

Bell Ringing – Peal Attempt in Stratford St Mary

On the morning of Friday 15th July, there will be an attempt to 'ring a peal' on the bells of St Mary's Church, Stratford St Mary.

Ringing a peal (or multiple peals) is considered to be the epitome of the bell ringing craft. It involves a band of ringers (one for each of the bells in any particular set of bells) ringing continuously for in excess of three hours, changing the sequence in which the bells are rung at every stroke in accordance with a series of established methods* and with no single sequence being repeated. All from memory

This particular attempt is being made to mark the 50th Anniversary of the first peal rung by one of the ringers on this occasion. Christine Knight is a very experienced and much respected member of the Suffolk Guild of Ringers and that first peal, was also rung at Stratford St Mary.

You may not have any particular interest in the craft of bell ringing but many of us find ourselves attracted to the sound of bells being rung, particularly when they are being rung tunefully.

So why not take this opportunity to pause for a while in the vicinity of our impressive church to listen to bells being rung well. It is an opportunity that, sadly, does not present itself every week.

NB. A 'method' is a form of change ringing that determines a different and specific sequence of bells with every stroke rung. There are thousands of different methods which can themselves be rung in sequence to build a 'peal'

Suffolk GP's new book reveals all about his life as a family doctor

After more than three decades as a GP, recently retired Dr Andrew Yager has shared his most memorable experiences in a fabulous new book The Tales of a Suffolk GP.

Curated as a collection of short stories spanning forty years, starting with his early medical training and first posting at Ipswich Hospital, ending with retirement after decades of service at Botesdale Health Centre on the Suffolk/Norfolk border, Andrew's adventures as a family doctor span the tragic, the humorous and sometimes plain bizarre. As well as recounting his many experiences, Andrew takes time to reflect on how the role of the family doctor has altered dramatically, and he calls for change to the NHS to reinstate

GPs to their pivotal role in the local community.

From the early morning call-out where he blundered into the wrong house, to learning from end-of-life patients about the importance of a joyful and dignified life, to the parents who overcame the grief of their child's death to start a new family, Andrew writes with integrity on the joy and sadness that he has experienced over his career......and not forgetting the time he discovered a genuine Renoir worth millions hanging above a patient's bed!

Commenting on his book, Andrew says: "I've been incredibly lucky to have spent most of my career in this wonderful Suffolk community and health centre, where I have experienced many highs and lows during that time. The stoicism of my patients never fails to amaze me, especially those who have overcome tragedy and adversity and who remain joyful and resilient.

"Naturally, I've come across many characters, some of whom feature in this book, and as a GP I've been in the very privileged position of looking after generations of the same families.

"My motivation for writing came as a result of my retirement from general practice and a desire to record some of the many experiences I've had for my family, and once I got started found the process enjoyable."

All proceeds from the book are being donated to Red Cross Ukraine. Tales of a Suffolk GP can be purchased from Bury St Edmunds Buttermarket Waterstones, The Leaping Hare Wyken Vineyard, Diss Publishing, Aldeburgh and Halesworth bookshops.

Constable Country Medical Practice – Practice Update June 2022

Practice Update

We are now getting back to normal following the pandemic. However, we can't be complacent as Coronavirus is still in the community and we could be affected by new variants. We have re-opened our waiting areas but please continue to socially distance and wear a face mask whilst inside the building.

We continue to operate a telephone triage system when patients need to speak to one of our doctors or advanced nurse practitioners. They will phone to discuss your problem and arrange to see you in person the same day if they need to. This on-the-day system has been in operation since before that pandemic and, based on patient feedback, works well.

Please note that we have an extended team of clinicians including a pharmacist, paramedic and practice nurses. Our reception team will refer you to the clinician most suited to addressing your problem. They may also refer you to a local pharmacy if they are best placed to help you.

The preferred method of contacting the practice for non-urgent problems is eConsult. We will respond no later than the end of the next working day, and many issues can be dealt with without the need to speak to a clinician or come to the practice, e.g. referrals, medication issues, fit notes etc. though you will be contracted if we need any further information from you. Please see our website for further details.

We meet regularly with our Patient Participation Group. They are an invaluable link with patients and help us understand what works well and how we can improve the service we provide. Please send feedback to them via the

comment cards available at each practice site or via email. Their contact details are on our website. The PPG are also looking for new members so please contact them directly if you are interested.






