Rev'd Manette Writes

Stratford St Mary

Dear friends,

It is a common myth that vicars or rectors only work one day a week. I remember well that a few years ago, on a glorious summer afternoon, I popped into the supermarket to buy a few essentials on my way home. When I came to the till, I was greeted by a friendly and cheerful checkout assistant with the words 'wasn't it a lovely day today?' And I replied 'yes, I suppose so, but I haven't seen much of it.' She was very surprised and asked me what I had been doing. So I told her about the early morning service I had officiated at, followed by two long meetings, a pastoral visit and a long stint at my desk. Her mouth fell open and she said with real astonishment in her voice "Oh, I never knew. I honestly thought vicars only worked on Sundays!" When I had explained a bit more about my "job", we had a good laugh about it.

Many people think that priests just turn up for a morning service or a wedding or funeral and then go home and put their feet up. Well, nothing could be further from the truth. Few people realise that there are times when the workload means that seems like you're on call 24/7. Long days, short nights, and yes, I am known for sending emails well after midnight. Days off don't always happen and phone calls and callers on the door can intrude at odd hours. But would we have it any other way? Probably not, because being a priest is not an ordinary job. It's a calling and you always feel that you haven't done enough or you could have done more. As many of you know, my position is part-time and it is not always easy to do what is basically a full-time job in half the time.

But for much of the time, the role of parish priest is also intensely rewarding. Last Saturday was one of those days which turned out to be very busy. I had two prearranged pastoral meetings, unexpected visitor, and then I had to call from a nursing home in a neighbouring benefice which is in an interregnum (without an incumbent) to say that one of their residents was on end-of-life support and the family had asked for a priest to visit. I had two wedding rehearsals in different churches later that afternoon but I said that of course I would come. And I had the privilege to anoint and to pray the last rites for a 92-year-old lady who passed away that afternoon in the presence of her granddaughters.

A friend and mentor of mine used to call this the 'bread-and-butter stuff of parish ministry' – and what a privilege it is to be present at those key times in the lives of families. For me it was a long and tiring but very rewarding day, at the end of which I thanked God for his grace and blessings.

As I write this, we are in the middle of a heatwave with unprecedented temperatures. The dogs and the horses are coping better than expected, so who are we to complain!

I hope you are all staying safe and as cool as possible.

Stratford St Mary First Responders Annual General Meeting Minutes 2022

Date/Time: Tuesday 21 June 7.30pm at the Parish Rooms

Present: Brian Worton (BW), Peter Dawson (PD), Helen Garland (HG), Stephen Finch (SF)

Welcome -A short welcome was given by the Chair. Brian Worton

Apologies Received from Jane Lelliott and Luciana Hayward

Minutes from AGM 2019 These were previously emailed to everyone and confirmed as being accurate. The chair and secretary have signed them.

Matters Arising -Nothing arose from the previous AGM.

Treasurer's Report for the year ending 31 March 2022 - We have had £139.02 expenditure during the year, mainly on T-shirts and fleeces. There was £74.41 from the donation boxes, down on previous years due to the closure of the Black Horse and temporary closure of the Swan. Also, the box at the Anchor went missing during the change of ownership - this is to be followed up. The remaining income of £66.05 was via Easy Funding. The total income was £140.46 giving an overall income over expenditure of £1.44 for the year.

The question was raised whether it would be worth opening a Building Society account so that the funds in the account could earn interest. SF suggested we open a bank account which earns interest. He will look into this.

Income from the easyfundraising website is raised by accessing other websites through it and a small percentage of the spend at that latter website is donated to the responders. This is the link - https://www.easyfundraising.org.uk/causes/stratfordstmarycfr/

Chairman's Report I would like to start by thanking Peter, Stephen and Natalie, and the members of the committee for their time and efforts invested in the group, and indeed all those that help with the excellent work the group does.

The Covid-19 situation created a strange time for us all and it shows the dedication of our responders that, for those whom it was safe to, have continued to provide our community with such important emergency care considering the personal sacrifice that this may mean. The area is lucky to have such dedicated responders, thank you Peter, Stephen and Natalie.

The group has provided a continuous increase in hours year on year, even in the pandemic, and this year have already averaged 100 hours, this clearly reflects the brilliant efforts and time provided by our responders to the community, many thanks.

The finances of the group are good, and I would like to thank the community at large for its support of this critical service to the local community.

Coordinator's Report The group has continued to provide cover on the Essex and Suffolk border throughout the pandemic and the numerous lock downs.

In 2018 the cover was an average of 36 hours a month, 2019 48 hours, 2020 80 hours and 2021 128 hours. So far in 2022 the average is 100 hours. We are expecting this to increase through the year again.

The responders were alerted to go on 70 calls and actually attended 55 patients, the difference between the two numbers is because some calls we would have been on were stood down en route or a crew arrived before us and did not need assistance.

We have managed to recruit a third responder who lives in Boxted. This now means there are three responders attached to the group. Natalie is still pairing up with myself or Stephen but has recently been on call by herself. This is the main reason that there will an increase the amount of hours covered by the group throughout 2022 and 2023.

The finances remain in a healthy state with £5096 in the account. Expenditure for the year was £139.02, this was uniforms and

all rental for our monthly training. The income was £140.46, this was from charity boxes from the Black Horse (£40), Langham Community shop (£12), The Birchwood Farm Shop (£22). There was also £66 from the Easy Funding Scheme. The Trust provided new equipment to the group, this included Blood pressure monitors and thermometers. We were also issued new phones. These are a great improvement as they have trackers so the Ambulance control knows where we are at any point in time, a navigation system which takes you directly to the patient and a panic button.

The group continues to train monthly in Stratford st Mary. This training is important and it keeps the responders updated on techniques, re-enforces skills and gives us new skills. Recently we trained on catastrophic bleeding and the use of tourniquets. This will be another piece of kit the trust provides and will mean that we can go on more trauma calls.

It is worth mentioning again that if help is needed the public must call 999, the ambulance service will then contact the responders, if they feel it is within our remit. The trust continues to be under a lot of pressure and all calls have to be prioritised, this means there are sometimes long waits for patients. Initially the call centre will probably give a worst case of timing. If a responder is with you they will continue to monitor the patient and if somebody deteriorates, they will update control and talk to a clinician to see if the priority can be changed. We know in times of crisis people are worried, anxious and can panic. Direct calls to responders from the public should not be made.

The group now maintains three defibrillators in Stratford st Mary, Langham and Dedham, these are all checked on a monthly basis.

Stephen and myself continue to drive front line ambulances as volunteers.

Election of Officers. Brian Worton was proposed as chair by PD and seconded by HG. Stephen Finch was proposed as treasurer by PD and seconded by BW. HG will continue as secretary for the

forthcoming year until Jane Lelliott is able to return to the role at which time HG will return to being a committee member. HG was proposed by PD and seconded by BW. Luciana Hayward will continue as a member of the committee, representing Langham along with PD.

Any Other Business SF queried whether we have an East of England Ambulance Service Trust Fund. HG remembered us having one when we first started and said there should be details in the paperwork handed to PD, but thinks the funds were used to purchase the original equipment. PD said he would look through the paperwork for any details.

PD raised the need for a second kit bag, as well as another phone, if we recruit any more responders. A kit bag would cost around £3,000 and the phone would be around £700. The lead time on a new kit bag is about six months. PD then explained the recruitment process and it was decided that the best time to order the kit bag would be once a new recruit is enrolled onto a training course. PD suggested it is sometimes possible to obtain a kit bag from another group if they are closing down.

PD suggested it would be useful to have another recruitment campaign. SH suggested that Heart Start might be a good opportunity to publicise the group. SH and PD to look into this.

The meeting closed at 8.00pm.

Summary of the minutes of the Parish Council meeting

PUBLIC FORUM

Parishioners raised the following issues, which would be considered by the PC: overgrown hedges narrowing footpaths and making life difficult for pedestrians; speeding; lorries belonging to waste contractor JG Williamson were using Woodlands Road on a regular basis.

BABERGH DC

Councillor Ward confirmed that Cabinet had approved plans to revitalise the Hamilton Road Quarter in Sudbury, and also the initiative to bring new workspaces to Hadleigh. In response to a question, he said Babergh's business plan was being updated, together with design guidelines, with the aim of reaching a zero carbon footprint. Babergh was looking at creating

a comprehensive rural network of cycle routes, although this would depend on funding. BDC and SCC would try to work together to try and solve the problem of HGVs using Woodlands Road, thus causing problems for cyclists and walkers.

SUFFOLK CC

Councillor Hall confirmed that SCC had formally objected to the National Grid's proposals for the East Anglia GREEN project. With regard to the ANPR trial, she confirmed that the posts would be installed within the next 14 weeks. Additional funding had been announced by Cabinet to fund more SEND places for students in Suffolk. In response to a question about the 'Reclaim the Rain' initiative, there was no more funding at the moment. However, if the three projects chosen were successful, it was possible that further funding could be made available in the future.

CLIMATE CHANGE

Councillor Lowe encouraged members to respond to Huw Roberts, a Hadleigh Town Councillor, with feedback on Hadleigh Town Council's draft plans.

CIL FUNDING

A list of possible CIL-funded projects had been circulated prior to the meeting. Following a discussion, it was agreed to further explore some of the ideas; members would bring further information and costings to the September meeting.

BINS

Councillors discussed possible locations for another dog refuse bin on the playing field. Guidelines from Babergh stated operatives were not expected to walk more than 50m to empty a bin, which should be accessible from a publicly maintained highway. It was agreed that if a mutually acceptable location could be agreed, the Clerk would order a new bin. A parishioner had suggested there should be a general litter bin near the entrance to the playing field. The Clerk would bring options and costings to the September meeting.



Mrs Maralyn Bambridge awarded an MBE

Mrs Maralyn Bambridge of Brantham was awarded an MBE in the recent Queen's Honours List. Maralyn founded the charity ENGALYX and she has almost single handily raised over £150,000 for the support of Rwandan widows and particularly infants since then. Over 100 million children and adults were murdered in 100 days in the 1994 Rwandan Genocide; the Nazi's murdered a similar number of Jews in WW2!

It was a personal contact with a news reporter, who had been sent to a refugee camp following the 1994 Genocide, which motivated her to investigate the terrible plight of children and orphans in Rwanda.

The charity was formed in 1998 with early support from Manningtree High School pupils who proposed the Charity's name.

To date Engalynx has:

- Trained street boys in welding and unskilled girls in tailoring and others in hairdressing in Kigali.
- Supplied school uniforms, books and other items to schools in Gisenvi.
- Designed, built and equipped a Maternity Unit in Mwulire.

Trained 30 young women in tailoring and set up a co-operative for them to work in Munyiginya.

ENGALYX has now initiated a feeding project for vulnerable infants at Bihembe Nursery School in the Nyakayiro Sector of the Rwamagana and is currently feeding 186 children.

Features include how to register with a GP practice, how pharmacies are a good source of help and advice, where to access mental wellbeing support, the 24/7 support available from NHS 111 and advice on keeping physically well.
