So I begin this year on a high, a high from my placement as well as excited about finishing my curacy in the next couple of months. I want to thank all of you for the love and support you have shown during my training and ministry as a Reader and then latterly as an Ordinand, Deacon and Curate. You have all shared this rather long and winding journey with me and I look forward to later in the year when I will serve you as an Assistant Priest.

BULLET POINTS FROM MEETING OF RAYDON PC ON 28 NOVEMBER 2022

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN

It was agreed that Amanda Pvall be elected Chairman until May 2023. It was further agreed that Keith Lovering be appointed Vice-Chairman until May 2023.

PUBLIC FORUM

Several parishioners wished to comment on the application by Brett Vale Golf Club, with concerns raised about the number of proposed additional lodges, the impact on

wildlife, increased traffic, light pollution, impact on the AONB. However, representatives from BVGC emphasised that the lodges would be a high quality development forming part of a well-supported local business. The facilities could be used by parishioners. The application was discussed by councillors later in the meeting; councillors voted by 6 votes to 1 to object. Cllr Ward confirmed that the application would be going to Planning Committee.

LOCUM CLERK

It was agreed to appoint a Locum Clerk for an initial period of 3 months while the council recruited a permanent replacement for Jane Cryer.





On a soggy Sunday in late November, a crab apple tree was planted in the churchyard of St Mary's Raydon to commemorate the Jubilee of Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and to be part of the Green Canopy. It joins three other commemorative trees to form a quadrant of native trees, all recording historic events. The tree was blessed by the Rector Rev Manette Crossman and planted by Geoff Horrex, Churchwarden, in recognition of his many years of service to the church and village. Apart from his Churchwarden responsibilities, which have also involved maintaining the churchyard/wildflower area, Geoff runs a successful Garden Club in Raydon, has regularly organised a Good Friday Walk around the Benefice, serves on several committees in the Hadleigh area and supports all the activities in the village.

Raydon and District Garden Club

Firstly may I wish all garden club members a Happy, Healthy and successful gardening "NEW YEAR". So here is winter and your gardens are resting !!! but are they ??. I noticed daffodil bulbs and a few snowdrop bulbs just showing before Christmas, but that's normal. What isn't normal is the rhubarb which still uncovered on 9th Dec and already had a couple of frosty nights but the shoots are at least 6" high and fresh green leaves. Have now covered with a thick laver of straw otherwise it will get scorched. Unfortunately we have had badger problems in the autumn and they dug out two roots/crowns to get at a wasp nest so they will need to be replaced in Springtime. Talking of pring if it's on schedule we are talking only 12 weeks approximately then we start all over again with planting. By the middle of January you will start to notice the nights pulling into more daylight but of course then the old saying "As the days lengthen the cold strengthens" which seems to happen most vears. At least with the garden in rest or slow motion it gives time for countryside walks where you can discover the structure of trees without leaves, see wild life more clearly, or if frosty and perhaps snow on the ground you will see all the nature tracks of different animals and birds. Always a nice part of the walk is to see if you can guess what else has walked in the same direction as yourself even though you may not see the actual animal or bird.

At the November AGM night unfortunately your committee had to take the decision to put membership fees up by a small amount to help the club stay solvent and cater for the huge rise in speaker fees made worse by the increased fuel cost. This said membership fee is only £17.00 per person which when spread over the twelve months of 6 meetings and two shows works out at £2.12p per meeting so not too excessive.

Some garden clubs in neighouring villages or small market towns charge much more for membership and on top of that a fee on the night. We are trying to avoid this scenario but will need to increase a small amount each year to keep on top of costs especially if speaker costs continue to spiral. Your committee is very aware and looking at several ways of cutting costs and to this end taken the decision to not send show cups away for engraving any more. (save £300.00 per year) A great shame but instead we have purchased a book to be called "R&DGC Roll of Honour" This will be on display at either request, or at shows and AGM nights. Everybody who wins a Cup or Salver at the shows will have their name and cup listed. This will of course preserve the club history but at a far less costly method. Some of our cups now over 42 years old are starting to show signs of wear and tear (bit like your chairman) so these will be replaced as needed.

If any members would like to sponsor a replacement cup as they become necessary please contact any committee member or myself so we can discuss all possibilities. We need the cups etc to



continue the tradition of presenting to the winners at shows.

There are no club meetings in January but we start 2023 our 43rd year with Thursday 23rd in KG5 pavilion at 7.30pm (the fourth Thursday in the month as usual),

NEWS FROM KING **GEORGE'S FIELD TRUSTEES**

We are delighted to confirm that an important milestone was achieved at the end of November with the Village Hall committee agreeing to make the proceeds from the sale of village hall available to KGF Trustees to help finance the cost of a new community building in Raydon. The Trustees are extremely grateful to the Village Hall committee for this significant contribution and are now able to start pursuing additional sources of funding to try and raise enough money to meet the likely cost of £500 – 600,000.

An approach has already been made to Babergh District Council and discussions are under way to apply for a grant from their Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) fund. Other sources of funding, such as the National Lottery and the Landfill Communities Fund, are also being investigated.

In parallel with this, we have been talking to an architect living in the village, who has generously volunteered to provide his services free of charge, and we are looking to sign up with a project management company that will provide the Trustees with expertise and guidance during the whole life of the project from initial design through planning and construction and on to final completion.

More news will follow in the New Year as the project begins to take shape.

Poo bags for Christmas?

Did your lovely dog receive poo bags for Christmas, I wonder? Dogs bring love and laughter into our lives. They can also, when not managed responsibly, have a detrimental impact on the natural world around them as we take them for their daily stroll.

Poo has been a bit of a tricky issue in some of our public areas of late, not least the Millennium Green. Here, those little gifts our pets leave behind can really cause problems for other users: joggers, walkers, families and the young children enjoying this beautiful village amenity.

We know that responsible dog walkers always pick-up their dog's poo if they see it, so this is a shout out to all dog owners to keep a close eye on their beloved pet as they enjoy the run of the Green, just to be sure they are not leaving anything unwanted behind. Critically, not only is dog mess unpleasant, it can cause Toxocariasis if accidentally ingested. Although thankfully rare, it most often affects young children and can cause serious disease, including blindness if ingested. So, if you can spare a moment to take another sweep around the Green and use your Christmas poo bags before leaving, this will help keep the area safe for everyone.

On another 'poo-related' note, and worth thinking about for dog walkers enjoying the beautiful walks around Holton St Mary, when we think ecologically, the dog (related to the wolf) is viewed as a top predator, thus something to avoid – so the smell of dog poo will affect the behaviour of other wildlife. To small mammals like mice and voles (the primary food source for barn owls), dog mess is a 'Don't live here!' warning sign, driving them away. For larger mammals like deer and grazing livestock, faeces carry parasites, which then requires chemical treatment to control. And. for

anyone cutting back grass near a path, dog mess can represent a pretty unpleasant hazard! So, again, please just take that extra moment to pick-up any dog poop, wherever you're walking.

And, one of the least recognised impacts of dog poo is the gradual fertilisation of 'low nutrient' habitats, such as woodlands and heathlands. Over time, wildflowers that thrive in low nutrient areas can be gradually overtaken by nutrient-loving nettles and docks. In one Suffolk Wildlife Trust reserve, a clear 'poo belt' around the car park, where dog walkers have not picked-up, has created a different habitat to the rest of the reserve!

Let's hope that 2023 is the year that dog walkers one & all take that extra moment to retrace their beloved's path and use those Christmas poo bags to good effect, for everyone's benefit. There is a dog poo bin at the entrance to Church Square, so you don't need to carry it far. Thank you.

'Take ... and take just a little bit more': survival of our NHS

The 'World at One' (BBC Radio 4) recently featured an excellent piece on the relationship between the NHS and private medicine and where the patient sits (or lies) in this relationship. There has been a reported increase of over 100% in private healthcare-use over the past year, most of which has been for orthopaedic (mainly hip and knee replacements) and ophthalmic (mainly cataract removal) procedures. Private GP and medical consultations also continue to increase. Patients' primary motivation for private health is an earlier consultation, a guicker diagnosis and earlier treatment, often to alleviate severe pain and regain mobility. Waiting lists and times have increased dramatically since COVID, although this pattern was emerging before March 2020. Wanting better treatment is a less common motivator for private healthcare, despite the fact that the public generally believe that healthcare which is paid for will be 'better'. This is a fallacy, particularly in paediatrics. In fact, if a patient's surgery or immediate post-operative period becomes complicated, it is far safer if the patient has undergone this in an NHS and not a private hospital.

For some years, the NHS commissioned private hospitals to operate on those in most need or who had waited the longest, to reduce waiting lists and using an agreed tariff; this trend is rapidly increasing. One concern voiced by many, including patient advocacy groups, is that this arrangement will 'bleed' the NHS of valuable medical and nursing personnel which could then, paradoxically, lead to longer waiting times. This issue was addressed in the 'World at One' programme. Matthew Taylor, Chief

Executive of the NHS Federation gave clear and what I thought were honest responses to questions raised by Sarah Montague, the programme's presenter. He felt strongly that the increasing use of the private sector would not 'bleed' the NHS of resources. He used the word 'reciprocal' to describe the relationship between the NHS and private healthcare, which clearly implies a mutually beneficial arrangement (symbiosis). The NHS will only benefit through a sustained decline in waiting lists and times; the private sector will earn more money. This may be a challenge in the near future and particularly if more and more patients go privately for their healthcare. In this situation, the patient who pays will be treated first. Matthew Taylor was less certain about whether the public's disillusionment with the NHS would see their gradual exodus to the private sector, but probably not, I am less optimistic. The strikes by nurses, physiotherapists and ambulance crews (and almost certainly other healthcare professionals this year) may nudge the public in the private direction.

The programme also included interviews with four patients. One had a hip replacement undertaken at a private hospital, as an NHS patient; another had a knee replacement done privately at a personal cost of £15,000. None had private health insurance and all agreed that they would still prefer to receive future treatment through the NHS.

The NHS remains an invaluable asset to the public but it cannot survive without much love and support and not just financial support. Obvious areas of support are first, to ensure that any GP or A+E attendance is really necessary and second, to reduce the need for any healthcare; 'prevention is always better than cure'. Clearly, this is another

challenge with an increase in lifeexpectancy, often accompanied by multiple physical and psychological ailments and wholly inadequate social care. However, there is still time for all of us, particularly if aged less than 40, to take a mature responsibility for our own lifestyle and its impact, either directly or indirectly on the NHS. Many still believe that what they eat, drink and smoke and their level of exercise doesn't matter and also because ultimately, the NHS will always be there to, 'sort me out'. This perception is mistaken and un-tenable if we really want to maintain the principles, practice and very existence of the NHS. Everyone unequivocally praised the NHS in the 'COVID-years'; it would be a disgrace and an insult to now complain, criticise and abuse them. We are all responsible for the fate of our truly remarkable NHS. We must all do something about it and the least we can do is to show all its staff understanding, empathy and kindness.
