

Dear friends,

It's not long now until the end of term and I'm sure that children and their teachers are beginning to look forward to the summer holidays.

When we think about the beginning of summer we usually think about a specific date. We talk about it when the days are lengthening and it gets warmer, but this year we have been blessed with weeks of lovely sunny and warm (and even rather hot!) weather already. For the MET office summer began on 1st June. The astronomical calendar decides the seasons in relation to the earth's orbit around the sun and therefore the astronomical summer begins on the summer solstice on 21st June. Summer solstice has the longest period of daylight and therefore the shortest night, so weather permitting we can look forward to warm evenings and BBQs in the garden. And it's that time of the year again when we look forward to the summer weddings in our beautiful churches. Sadly, we are only having one wedding this year as several couples have had to cancel due to the economic circumstances and the cost-of-living crisis.

On a different note, on 14th June, most of our churchwardens gathered for the Archdeacon's Visitation in the beautiful church of St. Mary the Virgin in Bildeston and we had a very small number of parishioners who came to support them. One of our wardens couldn't make the date and will be attending another Visitation at the end of the month.

I am very grateful for all that our churchwardens do for the church. They look after the fabric of the building, they assist with services and they are the Bishop's Officers who support the Parish Priest. Thank you for all that you do!

After some discussion with Kate and Charlie Warburton, who are now managing the Langham Hall estate, a concession has been agreed over the tracks South from Broomhouse to the junction that then runs East to the village, on a Permissive Access basis.

Many residents say they have been free to use these paths for many years and the addition of a gate, forming a car park for fishing club members, has been a barrier, and they have assured us pedestrian access will be maintained.

Permissive Access gives the option to close the paths from time to time, for example when machinery activity was planned. We feel residents, especially those with dogs, would understand and accept this situation. It takes away the need to apply for formal application to amend the Definitive Map.

Of course, these paths being part of a working farm, could be affected by other operations. e.g., A driven shoot across the path.

The big concern is dogs running off the lead damaging crops and fouling, so please do keep dogs to the limits of the paths.

Other paths were discussed, for example, to the lock gate, but they were keen to dissuade crossing here, in case of accidents; around the field, where there is a diagonal path already, and did not want two separate paths, where diverting it would be expensive.

I'm sure the residents of Stratford St Mary will be very pleased with this arrangement.

We have worked together over the years to ensure the enjoyment of this beautiful part of the country area works for all of us and trust it will continue.

It's almost unbelievable but we are just past the half year mark, how time seems to fly past when we are all enjoying our gardens. So far this year Spring arrived after a very wet month of March, followed by a dry April and May with plenty of cold north to north easterly winds which didn't help the growing season at all. Early June and still quite cold especially at night. The old Suffolk saying of "A dripping June keeps things in tune" didn't materilise this year and with many hot days of 23 degrees and over, the gardens once again are starting to struggle and we, of course, need to keep the watering going once again. I was hopeful that we might not follow 2022's pattern of drought conditions but looks as if it will. We had several plants and shrubs look as if dead but after a very slow start several have started to show signs of life afterall. A wise move not to have dug them up straight away. On a positive note it means not quite so much money needs spending at garden centres. I think we must re consider what plants to replace any lost ones with very carefully and of course it might mean saving goodbye to some of our favorites as we will have possibly less water for them as well as less energies to keep up the ridgid schedule of contant watering possibly twice a day.

Nature also has to work harder to adapt to all this changing year on year but seems to cope

pretty well, all things considered.

Unfortunatly due to lack of support for our members "FREE" visit to RHS Hyde Hall gardens your committee decided to cancel. We could not justify or expect the staff to give up their time for such a small number (8). We could have taken up to a max of 55. Was it because people had to drive themselves? I appreciate a friendly day out together on a coach is preferable but our coach fees were just oto high to consider at this moment in time, perhaps things will improve next year and we may be able to resume with our summer coach annual outings once again.

Therefore to replace this cancelled June outing we have been kindly invited to go to Gt


First Friday of the Month Lunch Club

180km of 50 metre-high pylons cutting through the Four Mary's

Did you know that National Grid still wants to put 50-metre high pylons through our benefice?

The pylons are planned between Norwich and Tilbury, across Norfolk, Suffolk and Essex. They call the project 'East Anglia GREEN'. It is not green! Birds die in

strikes with power lines and trees, hedges and woodlands will have to be torn up to make way for the metal monstrosities.

Our campaign is for an integrated offshore grid instead of pylons. A study by National Grid ESO has shown that an offshore grid for the East of England would save £2bn. It would reduce overall infrastructure by 50%, thus being better for the environment. And it would save communities and countryside like ours, while also preventing bird deaths from power line strikes and huge habitat loss along the route.
