

SPEEDING – HELP TO MAKE RAYDON SAFER

It is a matter of extreme concern to your Parish Council that speeding traffic in the village is becoming more prevalent by the day - and statistics show an alarming picture.

Your Parish Council is determined to try to alleviate this problem and is considering a number of speed detection devices suitable for our road conditions and effective as deterrents.

Research has involved a lengthy consultation with neighbouring parishes who have already acquired such equipment and operated it for some time. We can report that the most effective means of curbing speeding, based on our consultation, appears to be Community Speedwatch. Some parishes say that the results have been conclusive - speeding has been noticeably reduced.

However, this would require volunteers to operate the equipment. Please contact me if you would be prepared to participate, should the PC decide to go ahead with this initiative – full training would be given.

In this part of the country we have been very lucky with our winter weather so far with only a light covering of snow on 12th January followed by light snow again on 13th, Then we are of course having a few frosty days and nights. This colder weather always comes it seems with the nights "pulling" (light enough now to see your garden at five o`clock) that's better, and we have also enjoyed some lovely sunrises (if you're up early) and the sunsets have been just stunning.

Hope you have all had a look around the gardens as the Snowdrops are coming out + the early Hellebore and I heard the other day the earliest Daffodils are showing colour (they are bred to flower in January).

By the time you read this the Rooks will be starting to build nests, and several garden birds are already paired up, including the Blue & Great tits who are deciding which nest box to use as the breeding season is getting closer. Now is the time to get the lawn mower out, cleaned & serviced ready, as it's only about 4-or 5 weeks away from grass cutting once again. Here's hoping the Spring will arrive on time and be slightly warmer than last year so everything has a good start. I always get very enthusiastic this time of year but remember what my Grandfather said, boy you marn't (Suffolk for must not) get too ahead of the season, but Dad always said you have to take advantage of a good weather window especially when working on clay soils.

Keeping healthy during the cold weather



The Met Office has issued a Level 3 cold weather alert across the East of England, meaning there is a 90% probability of severe cold weather between now and Friday this week.

GPs at the NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk and NHS West Suffolk clinical commissioning groups are encouraging people to be aware of the dangers of cold weather and to be prepared.

Dr Mark Shenton, a GP in Stowmarket and chairman of NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk CCG said: "It is important to stay aware of the fact that cold weather can cause serious illness such as stroke, heart attack and pneumonia, especially if you have a long-term health condition or are aged over 65."

Dr Christopher Browning, a GP in Long Melford and chairman of NHS West Suffolk CCG said: "Take some simple precautions to keep healthy in the cold weather, and don't forget to look out for others too."

Get a flu vaccination - it's not too late. Everyone aged 65 and over, people with certain long-term medical conditions, young children and pregnant women are entitled to a free flu vaccination. Flu can cause deterioration in a long-term health condition and result in an admission to hospital. Flu can cause middle ear and sinus infections in young children and could damage the health of an unborn baby. If you haven't yet had a flu vaccination contact your GP practice to make an appointment

Be prepared - making sure you stock up on some essentials that can help you and your family cope with common conditions such as colds, coughs, stomach upsets, flu and earache, will mean that you are better prepared. Your medicine cabinet should include:

Paracetamol Anti-diarrhoeal medicine Rehydration mixture Indigestion remedy Plasters

Ask your pharmacist for advice on what you should keep at home.

Wash your hands –by washing your hands regularly you could prevent catching or spreading a cold or norovirus, the winter vomiting bug. Make sure your children get into the habit of regular hand washing and always wash your hands before cooking and eating.

Look out for others – remember to keep an eye out for elderly relatives, neighbours and friends. Spare a few moments if you can to pop round for a chat

Keep your home warm – your main living room should be between around 18-21C (65-70F). You could also use a hot water bottle or an electric blanket (but not both at the same time) to keep you warm while you're in bed

Keep active and eat well - move around at least once every hour and don't sit down for long periods of time. Try to have hot meals and warm drinks regularly throughout the day. Food is a vital source of energy and will help to keep your body warm Wrap up well - wrap up well when you go out in the cold. Wear lots of thin layers clothes made from cotton, wool and fleecy fibres are particularly good and help to maintain body heat

Know what to do should you need help – NHS 111 is a free 24/7 urgent medical telephone advice line. Trained advisors will be able to give you advice on a health condition affecting you or your family

Suffolk's Warm Homes Healthy People service operate a local rate helpline number 03456 037 686. Offering free home energy surveys, emergency winter fuel payments, temporary loan of heaters and dehumidifiers and general advice. Eligibility criteria apply. Call the helpline for more information

Your local pharmacy - don't forget your local pharmacist is a great source of help and advice and can advise on the best over the counter medicine for your condition. Many pharmacies are open long hours and you don't need an appointment to speak to the pharmacist. If you are feeling unwell, pop in for help and advice before making a GP appointment.



Message from our NHS partners

Our doctors, nurses and paramedics are under a lot of pressure today, and they are asking for your help.

Most of the people we are seeing at the hospital's Emergency Departments and at the GP surgeries need a lot of time to make sure they are treated well. This is not unusual – people who are already quite ill get a lot sicker during the colder winter months.

You can help by using pharmacies and, if that is not enough, by ringing 111.

- Pharmacies are open for good long hours including evenings and weekends and can help with lots of conditions, like if you have a cold, a sprain or strain, if you have small cuts and bruises, have indigestion, heartburn or diarrhoea. You don't need an appointment to speak with the pharmacist.
- If you are not sure what to do, call 111 for free. It is a 24/7 service.
- The Wellbeing Suffolk service offers support if you feel stressed or depressed. Call them on 0300 123 1781 to find out how they could help. If you feel in crisis, are in despair or suicidal call the Samaritans on 116 123.



On Wednesday 11th January Dr Geoffrey Kay, former lecturer at Norwich School of Art & Anglia Ruskin University, spoke on 'Drugs, Sex & Death" – the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood.
