



Dear friends.

As I write this in the middle of December, the light and goodness that is signalled by our

I pray that the New Year will bring peace and comfort to every one of you and your families, but if for some reason it is bringing you physical or emotional distance from your family, why not make a New Year's Resolution to take the first step of peace towards them, as a sign of peace with yourself, with the wider world, and with God?

I bring you peace who are far from God; I bring you peace who are near. So join with me in the peace of God; give peace to everyone here. Let there be peace on the earth, and let it begin with me, for peace is born on the earth; now let it be seen in me.'

Are we to have a winter?

November has been exceptionally mild. mean maximum and mininum temperatures I recorded at Stratford were respectively 12.4C and 8.3C respectively, the average for the month being 10C and 5C Total rainfall amounted to (2.64inches). 67.2millimetres average but nowhere near the deluges in the Lake District that has caused such devastating floods. The first 9 days in December at Stratford have been remarkably mild, the average maximum temperature during this period being 13.0C, 5C above the mean

What about this month? It is said that as the days get longer, the cold gets stronger, The coldest part of the winter is usually the last week in January and the first week in February, often referred to as mid winter after which the increasing strength of the sun has more influence. The arctic is usually colder during February than in January and a Northerly wind will have a decided chill

The cause of the mildness where we live has been the exceptionally strong jet stream with SW winds bringing air from lower latitudes One scenario is that these conditions may persist, with the jet stream slightly further South which leaves us prone to storms and rain. However, we must keep a weather watch on happenings in eastern Europe and Russia; If severe conditions develop there, the chances are that they will spread West. Watch the temperatures in Moscow. Warsaw and Berlin.

An Easterly wind in the winter, as the saying goes, is neither good for man nor beast. Much has been mentioned about the winters of 1947 and 1963 but in recent years, December 2010 was very cold, average maximum temperature 2.3C with frequent falls of snow and March 2013 was also extremely cold breaking the sequence of warm springs. Not often referred to was the remarkable cold spell in January 1987, same year as the so called hurricane on October 16th. The month started of relatively mild but by the 7th, the maximum temperature was 3.8C and on the 10th was 0C and the temperature remained below freezing by day and night for the next 9 days. I noted that on the 12th, the maximum temperature was -7C and minimum - 10C with a piercing East wind and continuous snow showers. Deep drifts occurred and transport was almost brought to a halt. Massive icicles formed and the whole area appeared to be in a deep freeze. The maximum temperature for the month was 2.5C. This spell of weather was well predicted as the temperature in Moscow had fallen to more than -23C by the 5th of the month. A similar spell occurred between the 6th and 11th of February 1991 with both day and night temperatures well below freezing and with accumulations of snow. Much was made of the fact that the electric trains in Southern England couldn't cope with the powdery nature of the snow!






