

Raydon and District Gardening Club

Once again we are into another gardening year so first of all may I wish you members and friends a "Happy New Year". At the beginning of any new year I trust us gardeners are full of optimism for the new "Spring" that will soon be with us. Around mid January always means the first snowdrops start showing along with the daffodils poking through the ground. By early to mid February aconites and masses of snowdrops will be flowering, always a herald to Spring and especially what a sight when the sun comes out, this of course cheers everybody up after the mostly gloomy days of winter because we know things should soon be turning for the better. This is always a good time to visit special places to see these flowers on mass (Anglesey Abbey & Marks Hall & Hyde Hall come to mind) and their winter gardens are a great day out.

Been looking through a few seed catalogues and starting to plan ahead, soon be time to purchase my seed potatoes and start off the sweet peas ready to plant out in early March as my clay soil is too cold and wet to plant them out in the autumn (tried several times with not much success). Another winter job is to clean and service the lawn mower ready for the first cut of grass generally late February as well as sharpen the shears. Early January is also the time to cover the crowns of your Rhubarb (I always use straw 12"- 14"thick), add a few sticks to hold straw in place and by early to mid Spring it's ready to pull.

We start our 39th year with our first indoor meeting on Thursday 28th February at

7.30pm with guest speaker Fay Jones, the subject "The Woodland Haberdasher looks at Nettles" What an intriguing subject and is a first visit for Fay to our garden club. Holton St Mary Millennium Green Trust

For the benefit of newcomers to the village the Trustees thought it would be good to let you know the history of the Millennium Green. There was a national initiative in 1996 to provide new areas of public open space close to people's homes that could be enjoyed permanently by the local community. They were to be 'breathing spaces'. At the time our Green was owned by the United Charities Trust and rented by the local farmer for hay. The only part available to the villagers was the public footpath. Negotiations began, the farmer no longer needed the hay and eventually the Trust was formed and the land purchased. Grants were received from the Millennium Commission via the Countryside Agency (now Natural England), Babergh District Council, the Parish Council and the Co-op. Locals were consulted and a plan evolved. It was then 'all hands on deck' as volunteers from the local community began preparing the ground, planting 1400 trees, hedge plants and sowing the wildflower meadow. Thanks to all the hard work we now have a Green to be proud of.

The ongoing costs of maintaining the Green are paid for by the profit made from the Century Club Draw. Subscriptions for this are £12 for the year and shortly Trustees will be coming round the village to collect. If you are new to the village and no one calls please feel free to ring me and I will arrange for you to join in. The draws are made every 3 months at the First Friday of the Month Lunch Club, the next draw being on 1st March 2019. Prizes currently are £25, £15, £10 and 2 x £5 each month but this is subject to change based on the number of participants.

Health and Disease Prevention (vaccination): we are all responsible

Matt Hancock (Health and Social Care Secretary), recently spoke about his vision to help people make healthier choices. By illustration, he cited exemplars of the two "biggest health successes" of the 20th century, vaccination and abandoning smoking. He emphasised our individual responsibility to: "Use the health service carefully, with consideration for others, and to comply with medical advice to look after ourselves". He continued: "Too much of the health debate has been about our rights: what we deserve, and what the NHS can deliver. Those rights are important, but we need to pay more attention to our responsibilities ..."

The public health case against smoking and for childhood immunisation, particularly for the '6-in-one' and MMR vaccines have been made. Tragically, a single piece of fraudulent research published in 1998, convinced the public that vaccines are dangerous and might cause autism and epilepsy. These research-findings have never been replicated in any country, and results have been consistently dismissed by specialists in infectious diseases, public health medicine and epidemiology. The research was fraudulent and its lead struck off the UK's medical register.

Frustratingly, the public's response to proven fraudulent research is often. "There's no smoke without fire", and they continue to believe the myth. This myth, which drives a fear of the complications of vaccination, now undermines their uptake. Advances in genetics have identified many medical conditions, including autism and some epilepsies, that start at almost the same time children undergo their first or second set of vaccinations. One such gene identification recently overturned a number alleged 'vaccine-damaged' of and compensation-approved cases in Australia.

The vaccine was simply an innocent and co-incidental bystander – but by then the immunisation programme had suffered collateral damage.

Vaccine-uptake should be at least 96% to achieve effective population coverage, termed 'herd-immunity'. Uptake currently oscillates around 68-91%, depending on the specific vaccine. It is difficult for infectious diseases to spread when >96% of children are immunised. A child with mumps or measles surrounded by others who are vaccinated against these diseases cannot easily pass the illness on and it will rapidly disappear again. Herd immunity also protects vulnerable people, including babies, the elderly and those too sick to be vaccinated. The consequences of non-immunised

children in succeeding generations are serious and this is a fact and not a myth. The following is not exhaustive:

- Measles may be fatal in children, the elderly and those with a chronic illness
- A rare condition, 'sub-acute sclerosing panencephalitis' develops in older children who contracted measles in infancy; it is untreatable and fatal within a few years
- Congenital rubella (German measles) affects the foetus; infants show multiple impairments, including blindness, deafness, cerebral palsy and learning difficulties
- Mumps in adults can result in infertility (both sexes) and inflammation and permanent dysfunction of many organs (pancreas, liver, heart, ears, brain)
- Diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough) in young children may be fatal and survivors are left with life-shortening lung damage
- Polio paralyses and may be fatal

All of us, including parents and grandparents, have a responsibility for current and future generations, which includes their health. We all know the phrase, 'prevention is better than cure'; how very true when there is no cure for permanent multi-organ damage and death.






