Dear friends. July 2021 For more than a year, the Corona pandemic has dominated the headlines and the virus has had a huge influence on our lives, our communities and our churches. Now the situation has improved a lot due to effective vaccines and because many people are being sensible and observing the restrictions but the pandemic has not ended yet. We were all disappointed that the government did not release the final step in their roadmap in view of the new variants which appear to be more transmissible and which may lower the efficacy of the present vaccines but it seems the sensible thing to do. So yet again, we follow anxiously the daily infection rates and the ever-changing guidance of what is or is not allowed.

The last few weeks have brought more worries for wedding couples who are planning to get married. Some of our prospective brides and grooms have had to postpone their wedding twice, and in some cases three or more times and this has been very hard for them. In our benefice I am looking forward to officiating at two weddings over the summer, and I have already taken several wedding bookings for 2022. It was also lovely to baptise the first baby in Raydon a few weeks ago, and I am talking to several other families about Baptisms. It is wonderful that life is gradually going back to "normal" and we can begin to plan ahead again.

Every year, Archdeacons' Visitations take place in ever deanery. These are formal church services, during which churchwardens are admitted to office for

another year. They make a formal declaration and the Archdeacons offer prayer and encouragement. On 7th June, the Archdeacon's Visitation took place via Zoom. We have six churchwardens in our benefice of four churches and I am very grateful for their support and for all that they do. Therefore we will be having a special 'Churchwardens' Service' on Sunday, 25th July at 10am in Raydon. Do come along to say 'thank you' to our churchwardens, some of whom have served in this role with dedication for many years.

Our churches can only fulfil their role in our communities with the help of the many volunteers who do so much, often behind the scenes. If you would like to be involved in one of our churches, please do get in touch with me or with one of the wardens.

Jesus said: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbour as yourself." We all need to work together to fulfil these commandments and reach out into our communities.

If you are with a person who you suspect has had a cardiac arrest, immediately call 999 as normal. An ambulance will be dispatched as soon as possible, however due to the location of Stratford St Mary, this may take a while.

You will probably be alone with the patient and cannot leave them to go and get the village defibrillator, so we have a group of 10 volunteers who will respond to a telephone call from you. All the volunteers are on the same number and if a volunteer is available you give them your location, they will collect the defibrillator and come to your location, they will then assist in CPR and using the defibrillator until the ambulance or medics arrive.

Raydon and District Garden Club

So into the 7th month (July) heading into full summer having passed the longest daylight day it's so wonderful to enjoy all the lovely flowers in the gardens and soon to be harvesting all the other veggies after broad beans & early potatoes once again. Also nice to be able to venture outside the garden boundary, not just walking for exercise but further afield to enjoy the lovely English countryside all around us for which we must be truly thankful and being able to stop outside for a cup of tea and a chat (but keeping distance etc). I hope you were all able to enjoy the SPRING just passed even though it was very chilly with night frosts most nights in April and of course very dry, which then changed to warmer but very wet in May followed by a mixed June. Overhead here in Raydon have seen Buzzards and Red Kité on several days, heard Cuckoo sadly only once, but on walks heard Nightingales and Skylark, Black cap, Yellow hammer, several Linnets and Kestrel and this year many Brown Hares. The field poppies are always a picture to behold especially if your lucky enough to see a mass flowering in a corn field. In the gardens of course the English roses are at their best and the scent is wonderful and I always hope the rain when it comes is not to heavy to spoil the blooms.

Talking of gardens to view Daphne and myself visited the Shelley & Lower Raydon open gardens on the week end of 12/13th June and I must say what a great day out with lovely gardens (all different, some large some small) but most importantly all made you very welcome. It was very well organised with choice of 3 carparks so not to much walking in between and fantastic refreshments enjoyed by all and blessed by superb weather. It's good to get ideas and inspiration from other gardeners, also you might just spot a un-usual plant that you haven't got in your own garden.

By the time you read these notes the garden club will be moving out of the Old Primary School village hall, home to the garden club since 1986 (before that it was Shelley Hut !!! remember ?) and into what will become our new home at the King George V playing field pavilion. For those members who can remember we held two very successful summer flower shows (between 400 - 500 entries) in 1984 and 1985 on the playing field using 3 very large marquees (hired) as there was no building to use in those days, which involved about 15 persons to help erect and take down, quite a major job and involving ropes and strength and many hours work over a couple of days. We then had to collect 40 tables from a storage barn in Gt Wenham ready for all the exhibits which involved yet another day/evenings work. We were thankfully helped by Terry Mansel and his truck for all the carting backwards and forwards. What a lot of effort but of course we were vounger then. I am pleased to say that will not be necessary again as we will fit the shows to the building/pavilion and all equipment will be stored on site.

We may have a small tent outside to enable refreshments, whilst keeping all space inside for the exhibits. The first "show" will be in the Spring of 2022 to which I am sure you will all be looking forward to, however before all that our first

Doughnut Cupcakes.

Makes 12. Prep 15 mins. plus cooling time

Cook for 25 mins

Ingredients

200g/7oz cooking margarine 200g/7oz Fair Trade caster sugar 2eggs plus 1 yolk 300g/11oz self raising flour 60g/2oz Fair Trade cocoa powder 120ml/4fl oz milk 1/2 tsp baking powder Jam of your choice

Icing if desired 4oz Fair Trade icing sugar 2oz Fair Trade cocoa powder little water to mix

Method.

1. Heat oven to 180C/160fan/gas 4. Sift the flour and cocoa powder into a large bowl then add the margarine. sugar, eggs, baking powder and milk. Beat together just until vou have a smooth soft batter. Add a little more milk if necessary. 2. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with paper cake cases. Fill the cases two thirds full with the batter then make a well in the batter and spoon in 1tsp of jam. Cover with another tablespoon of cake batter. 3. Bake in oven for 25mins until risen and cooked through. Leave to cool before icing if liked.

Icina

Sift together icing sugar and cocoa and mix to desired consistency with a little water. Spread onto top of cake and finish with chosen decoration.

I wrote this the next day after my headache had gone.

But live each day with guilt and regret of the lie once told that can not be withdrawn and the punishment that will be metered out from the day we die back to when we were born.

All these scenarios we can find on Netflix So who needs God if we've got Netflix?

WE DO!

At this time of year, the verges are looking amazing, with the riot of different wildflowers bursting through. The best of the cow parsley, also aptly named Lady's Lace, has gone over, particularly after the recent heavy rains and red campion, vetch, orchids, cornflowers, and poppies are coming into their own to create a blaze of colour along our local routes.

It is worth taking time to check-out your nearest humble roadside verge, which in the UK provide a home to over 700 wildflower species - nearly 45% of the total number of our wildflower species - and offer refuge to over 20 of the country's 52 wild orchids.

Bordering motorways and by-roads, these thin borders extend to around 500,000km and cover an area that is estimated to be the same size as the Lake District National Park. Generally nutrient-poor and left undisturbed, they provide the vital conditions in which wildflowers thrive. Some are now protected as they offer the last remaining refuges for some very rare and declining plant species.

And, verges are not just vital for wildflowers. They support the pollinators such as bees, flies, moths and flower beetles as well as other insects and spiders, plus the mammals and birds that rely on them. Road verges also provide physical links from one wildlife habitat to another, creating corridors that allow animals to move easily from place to place. Without these corridors, populations can become isolated, making them weaker genetically and more vulnerable.

A word for anyone keen to protect these beautiful havens is to encourage landowners, councils and highways authorities not to mow too early, before insects have had a chance to pollinate the wildflowers or their seeds to ripen. If they

are cut, the mowings need to be removed to prevent enrichment of the soil or a covering that can prevent some species' seeds from germinating.

And, why not think about sowing some of your favourite wildflowers in your front verge? Plantlife are running a wonderful Roadside Verges campaign at the moment and offers a lot of advice on how to support the idea of creating pollinating-flower-strewn verges for us all to enjoy, including the wonderful wildlife in Suffolk. You can find out more about the campaign, how to support it, how to influence councils and how to create your own wildflower area on the Plantlife website here: https://plantlife.love-wildflowers.org.uk/roadvergecampaign

But, most importantly, do take the time to stop and stare.... As you are likely to find some hidden gems to enjoy in amongst the buttercups and the poppies along our local country lanes!






