

Dear friends,

It is not yet Christmas as I write this, but I am thinking of all the

days to come that I hope, by the time you read this, you will have enjoyed, and of the start of a new year that I hope will bring peace in our nation and in our world.

We had a slight blip with our Christmas Carol Services on 10 December owing to an unexpectedly heavy fall of snow. So, for SSM and Raydon, whose services that evening had to be cancelled, we are putting on a very old tradition of having Epiphany Carol Services on 7 January instead. The Epiphany is when the Church celebrates the visit of the Wise Men or Magi to the Christ Child in Bethlehem. It's also the date when the Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates Christmas because they still adhere to the old calendar, when our 6 January would be their 25 December. So in effect we shall be celebrating Christmas with them by having our Epiphany services - 10 a.m. at SSM and 5 p.m. at Raydon; do come and join us to sing the old Epiphany carols that we don't often hear any more.

Lent will creep up on us very fast in 2018 - Ash Wednesday falls on 14

February this year, and as usual we shall have the traditional Ash Wednesday service at 6.30 p.m. that evening, this year at SSM. At that service I shall sign everyone with the sign of the cross made in ash on their foreheads. Carrying the cross in ash on your forehead is a sign to everyone that during Lent we think about what we have done wrong in the previous year, and ask God's forgiveness.

Then, looking ahead, Bishop Mike is coming on 13 May at 3 p.m. to confirm all those in the Deanery who have decided that they would like to take that step further forward in their Christian faith. Confirmation means declaring in front of everyone that you have taken Jesus as your Saviour and that you want to live your life by his principles in future. In a beautiful ceremony, which renews the vows that were taken on your behalf at baptism, the Bishop will receive you into the Church. From then on you will be able to take Communion with other Christians wherever you go in the world. You will need to follow a course of instruction before you can be confirmed, so please let me know if you would like to take this bold new step in your life.

This comes with many blessings for a very happy 2018.

At the time of writing, we are nearly at the end of another year so what has 2017 brought..

Apart from January, February and the Spring months of March, April and May, all had warmer than average temperatures. June was also warmer than usual, average maximum temperature 22.5C, minimum 14.4C, total hours of sunshine approximate 246 hours

However, the promise of a barbecue summer was not fulfilled The temperatures were only average for July and below average for August so taking the three months together, we can say it was a typical British Summer! September was nothing to write home about but October was warm, maximum temperature 16.5C.

The average maximum temperature for November was 10.5C which is slightly above the norm but a sharp drop from October. Temperatures at the time of writing are below average for December with a fall of snow on the 10th causing chaos in many parts of the country.

Rainfall statistics are quite interesting. Taking the period from January to

November 2017, total rainfall for the period I measured was 383 millimetres (average 550 millimetres assuming 50 millimetres[2] inches] each month). Taking the period December 2016 to November 2017. rainfall amounted to 391 millimetres (average 600 millimetres) In fact, with only a total of 7.7 millimetres, December 2016 was the driest December I had ever recorded. Reservoirs are dependent on winter rainfall to top up levels so there was concern in the event of a summer drought due to the significant rainfall deficit. However, rainfall during the summer months saved the day. Total rainfall for August amounted to 73 millimetres (2.91inches), with a record 51 millimetres between the 8th and 10th of the month). August followed by July were the two wettest months of the year.

The Spring of 2017 was marvellous for flowers and blossoms owing to the dry warm conditions which prevailed and the Summer rains did wonders for the corn and root crops, a good year for horticulturalists and farmers with a dry Autumn helping the sowing for next year's crops.

October 16th was the 30th anniversary of the so called hurricane which uprooted trees and caused tremendous devastation in our region, probably a one in a hundred vear's event. What never received so much attention in a year of extremes was the severe cold spell from 9th January to 19th January 1987. For 8 days, the temperature hardly rose above freezing point. I quote from my records. January 12th max -7C min -10C wind NE heavy snow: Jan 13th max -4C min -7C, heavy snow showers: Jan 14th max -3C min -5,5C wind E, almost strong to gale, massive snow drifts, all transport virtually brought to a halt.

'Take ... and take just a little bit more': survival of our NHS


A front-page newspaper headline of 7th December 2017, 'Patients hit by shortage of drugs as prices soar', motivated this article and particularly within the context of having worked in and for the NHS for almost 40 years. The headline focused on some important drugs (anastrazole to treat breast cancer; quetiapine to treat a range of mental health disorders: some antiepileptic drugs) that, in their generic (nonbranded) form, were in short-supply. This had necessitated the NHS (i.e. the government) to pay for their branded equivalents, which are inherently and usually considerably more expensive than the generic forms. The estimated cost of this practice to the NHS is >£50 million per month. There is real substance behind this media-embellished story.

Our government, through agencies including the Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA), has to ensure drugs are effective and safe and this includes reviewing their licences and quality. There is always the risk that a generic drug may be sub-standard, and therefore ineffective or unsafe (or both), because of the many different international pharmaceutical manufacturers that make generic drugs. This is in contrast to a branded form which is only made by one manufacturer, until its patency expires. Predictably as the pharmaceutical industry is a business, it has an inherent tendency to exploit the NHS and thereby contribute to its current parlous state.

Increasing drug-costs will continue to be a major problem within the NHS. Advances in the understanding of diseases, including, but not exclusively cancer and dementia, will generate new and more effective drugs to treat them, but at a cost. This also applies to more sophisticated and targeted investigations and surgical procedures, all of which will stretch both existing but also currently-planned NHS-funding.

Life-expectancy is also increasing. throughout the age spectrum; the survival rate of babies born extremely prematurely (22-24 weeks gestation, the 'normal' being 37-40 weeks) is now over 50% and the predicted average life-expectancy of a healthy teenager is approaching 90 years. Increased life-expectancy inevitably costs money ('life at all costs'), costs that will have to be met by both the NHS and social care. The final issue in what may be the 'perfect storm' for the NHS is the public's approach to, and lack of responsibility for their own lifestyle and its impact, directly or indirectly, on their neighbour, community and country. It is likely that many, probably a slight majority, consider what they eat, drink, smoke, inject and don't do in terms of exercise, doesn't matter, or they don't care, or both - because the NHS will be there for them, to 'bail them out'. This perception is not credible and is un-tenable, if we want to maintain the principles, practice and very existence of the NHS. The realistic options are limited and will have to include increased taxation, ideally directly through income tax contributions, but also through other means that may well have to reflect how people live their lives. We are all responsible for the fate of our truly, madly remarkable NHS.

Firstly may I wish all garden club members & friends "A Happy New Year" as it's now 2018. At the beginning of a New Year we as gardeners are hopefully full of optimism and therefore start looking forward to the new "Springtime" which will be only a few weeks away. It's now time to keep a sharp look out for the first snowdrops and aconites as these are the herald to Spring often appearing around mid month. They look so wonderful in the winter sunshine and certainly help to cheer us all up especially on the more gloomy days as you know things will soon be on the turn for the better. Once we start back to our first meeting in February the days will be getting lighter (6am - 6pm) and whilst we can still get harsh weather hopefully it will not last too long. Now in January it's a good time to look at seed catalogues and try to plan ahead, also time to purchase seed potatoes, start off those sweet pea seeds indoors, and I also like to cover the Rhubarb crowns with about 12" to 18" of straw with a few pea sticks to hold in place to prevent wind blowing it away. I add to the straw as the crop grows through. If you are unable to do gardening (for what ever reason) there are always many places open to the public to visit and see their special "winter gardens" so you can enjoy the spectacle without the hard work. Marks Hall Essex, & Anglesey Abbey Cambridgeshire have always been a great day out in previous years.

As a gardening club we are now in our 38th year and your committee is pleased to report we are thankfully in a healthy financial position thanks to your support, however we have to remain aware that

costs keep going up (Speakers & Cup engraving) mostly so we have decided to increase membership by 50 pence. This means for 2018 it's now £12.50 pp & subs are now due if not already paid. 

On December 3rd we collected our Christmas Group from Gatwick airport. Of the children that had never been to the UK they all said; "England is lovely" a soon as they got off the plane!

This is going to be a very exciting month for the children who have not only never been away from home but have never experienced Christmas before either.


After the children return home at the end of the month I will be leaving for Belarus for our Father Frost Program. As previous Christmas parcels have been returned or iust not arriving at all a friend and I decided this year to go to Belarus to deliver them personally as the Belarusian equivalent to 25th December is 7th January. Having intended to just take presents in our personal luggage we asked if anyone else would be interested in sending a present to a child who would receive nothing for Christmas and we were amazed and touched by the response. We are now taking 150 presents to needy children and will deliver to 39 families in three days plus hold a party for the children that we will be unable to reach during that time. We will bring back photos and updates after the trip to share with everyone who has so kindly contributed to this program. A very big thanks must also go to those people who have sponsored part of the trip allowing us to be able to take this many presents to the children and also to leave gifts for those in the local hospital.

We are now looking towards the summer group visit and would ask anyone interested in hosting who we have not yet spoken to, to get in touch now as we have to start processing the invitation to the authorities in Belarus by January 2017. The children will be with us for four weeks from 1st to 29th July. All that is needed is a minimum of a mattress to sleep on and a loving home with people who care, Financial circumstances are immaterial. Age is not a barrier - single parents considered, families may or may not still have their own children at home. Hosts are able to follow their own occupation/interests as the children meet at least 4 days a week Mon-Fri 8.30 to 4.30 and helpers are on hand to collect or look after children at other times if needed.


