Dear friends.

As I write this, we are fast approaching the season of Advent. Advent is the beginning of the Church year in the Western Christian Churches and this year the first Sunday of Advent falls on 27th November. In Anglican churches, the Sunday before Advent is also referred to as Stir-up Sunday after the opening line of the Book of Common Prayer Collect for that day. As most wives and, in days gone by, the cooks and servants went to church, they would hear the words 'Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people...' and be reminded that it was time to start stirring up the Christmas puddings, since most recipes call for the mixture to stand for several weeks before cooking.

The word Advent is an anglicized version of the Latin word adventus which means 'coming' and as Advent begins, we embark on a time of expectant waiting for the celebration of the birth of Jesus at Christmas - Immanuel, God with us. The theme of readings and reflections over the next few weeks help us prepare for Christmas, and from the days of the early church this season was kept as a period of fasting and penitence. More recently, many people, adults and children alike. tend to have an Advent calendar or Advent candle, with a section of a candle being burned each day. Having an advent wreath with four or five candles has also become popular. Sadly, for many of us, the days and weeks leading up to Christmas are among the busiest of the year. Instead of setting aside time for reflection, we are rushing around buying presents, ordering the turkey, booking that last minute home delivery slot, writing cards, and wrapping presents to send them on their way before the postal deadline, hoping that the postal strikes don't throw a spanner in the works. And while for the past two years Christmas was overshadowed by Covid, this year we face the cost-of-living crisis, the prospect of economic downturn and the war in Ukraine. So, all the more reason to remind ourselves what Christmas is all about and to reach out to others in Christian love. Let's remember those who will be alone this Christmas, give to charities who tackle poverty and homelessness if we can, and pray for the situations we can't immediately change.

Jesus said: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (John 8:12). It is our calling to help share the light in the darkness as we wait, patiently, for the Christ child to be born on Christmas night. Join us for some of our Advent and Christmas services and events and join in the fellowship we share. May you walk in the light of Christ and may the joy of Christmas stay with you for the New Year and beyond.

I wish you and your families a reflective Advent, a very Happy Christmas and every blessing and good health for 2022.



Christmas Programme for Ukrainian Children - an appeal

This year our Annual Christmas project for the children will take a different format. At this point in time it will not be possible for us to visit the families in Ukraine to deliver the programme. But, there is no way we want to let the children down. Not only do they deserve to receive the Christmas Presents but they desperately need a break from the mental stress of what has surrounded them since February.

We have been working for the last few months to come up with a plan that will enable to keep to our commitment for the children. We are going to be bringing approx. 100 children from Ukraine by Coach to join us in Poland close the border with Ukraine. We will accommodate the children for approx. 4 days to allow us to give them a variety of activities to include Christmas Parties together with a visit from Santa, BBQ's in the forest, Cinema, Pizza Making experience and craft workshops. The children will be accompanied by escorting adults/leaders and we have negotiated the hire of a facility which is normally used for weddings and other celebrations as this, whilst more expensive, was the only facility we found that could accommodate our numbers. All other possible venues are occupied by refugee families. In addition, we will then bring a further group of children who are currently refugee'd within Poland and would be from the younger age group who would have been too young to travel without their parents form Ukraine. Their parents will accompany them on "day visits" to our activities. In addition we will be visiting refugee'd families in residential centres to deliver presents for children and household essentials for the family.

We will also be visiting many families who are already refugee'd in Poland and delivering many of the fantastic boots, shoes and other urgently needed items, most of which have been donated

from Mid Suffolk supporters. We also hope to able to go to local supermarkets and buy food parcels to deliver at the same time. If you would like to sponsor a food parcel please do get in touch with me - details as below. The remaining boots, shoes and all of the fantastic vegetable seeds donated will go back with the children to be distributed to the people in the villages who need them so badly.

We will be posting photos on Facebook and will send by email on my return to show everyone just how valuable this program is for the children and their families.

Raydon and District Garden Club



The nights have pulled in, and now it's December the gardens are resting, and hopefully all you members are resting or at least not doing quite so much in your gardens, although there is always something that needs attention whatever the time of year. What a mid autumn we have enjoyed and I am sure nature likewise. Mind you we have flowers (roses,dahlias, salvia to name but three) still looking great that normally are long finished. Our rain fall is starting to make up for the very long dry hot summer but of course we need more. According to Anglian Water in August said we need 7" of winter rains to get our reservoirs back to necessary levels to avoid shortages next year. We measured in our garden rain gauge only 12ml in June, nil in July, 10ml in August & September 39.5 ml. October 1.5" and last week we had just over a 1" so its still many more wet days to go.

Our summer migrant birds have left, winter visitors are coming but later than normal, guess due to the changing climate and because of this change watch out for unusal birds that may just turn up on your garden bird feeders. Also just a thought do we need to start looking at different plants and shrubs ?? for drier conditions which might get more frequent. ?? or do we store more water, dig in more compost, and feed more liquid feeds during summer so we can retain our exsisting plants for which we are so fond of.

Due to the mild weather so far I have noticed the daffodil bulbs are showing already, and the early Rhubarb is growing so no need to cover up or force unless the forecast is for frost. If it keeps like this then will be eating it by end of January !!! Could be all over by the time of Spring Show in 2023.!!!

We are now having our winter break with no meetings in December or January so enjoy the break, however you will be pleased to know your committee is hard at work trying to get good quality guest speakers for the 2023 season.

The biggest problem we face since Covid in 2020 & 2021 is a lot of speakers retired or not willing to come, and now the rising fuel costs, is getting the right speakers at the right price. Most now cost including travel:- on average £100.00 -- £140.00 per evening x 6 meetings equals £600.00 --£840.00 per year. That's a lot of money needed to fund so we must keep membership numbers up so we avoid putting up membership fees too much. We do not want to reduce either the number of meetings or speakers as some clubs have done, or resort to charging on the night (on top of membership). More than half the garden clubs have closed down in last 3 vears due to costs and lack of members and also lack of members coming forward to take on being involved running their club. We are fortunate in R&DGC that situation has not been an issue since we started the club in 1980. Here we are in our coming up 43rd year so please continue



your fantastic support over the next few years so we can celebrate 45yrs and perhaps 50years.

Your committee wishes you all a restful and healthy winter, enjoy Christmas & New Year when it comes and we look forward to seeing you all again fully refreshed at our first meeting of the New Year on Thursday 23rd February 2023. Let you know speaker and subject in January quartet copy.

Remembering your Faithful Friend this Christmas

Christmas may be a time to remember family and friends - but Dogs Trust Snetterton is also asking local dog owners to remember their four-legged friends this festive time, with a *Canine Care Card*.

The Canine Care Card is a free service, which helps to ensure your dog's future, in the event of you either passing away, receiving a life-changing diagnosis or moving into a care home. This can often be a great concern to some people, who perhaps do not have a family member or friend in a position to look after their dog, should the worst happen. Therefore, by signing up to the service, Dogs Trust can offer peace of mind, reassuring you that your faithful friend will be well cared for by the charity.

It is easy to sign up to the service, which simply asks for some information on your dog, including their likes and dislikes, as well as your dog's medical history and your vet details. It also asks for you to confirm who you would like as your Dog Guardian. This should be someone you trust, like a friend, family member, solicitor, neighbour or vet, who can sign over ownership of your dog to Dogs Trust on your behalf, should you become seriously ill or pass away.

You can register online by going to www.dogstrust.org.uk and searching for 'Canine Care Card' - or if you do not have access to the internet, you can request a paper version of the application form. Once the form is submitted, Dogs Trust will then write to you, to confirm when your application has been processed.

Once signed up, should your card ever need to be activated, Dogs Trust will then arrange with your Dog Guardian for your dog to come into the rehoming centre or into foster care. With a team of vets, trainers and behaviourists on hand if needed, your dog will then be welcomed,

loved and well cared for by the charity, who will work tirelessly to find a loving new home for your much-loved canine companion.
