

Once again we are in the middle of autumn and we are getting a few frosty mornings which means we will soon lose all the wonderful leaf colour which abounds at this time of year for a few brief Now as a veggie grower November/ December is the start of the new year in a sense as the areas have harvested and cleared vegetables, so it's time for preparation. The ground has been covered with a good layer of homemade compost and the digging has begun. It's hard work especially as we get older, but very rewarding as we turn in all the compost and rubbish i.e. weeds etc. knowing it will enhance next vear's crops. flower gardens will benefit with additional compost and/or leaf mould as a mulch. Roses need a good helping around the roots to replenish and encourage new flowers for the next flowering season. It's also a good idea to prune roses half way down to help prevent wind rock, then final prune Springtime. Thinking Springtime if on cue it's only about 18 weeks away, as we know time flies by.

October meeting, all about bulbs, was another successful evening with Matt Long & his daughter from Riverside Bulbs of Monks Eleigh, but unfortunately not so well attended. They brought a lovely selection of bulbs for sale and they put in a pack of 20 Tulip bulbs in our raffle which was most kind, and a lucky winner will have something special to see next April/May.

November was our annual AGM & social evening rounding off another successful year for Raydon & District Garden Club,

so provided the committee has been reelected or (a change of personal) to lead us into 2020. it is going to be our 40th anniversary year. I must admit 1980 when we formed it was called in those days Raydon & Shelley GC, it does seem a long time ago, and how things have changed. We used to meet in Shelley Hut, held sweet pea & rose shows, with summer shows held outside in marquees around the two villages. This made for a lot of hard work setting up and taking down afterwards, but we always had plenty of help from both members and others, I remember Fox field Lower Raydon and Shelley Hall before we moved up to Raydon Playing Field. Over 500 entries in those days, then in 1985/86 we condensed the shows to fit Raydon Village Hall, (now maximum 300 entries). A lot less heavy work but still very enjoyable events and with vour continued support of this garden club, may it continue to flourish as we look forward to many more successful years. deserved winter rest (only December & January) then look forward to meeting you all again in February 2020 in the village hall as we start another gardening club year.

Blue Christmas Service – a service for those who are hurting

Blue Christmas services are being held across the diocese this year by the Mothers' Union. Mothers' Union are aware that for some people this year may be the first Christmas without a loved family member who has recently died; it may be a time that has always been difficult. The constant refrains on radio and television, in shops about the happiness of the season, about getting together with family and friends, reminds many people of what they have lost.

At St Mary's East Bergholt the Blue Christmas service on Saturday 7th December at 2.30pm provides the space and time to acknowledge that sadness; also, a safe place of rest, comfort and healing. We invite all those who are hurting this Christmas and their friends who support them, to come and sit with one another in a service that speaks of the love of God for the sad, anxious, lonely and grieving.



Individuals to benefit from more effective, joined-up care in north east Essex and Suffolk

People in north east Essex and Suffolk will soon be able to benefit from even more effective, joined-up health and care services.

Health and care organisations across Suffolk and north east Essex are signing up to a shared framework, called My Care Record, which will make it easier to deliver more effective joined-up care from January 2020.

Many people assume that patient records are automatically accessible between organisations such as GP practices and hospitals. However this is often not the case. Over time, the NHS has been investing in secure systems that allows information to be viewed between organisations for care.

Where supporting technology is in place, the agreement will enable health and care professionals who are directly involved in an individual's care to access the information they need from their care records even if they work for a different organisation or in a different location. For example, a doctor treating an individual in hospital or a nurse working in the community could view the information they need from a patient's GP record. Benefits of joining up information between health and care providers include better co-ordinated care and auicker diagnosis and treatment. There will also be less need for patients to repeat their story to different professionals. This answers public feedback to health and care organisations over recent years about the importance of joined-up care. In some areas, anonymous information from care records may also be used to help to plan and design how to deliver better services for individuals and the local population as a whole.

My Care Record will also support the best use of clinical time, with less duplication of paperwork, allowing more time for direct patient contact. With this joined up approach, clinicians will be able to ensure that prescriptions are up to date across all health and care organisations and that fewer unnecessary clinical tests are carried out.

People who do not wish for their information to be shared can contact their health and care professional working with them who holds their record.



I wonder if you would have been as amazed as I was when, in early September, I visited a local store seeking to buy bulbs to plant for Spring flowering. Gone were the bulbs from their previous stands and in their place preparations were being made for the Christmas display.
