a dairy free diet for 16 years, I specialise in dairy free baking (I must point out that dairy allergens are present in my kitchen).

I can cater for other dietary requirements (again, other allergens are also present in my kitchen), I will offer things like afternoon tea, large cakes, tarts, cupcakes, cookies, flapjacks, brownies... I am literally now starting up so am going to be spending a few weeks trying to get some photos on social media – you can find me on Instagram and Facebook.

I can deliver to the residents of Raydon if there is anyone that would like something but, for whatever reason, cannot get to my home to collect. ### Whats it like to be an Arborist in the aftermath of Storm Eunice?

Well what can I say, the last few days have been the busiest but most exciting in my career. Although I have no actual obligation to attend any fallen tree, I do feel an inner responsibility to act quickly and efficiently. Similar I assume, to how a plumber feels when a client calls them in a panic with a leak!

The phone started ringing on the Friday of Storm Eunice and hasn't stopped since. It's been hectic but definitely interesting and I have managed to attend every client that has contacted me. My team and I worked through the storm on Friday, clearing trees from the road etc. We then continued to work all through Saturday and Sunday subsequently managing to squeeze in 11 jobs on Monday. By the time you read this, all of the local emergency jobs will have been attended to and made safe.

The thing that's interests me so much about this storm is the random nature of the most affected areas. One might assume that the most exposed trees would suffer the most, but in this storm it hasn't seemed to work out that way.

The main difference to the October 1987 storm is that 35 years ago the broadleaf trees were still displaying dense foliage, meaning each canopy acted like a huge sail. Therefore, the destruction of trees was even worse than in recent Storm Eunice where we've seen mainly conifers affected.

I sincerely hope that people reading this were not too adversely affected by the storm and I hope that you now have your electricity and internet services restored. I am aware that large areas of the Dedham vale were without power for a number of days.

Speaking personally, the most frustrating aspect of the damage caused by this storm is that over half of the trees we have attended could have been saved using good proactive tree management involving regular inspection. I hope that a positive outcome will be that there is a better understanding of how powerful nature can be. There is a definite need to act now and to try and reduce climate change otherwise unfortunately, I believe it won't be another 30 years until we have another storm like this.

My recommendations for planning your garden and trees going forward would be to make sure any newly planted trees are well staked and supported with the correct type of straps. Always think about the suitability of what is planted with regards to location, soil type and irrigation. There's a shift in the arboricultural community from planting only UK native tree species to planting more diverse types of tree that will thrive and withstand the challenges of our changing climatic conditions.
