## Real Christmas tree recycling




Babergh District Council will recycle your real Christmas tree for free!

### Energy from waste in Suffolk

Like many people, I have become much more conscious about what I put in my bins and what happens to it after that. So I got my bits in gear and sorted out a tour to the Energy From Waste facility at Great Blakenham for a group from our Village. They offer free tours for small groups (6-10) or Open Days for smaller groups. I thought the following may be of interest.

Did you know that 100% of Suffolk's black bin general refuse goes to an energy from waste facility to be burned in a highly controlled high-temperature furnace and re-processed?

The facility also processes 40% of the general domestic refuse that Norfolk produces.

The waste is burned, filtered, emissions controlled and residues sifted and sorted with the biggest amounts of bottom ash graded into size and reused in the construction of roads, in the making of breeze blocks and ballast and all the metals sold on for sifting, sorting and re-use.

While this does not salve our conscience for the un-renewable resources used to produce plastic films and black food trays, at least the County has a responsible attitude for their disposal.

Your typical black bin contents are broken down as follows - 75% is energy output (enough electricity to heat over 39,000 homes), 23% is residue that is used for other things (see above) and 2-3% is the unusable remains that does go to landfill. On 266 thousand tonnes in 2018 that is making a huge difference.

What about the toxins and gases I hear you say - they use urea and hydrated lime together with burn temperature, and the mix of water and oxygen to mitigate these.

Six of us from Holton St Mary recently took advantage of the free tours offered at the EFW facility at Great Blakenham for a really interesting 2 hours.

One of the things highlighted is the changes to Suffolk recycling. The new leaflet is on the Babergh web site but in brief the changes are:

X - no to tetrapak milk cartons, black food trays, (others are fine) or saucepans and items under  $4\mbox{cm}$ 

- paper, card and books, do put the lids on your rinsed and crushed plastic bottles, screw up your foil into bags the size of a tennis ball or larger and any plastic pots, toys and tubs that are not black

and of course, for completeness, away from our bins, our Hadleigh Recycling Centre will take glass, textiles, batteries, bulbs and electrical items, in addition to the usual rubbish and garden waste.


Along with these we had the most delicious variety of tea bread, this time baked by a local resident. So a huge "THANK YOU" to you both.

# Raydon and District Gardening Club

As you read these notes in January may I on behalf of the club committee wish all you members and friends a "Happy New Year." We as a club are in our 40th year and your committee are hoping to make it a bit special. I trust as fellow gardeners you are all full of enthusiasm and optimistic for the New Spring coming in a few weeks time. Once we get to mid January I am waiting for the first herald of spring to me which of course is the Snowdrops followed by the aconites. By early to mid February many places will be covered by the lovely flowers on mass and if the sun is shining what a sight to behold, it just cheers you up. Many places have winter gardens to visit and view, and they make for a great day out. Now is the time to get looking through all those seed catalogues ready to plan ahead, also soon be time to purchase seed potatoes, and I like to start off sweet peas ready to plant out mid March as my soil is too clay and wet to plant in Autumn (tried several times, only partly successfully). If you haven't already, now is the time to cover your Rhubarb with a good covering of straw (12" - 14" thick) This protect the crowns and allows the new shoots to grow through. A few sticks on top to stop the wind blowing straw all over the garden especially when dry. By early to mid Spring it's ready to pull and eat. Other jobs like cleaning and servicing the lawn mower of course, plus the shears etc as the grass starts to grow in February once the sun warms up so they will soon be needed to be used once again.

We start our 40th year first meeting on 27th February 2020 in the village hall

starting at 7.30pm. Subject in next Quartet copy. Many of you renewed your memberships (no increase again so still only £12.50 pp) last November, Thank you. Those of you still to renew this can be done at this first meeting. Why not bring along a friend or neighbour or new people who have moved into the village recently who may like to join us. More members, more monies available, to get good or better guest speakers.

To all members if there are any specialist subjects you would like talks on please or evening visits in the lighter months, tell your committee as soon as possible so we perhaps can include them this year. ## Community Emergency Plans (CEP)

One of our responsibilities as a Parish Council (PC) is to have a Community Emergency Plan. The plan is a clear and structured approach to help villagers in the event of severe weather or a major disaster.

Following a meeting with villagers in early November, the Emergency Planning Officers (EPOs) of the PC would like anyone who is willing and able to provide support in the event of an emergency to complete a form. This form is pinned up in the Village Hall next to the bar. The support could take many forms, including, but not limited to, the use of a chain-saw, 4x4, Calor gas stoves, doing the shopping etc.

The PC and EPOs will hand-deliver a letter to all residents and will also briefly visit all those who may be at greatest risk in an emergency. This will allow the PC to have a priority list to share with the utility providers (power/energy, refuse, telephony) in the event of a significant power-outage or to make sure the Emergency Services know about them.

## Remembrance Sunday – Holton St Mary Church, Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2019.

On Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2019 the congregation of St Mary's Church, Holton St Mary were joined by four young men from Uganda. Bruce, Julius, Emmanuel and Disan have been supported by a UK founded charity called Brass for Africa.

Brass for Africa delivers music education integrated with life-skills training to over 1,000 disadvantaged children and young people in Uganda, Liberia and Rwanda.

Working in partnership with over 20 community-based organisations, their local team of teachers are all African and alumni of the programmes themselves. Thev teach music, and through an integrated life-skills curriculum. nurture transferable skills such self-confidence. as perseverance. concentration and communication. Brass for Africa wants to equip children and young people with the skills to fulfil their potential and thrive.

Bruce, Julius, Emmanuel and Disan were four such children starting their music playing lives in a childrens' home in Kampala. Their music playing journey has now brought them to England where, during the summer, they passed their auditions and assessments to join the British Army Corp of Music. Once they have completed their basic army training at Pirbright in Surrey, they will join the Royal Military School of Music at Kneller Hall in Twickenham for a year's training before they are sent to join British Army Bands across the country/the world.

## Medical cannabis: weeding out the truth

'Medical cannabis' describes any sort of cannabis-based medicine used to relieve symptoms in a medical condition. All are based on a part, or parts of the cannabis plant which contains hundreds of natural chemicals, the two most important being cannabidiol (CBD) and tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). CBD does not have the mood-altering and psychogenic ('high') effects associated with cannabis. Medical cannabis has been used with only limited success in the treatment of chronic pain, nausea or spasms that occur in multiple sclerosis, severe cerebral palsy and cancer. The past seven years has seen much research into the potential benefits and safety of cannabis (CBD, not THC), in the treatment of epilepsy.

Much of this research has been undertaken using placebo-controlled, double-blind trials called Randomised Controlled Trials (RCT). the gold standard of assessing the effectiveness and safety of any new medicine before it can be prescribed to patients. RCTs have been undertaken in the UK, the rest of Europe and the USA in two severe types of epilepsy called Dravet syndrome (DS) and Lennox-Gastaut syndrome (L-GS); additional trials are ongoing. I helped design and participated in two trials in children in the UK. Results showed that CBD, called Epidyolex by the pharmaceutical company, was effective and statistically significantly more effective than placebo in reducing the frequency of epileptic seizures. Its main side-effects included sleepiness, loss of appetite, diarrhoea and vomiting. Epidvolex is the only globally-available pharmaceuticalgrade cannabis that has undergone an RCT. There are a few products reported by their manufacturers to be of pharmaceutical-grade but many more nonpharmaceutical grade medical cannabis products, most of which contain significant

amounts of THC, far more than in Epidyolex, which contains <0.03%. They also contain unknown amounts of impurities. It is these products, obtained from many different countries (primarily USA and the Netherlands), that families want to give their children with severe epilepsy and which has led to intense media-coverage. However, none of these products have undergone an RCT and there is justifiable concern about their effectiveness and safety, particularly in children. Consequently, they cannot be approved and licenced by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in the USA and the European Medicines Agency (EMA) in Europe.

Based on the results of the above RCTs, Epidyolex was approved for use in the treatment of children and adults with DS and L-GS by the FDA in the USA in May 2018 and by the EMA in Europe/UK in September 2019. Despite these approvals, guidance from the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) in early 2019 did not support the use of cannabisbased medicines in the treatment of severe epilepsies because of "insufficient clinical evidence to show the medicines work and are safe"; surprisingly, this included Epidyloex. However, in November 2019, NICE was able to recommend Epidyolex as an add-on treatment for patients with DS and L-GS. Current guidance now allows named paediatric and adult neurologists who specialise in epilepsy to prescribe Epidvolex, but no other cannabis-based product. However, it can only be prescribed patients with DS and L-GS or, to exceptionally rarely, with other types of treatment-resistant epilepsy and for whom there is no other therapy. A panel of epilepsy specialists in each major region prioritises which children are eligible for Epidyolex. However, their decision must then be approved by the local hospital, and the NHS Commissioners in the patient's area must agree to pay for the drug before it can be prescribed. Predictably, confusion, concern and clamour continue, particularly

over non-tested CBD (and THC) products in the treatment of epilepsy.

(*I* will discuss drug trials and medical cannabis in more detail at a Church fund-raising talk in Stratford St Mary in March 2020).






