



sees the season of the Church's year called 'Epiphany'. The word means a sudden revelation or insight into something previously not understood. In the Church we relate it to how Jesus was suddenly revealed to be the Messiah, long expected by the Jews, but first revealed to the Wise Men (or Kings), who represent non-believers. We celebrate that revelation on 6 January in particular, but continue throughout the month to celebrate how God works through us all, whether at first we believe or not.

There are several things I would like to draw to your attention this month. Firstly, if you haven't been to see it yet, please do go and have a look at Higham church, as not only have the new loo and kitchen been installed, but there is a fantastic new south door which at long last gives the church back its view of the water meadows of the Brett and the Stour that Constable knew and drew. I am most grateful to Zarina Noel for starting this up; we hope that others will offer to help out, and that children will come and enjoy the fun!

Finally, some of us single people who don't get to have lunch with families on Sundays have decided to have a 'People wot lunch' club, and go out to a local pub for lunch after church on Sundays whenever we have time to do so. Probably 1 January is not the date to start, but if anyone would like to join me after the service at Higham on 8th, that would be great. There is no need to tell me in advance - just show up on the day and we'll decide where to go.

A Happy New year to all club members. As 2017 starts like any New Year it's always full of optimism as we gardeners start looking forward to the coming Springtime. Now it's time to keep a sharp lookout for the first snowdrops & aconites which all look so wonderful in the winter sunshine as they brighten up the winter gloomy days. January and February of course can give us harsh weather but it's the thought of Spring on the horizon (only a few weeks) that cheers you up, and if like me you are just itching to get out in the garden and start again, now is the time to purchase seeds, potatoes etc. also start off sweetpeas and much more, if not already done so. If you grow rhubarb, give it a good feed with FYM but not on or too close to the crowns. These can be protected by a thick layer of straw and they will gradually grow through unless you wish to force it, in which case a large pot over the top will help "bring it on". If you are unable to do the garden for whatever reason how about getting out to either enjoy a country walk or even go to some of the winter gardens that are open to the public, there is always so much to see (without the hard work) and that's what helps the winter pass.

Healthcare options this festive season

With Christmas fast approaching local people are being reminded of the healthcare options available over the festive season.

Dr Mark Shenton, a GP in Stowmarket and chairman of NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group said: "The festive season is always a busy time for NHS services and staff. This is why it is so important for people to make the right choice and choose the most appropriate place to go for treatment should they need it.

"People should remember that their hospital's emergency department (A&E) is the place to go only if you've had a serious accident or have a medical emergency."

Dr Jon Green, chief operating officer at West Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust, said: "Emergency departments come under increasing pressure, particularly over the winter period. It's important that as far as possible we make sure that the people who visit the department really need to be there. There are other services that provide urgent advice and assistance and we are working to encourage local people to use these services when appropriate. Pharmacists, GPs and the 111 telephone service are all geared up to help people who need support, but whose condition is not serious and life-threatening."

Making the right healthcare choice this season:

• **Flu vaccination** – it's not too late to protect yourself. People aged 65 and over, those living with long term health conditions and some young children are entitled to a free flu vaccination. If you have an underlying health condition you are more susceptible to flu and if you catch it you are

more likely to end up in hospital. Contact your GP practice and get protected

- **Be prepared** having a well-stocked medicine cabinet means you will be able to self care at home and deal with minor injury and illness that you or your family might suffer. Consider having a stock of paracetamol, anti-diarrhoeal medicine, rehydration mixture, indigestion remedy and plasters. Ask your pharmacist for advice
- NHS 111 this is a free-to-call service which is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, every day of the year. Trained advisors can offer urgent help and advice on the health of you and your family
- Your local pharmacy many pharmacies have late night and weekend opening. A pharmacist can offer you a great deal of help and advice on the best overthe-counter medication for your condition. Keep a note of the opening hours of your nearest pharmacy and remember some pharmacies will be open on Christmas Day, Monday 26th and Tuesday 27th December and Monday 2nd January. Usual Sunday opening hours apply on Sunday 1st January.
- **Don't wait** -if you've had long term pain e.g. back ache don't wait until it's late at night or a public holiday until you do something about it. Make an appointment with your local GP practice GP practices will be open usual hours except Monday 26th and Tuesday 27th December and Monday 2nd January
- Repeat prescription remember to make sure you have enough repeat medication to last over the holidays. It normally takes 48 hours for your GP practice to process a repeat prescription and bear in mind when GP practices are closed.

Stour Valley U3A



On Wednesday 9 November

Adrian Wright FRGS talked on "Earth on Fire". Hawaiian larva oozes continuously while Krakatoa & Vesuvius have been ~ dormant for decades - sometimes centuries- between cataclysmic events. This illustrative presentation examined volcanic variety, exploring reasons for such diversity.

Whilst we did not have a speaker meeting in December our popular Christmas Lunch took place on Wednesday 7th December in the Constable Hall and was much enjoyed by Members and their Guests.

On Wednesday 11th January Dr Geoffrey Kay, former lecturer at Norwich School of Art & Anglia Ruskin University, will speak on 'Drugs, Sex & Death" – the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood. In mid-19th century a group of young artists began to sign their work with the initials PRB; for a short time gallery visitors baffled. What was it that united these artists and how did they determine the course of British art for the next 50 years?

On Wednesday 8th February Prof John Midwinter FRAE, FRS., formerly at BT & UCL will speak on "The Truth About Climate Change". His lecture will explore evidence that we are changing the climate of our planet, probably irreversibly, and this will be linked to a discussion of what this probably portends and why we should be very concerned.

We meet at The Constable Hall, Gandish Road, East Bergholt CO7 6TP at 2.15pm. Annual membership costs £12 a year and this entitles members to attend the meetings that take place on the second Wednesday of each month, except August and December.

We have a wide range of groups including language study, country walking, computer studies and gardens, churches and historic buildings visits.
