

### A note for Everyone

Just a reminder for house names/numbers to be visible. If an emergency vehicle needs to find your house at night, will it find it easily?

Lots of names/numbers are hidden behind bushes - it would only take a few minutes to clear it but those few minutes might make a huge difference if the emergency vehicle finds your house first time.

## The Village Emergency Telephone

The Stratford St Mary Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS) is now up and running.

If you are with a person who you suspect has had a cardiac arrest, immediately call 999 as normal. An ambulance will be dispatched as soon as possible, however due to the location of Stratford St Mary, this may take a while.

You will probably be alone with the patient and cannot leave them to go and get the village defibrillator, so we have a group of 10 volunteers who will respond to a telephone call from you. All the volunteers are on the same number and if a volunteer is available you give them your location, they will collect the defibrillator and come to your location, they will then assist in CPR and using the defibrillator until the ambulance or medics arrive.

#### Your Church Needs You!!!

Our beautiful old church is in constant need of repair so we are trying to raise funds through a series of events such as the quiz night, cheese and wine evenings, concerts in the church and so on. We have a superb team of volunteers that run the church but we'd like to establish a specific fund raising team to help protect this building and would welcome some new faces and ideas.

#### COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS.

CFR's are trained volunteers who are dispatched by the ambulance service to life threatening emergencies local in communities. The volunteers normally work within a radius of 8 minutes drive from their location but depending on circumstances this could be further afield. They can normally get to a casualty before an ambulance can get there, assess the patient and start possible life saving treatment immediately. If the situation changes the CFR can update Ambulance Control to give them an updated assessment of the patient.

The Local area is covered by a CFR bag located in Langham (the bag was supplied by Stratford St Mary Parish Council) and also other bags in Dedham, East Bergholt, Capel St Mary and Manningtree. The bag is presently used by only one volunteer in Langham.

A volunteer can be on call whenever they want, if you are logged off duty, you do not get called.

At the moment the Stratford St Mary bag is not utilised as much as it could be and I would like to improve this. Ideally I would like some volunteers in the Langham, Stratford St Mary, Boxted and Dedham areas to complete the training and then join me in covering our area. The more hours we have the bag active the better cover we have for ourselves.

#### Community Emergency Plans (CEP)

One of our responsibilities as a Parish Council (PC) is to have a Community Emergency Plan. The plan is a clear and structured approach to help villagers in the event of severe weather or a major disaster.

Following a meeting with villagers in early November, the Emergency Planning Officers (EPOs) of the PC would like anyone who is willing and able to provide support in the event of an emergency to complete a form. This form is pinned up in the Village Hall next to the bar. The support could take many forms, including, but not limited to, the use of a chain-saw, 4x4, Calor gas stoves, doing the shopping etc.

The PC and EPOs will hand-deliver a letter to all residents and will also briefly visit all those who may be at greatest risk in an emergency. This will allow the PC to have a priority list to share with the utility providers (power/energy, refuse, telephony) in the event of a significant power-outage or to make sure the Emergency Services know about them.







### The Quartet benefice Newsletter and events schedule

#### **Dear Friends**

Following on from Nicola's piece in the Quartet last month about my forthcoming adventure to Kenya and my trek through the Great Rift Valley. I thought I would take this opportunity to tell you a bit more about it.

This trip is taking me completely out of my comfort zone, I have never done anything like this before but when my Granddaughter Harriet suggested that Sarah and I join her and others on this trek through the Great Rift Valley raising funds for the charity Dig Deep, I really felt I was being nudged by God to take on this challenge, that God is giving me the courage to travel beyond the borders and boundaries that usually circumscribe my life.

Dig Deep focuses on the 3 T's – Taps, Toilets and Training. Clean drinking water, safe toilets and good hygiene are essential, and yet in rural Kenya, too many children and communities lack these services. This causes entirely preventable disease which disrupts children from learning and parents from earning. It leaves young children stunted from malnourishment and particularly prevents girls from reaching their full potential.

Dig Deep builds infrastructure that will provide a school or community with reliable, clean water (normally by installing a rain water harvesting system). They use locally available materials, training up local artisans and community groups to ensure equipment can be managed and maintained in the long term. The clean water improves health, saves time that was previously used for collecting water and positively impacts school attendance and attainment. Dig Deep builds ventilated improved pit latrines in schools, providing children with a safe, hygienic and private space in which to go to the toilet. This has a huge on children's health and attendance.

Dig Deep also trains teachers and community health workers in health and hygiene, ensuring that communities understand how diseases are spread and what they need to do to keep their families healthy. Training these key community members to teach others means the knowledge remains embedded and is delivered sensitively.

While we are in Kenya we will also be visiting projects that Dig Deep have been working on.

Do keep an eye out in the Quartet for the fund raising events we have organised.

We very much look forward to sharing with you how this adventure has impacted on us when we return.
