

Let us all pray that, once the Cabinet reshuffles have bedded down and departments of

State that are going to be reorganised understand what their new brief is, and once the Labour contest has been settled, we can all work towards a better peace for our country and its place in the world, particularly in Europe.

On a more local level, I have to report that, after the July edition of Quartet had gone out, we heard that we had not received a much-hoped-for grant from the government to replace the stolen lead on the roof of Stratford St Mary church. So we now need to get back to some serious fundraising in an attempt to get the roof done before the winter sets in. If you can be of any help, we would be enormously grateful to hear from you.

If this appeals to you, I would need to know that you were a bona fide resident of one of our parishes, and you would need to provide references vouching for your honesty. You would need to be happy with an annual contract, renewable every summer as long as I live here, as obviously this cannot be binding on my successors when I retire. Do be in touch if this is your sort of thing.



High pollen count - hay fever advice

It is estimated that over 10 million people in the country suffer from hay fever and it affects people of all ages.

Local GPs are reminding people of the action they can take to reduce their exposure to pollen and what can be done to control hay fever symptoms.

Dr Mark Shenton, a GP in Stowmarket and chairman of NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group said: "We all like to get out and about when the weather's good although for some the burden of hay fever can make everyday life tough, affecting social plans and emotional wellbeing. Thankfully there are things you can do to help yourself.

"The best way to control hay fever is with antihistamines. Antihistamines can be purchased over the counter from your pharmacy without a prescription and should be taken as soon as possible to get into your system. If you've got any questions or concerns about using antihistamines the pharmacist will happily advise you."

Dr Christopher Browning, a GP in Long Melford and chairman of NHS West Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group said: "Try to avoid grassy areas at certain times of day when pollen counts are highest, such as in the early morning, evening and at night. Wear wraparound sunglasses to stop the pollen getting into your eyes when you're outdoors.

"Change clothes when returning home from a day out as pollen can cling to hair and clothing. Try to avoid drying clothes outside as it will help prevent bringing pollen into your house. A bath before bed can help to avoid pollen transferring to bed sheets.

"Vacuuming regularly and dusting with a wet cloth can help to collect the dust and

stop any pollen from being spread around, especially if you have pets in the house.

"And don't forget that alcohol worsens hay fever. Beer and wine contain histamine, the chemical which sets off allergy symptoms in the body."

If you are still struggling with persistent symptoms make an appointment with your GP. Help your GP by listing the symptoms, when they happen, how often they occur and if anything specific seems to trigger them. Your GP may then offer tests to identify the allergen that is causing the symptoms.



SPEEDING - HELP TO MAKE RAYDON SAFER

It is a matter of extreme concern to your Parish Council that speeding traffic in the village is becoming more prevalent by the day - and statistics show an alarming picture.

Your Parish Council is determined to try to alleviate this problem and is considering a number of speed detection devices suitable for our road conditions and effective as deterrents.

Research has involved a lengthy consultation with neighbouring parishes who have already acquired such equipment and operated it for some time. We can report that the most effective means of curbing speeding, based on our consultation, appears to be Community Speedwatch. Some parishes say that the results have been conclusive - speeding has been noticeably reduced.

However, this would require volunteers to operate the equipment. Please contact me if you would be prepared to participate, should the PC decide to go ahead with this initiative – full training would be given.

On Wednesday October 19th at 1.00 p.m. Dr Norman Rosenthal, clinical professor of psychiatry at Georgetown University Medical School in Washington D.C. and the first physician to diagnose and name Seasonal Affective Disorder (S.A.D.) and prescribe light therapy to treat it, will be giving a public talk at Firstsite in the High Street, Colchester, CO1 1JH. There is no charge for entrance.

Recently Dr Rosenthal has published research on Botox therapy for alleviating depression and Transcendental Meditation (TM) for reducing anxiety and treating Post Traumatic Stress Disorder in US military personnel.

Dr Rosenthal is the author of Winter Blues and the best-selling book The Gift of Adversity, His latest book Super Mind: How to Boost Performance and Live a Richer and Happier Life Through Transcendental Meditation follows on from his previous best selling book Transcendence. Super Mind draws on the experiences of people from all walks of life, including highly successful business people, directors and actors: (e.g. Ray Dalio, David Lynch, Hugh Jackman). Super Mind, which reached number one on the Washington Post best sellers list, describes how TM helps people access expanded states of consciousness, thereby promoting personal growth and boosting performance. Rosenthal supports these observations with a survey of 600 TM practitioners.

TM can reduce anxiety and symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder, and reduce the adverse effects of stress on the body -- such as high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease, heart attacks and stroke. Referring to the hundreds of peerreviewed research studies on TM, Rosenthal notes "In my 37 years as a practicing psychiatrist, TM is one of the most potent non-drug treatments I have encountered. I recommend it frequently in my own clinical practice"

In addition to speaking privately to doctors and academics in Essex, Dr Rosenthal will be speaking at the Institute of Psychiatry in London and the Department of Psychiatry at Cambridge University. The title of these talks is The Quest for Innovative Treatments in Psychiatry and Medicine: a Personal Perspective. Dr Rosenthal has published more than 200 scholarly papers. In Super Mind Dr Rosenthal compares and contrasts transcendence with mindfulness. illustrating how they differ in their technique and effect.

REPORT TO PARISHES, Mid-Samford Ward: July 2016

New joint Chief Executive for Babergh and Mid Suffolk

I am pleased to be one of the group leaders who will be part of the process to recruit a new chief executive, as I was for the appointment of Charlie Adan some six years ago. At that point the two Districts were still to hold a referendum as to whether we should abolish the two separate councils and form a new single one. In the event, Babergh residents voted strongly against such a move. However, facing cost pressures. Council remained in favour of merging the management and officer teams into one, but still serving two sovereign councils. The new Chief Executive will inherit a much smaller workforce, but still be the Head of Paid Service for two distinct councils. We hope to make recommendation by the end of summer, with the new appointment taking effect from early in the New Year.

Devolution

The Devolution debate rumbles on. Will it. or won't it come to pass? All of Suffolk's councils, including Babergh, have agreed to support the deal currently on offer to Norfolk and Suffolk but four Norfolk councils, including Norwich rejected the deal. The "offer" is potentially very advantageous, with powers, resources and responsibilities being devolved to the region. The new Mayoral Combined Authority (MCA) would be responsible for accelerating growth in the local economy, and improving the life chances and quality of life for residents. The priorities are economic development. housina. infrastructure. transport, employment and skills.

However, many people are wary of a directly elected mayor (acting as chair of the new combined authority) and, without guestion, this constitutes an additional laver of local government, with its own costs - including staff and consultants - scrutiny and other committees. The proposed governance arrangements include provisions to precept and could put a 2% levy on business rates. Councils will be expected to contribute funds and support in kind. Arguments in favour of the deal point to money available to help deliver on core initiatives including digital connectivity, infrastructure and transport. These have particular potential to enhance access for disabled and older people, who form a large and increasing percentage of the Norfolk and Suffolk populations. The challenge will be to deliver on the promises.

Norfolk and Suffolk are regarded as a functional economic area, borne out by the successful New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership (NALEP). The new Mayor must develop transport and spatial strategies. 240,000 new homes are proposed for the two counties by 2036.

Public consultation is now open online and will run until 23rd August. This will be supplemented by over 5000 telephone interviews, with the results reported back to the Secretary of State. A series of deadlines must be met in order to meet the statutory requirements for the mayoral election next May. However – there are uncertainties raised by four Norfolk councils' rejection of the deal, the outcome of the EU referendum, and current leadership issues at national government level. Grass Cutting

One thing that you can guarantee every year is that grass will grow. It will grow at a different rate, depending upon the amount of rain that falls and the hours of sunshine – and the weather in general. The challenge for every local authority is managing that growth in a sensible way.

Locally, the verges adjacent to roads and visibility splays at junctions in rural areas are cut by Suffolk Highways, in accordance with a predefined schedule. The cutting heads on the tractors that are used cut to a standard 1.2metre width and this 'single swathe cut' adjacent to main carriageways is carried out on all of the roads on that schedule.

In addition, visibility splays at junctions are generally cut back to a distance of 3m from the give way or stop lines, although this may be extended in some cases due to the geometry of the junction's layout. All grass is cut to a length of 75mm.

When will the grass be cut in my area?

Suffolk Highways will cut verges adjacent to the A-road and B-road network twice during the grass growing season. The first cut will begin on May 2nd and will take around two weeks to complete. The second cut will begin on 11th July and will take a further two weeks to complete. The verges on C-roads and unclassified roads will receive a single cut beginning on 6th June and will take around six weeks to complete.

How will the grass be cut?

Suffolk Highways has mobilised a fleet of seven tractors which will be working throughout May, June and July to ensure the full programme of cutting is completed on time. The tractors will display the Suffolk Highways livery together with the relevant high visibility markings and beacons. Operatives are fully trained and competent in the use of the machinery, as well as being familiar with the requirements of traffic management whilst on the network.

How will the service be managed?

Suffolk Highways will maintain daily contact with its supply chain partners ensuring any variations to the programme of works are identified quickly and efficiently. Services will be monitored to ensure daily productivity rates are kept as high as possible and the overall operation runs smoothly and efficiently.
