

# Welcome

Here is the first of a series of interviews with our local 'celebrities'. Look out for the next one in a few months' time.



I think everyone in our 4 villages must know Pat and Charlie Ablitt of Stratford St Mary. They are in person the communal memory of that village, as Pat was born there 85 years ago, and has never lived anywhere else apart from a couple of years when she was in London to train as a teacher. Charlie was born in 1930 at 2 Nook Cottages (now Hawthorns), in Holton, where he lived till he was 18; he became a Higham boy by default when his parents moved to Forge Cottage in that village while he was off on National Service.

No one in our communities would now believe what kind of a life people lived in our villages in the early to mid 20th century - Charlie recalls that neither he nor Pat had an inside toilet until they got married in 1956; the family loo in Holton was in the garden, and all the water for the household had to be carried in buckets from what is now Mayfields. Pat has fond memories of the old tin bath in front of the kitchen fire that you had to fill up with hot water whenever you wanted a bath because there was no indoor bathroom, either.

And there was no such thing as the school run in those days; Charlie walked from

Holton to Raydon school from the age of 5. When he left school he joined A. Dunningham and Sons (a name that lives on in Raydon) as an apprentice carpenter and joiner and stayed with them for 18 years. Pat went to school in Stratford and then on to Colchester High School, from where she went off to train as a teacher in Putney. Once qualified, she taught at East Bergholt for 6 years till her own children started to come along.

Hazel Cottage, where Pat and Charlie now live, was sold to Pat's father (Fred Cole) by her aunt, and he continued the family business from there. In 1962 Pat and Charlie decided to join him in his Coach Builders and Funeral Directors business. In those days all sorts of businesses used to operate out of the same premises, so the little office was used twice a week as a doctor's surgery; elderly ladies were very amused that they had to pick up their prescriptions from the undertaker's. And once when Fred was trying to book a cremation he got a wrong number; the voice at the other end said, 'Hand on a minute, mate - we are the chemists; we try to keep them alive; you want them dead! Charlie hadn't had any experience of the funeral business before joining Fred, but he saw it as a way he could help people when they were mourning the loss of a loved one. Pat remembered one particular incident when a lady had come to make funeral arrangements for her deceased husband, and the family cat walked over everyone else to get to the lady's lap, where it sat to be stroked, helping to calm her down. Even the cat was involved in the pastoral care business!

By that point, Charlie had built 'Lowlands', on land that Pat's father had given them, for the grand total of £1200, and there they lived till 2001, adding on bedrooms in the roof as the family grew. They eventually moved back to Pat's family home of Hazel Cottage 7 years after her stepmother died; much work was needed in between times to get the house fit for 21st century living.

Pat and Charlie are much loved by us all and have been involved in everything in village life, from church and hand bell ringing to singing in the choir and being on the PCC. Long may they continue to be part of our lives!

#### Weather Watch

In May this year, the saying 'ne'er cast a clout till May is out, is very appropriate, clout is taken as meaning a cloak. The North Sea is at its coldest during early March at around 6C and it takes until September to reach a peak temperature of around 16C to 17C. A walk along the promenade at Clacton with a North Easterly wind blowing off the sea during April can be decidedly chilly as has happened this year.

It has been a lovely Spring regarding tree blossoms and flowers such as Daffodils, Crocus, Snowdrops, Blue Bells amongst others, being unspoilt by rain and frost despite some easterly winds on occasions during April and May. At the time of this article, every where looks fresh and green. However, it is only half the story.

Every month since November has received below average rainfall. For December 2016, I only recorded a total of 7.6 millimetres (0.3 inches), this December being the driest December I have ever recorded. Rainfall for January 2017 amounted to 36.7 millimetres (average is about 52 millimetres), February's rainfall was 32.3 millimetres (average 44 millimetres). the March value was 26.1 millimetres (average 48 millimetres), April's amount came to 2.8 millimetres (average 46 millimetres) and up to May 7th, I had measured only 2.2 millimetres. A quick calculation shows that for the period mentioned, total rainfall came to 107 millimetres, which is only 43% of the usual amount. Reservoirs depend on winter rainfall to top up water levels since the evaporation rate in July is sixty times that in January so there could be a problem if we have a hot dry summer this year.

We have just experienced another mild winter but not as mild as the previous winter 2015/16. Temperatures in January recorded by myself were 6.1C max & 1.4C min which is about normal for the month and there were 18 air and grass frosts

during the month. Again, there was hardly a flake of snow and few foggy days so disruption to transport was minimal although the frosts in January have been responsible for pot holes on some roads.

It has been a good Spring for Holly Blue and Orange Tip Butterflies (the male butterfly only having the orange tip) and I have also seen some Brimstones (yellow butterflies, the male having the deepest yellow colour) but very few Peacock and Small Tortoiseshell butterflies. These hibernate during the winter and often behind curtains and picture frames in houses and are sometimes mistaken for moths and regrettably killed. Small Tortoiseshell numbers have drastically reduced recently which is quite worrying.

We will have to see what this year's summer brings, hopefully some warm days but also much needed rain.

### Constable Country Medical Practice – Practice Update April 2017

#### **GP+ Service**

Suffolk GP Federation provides out-ofhours services on behalf of the majority of practices in Suffolk. It operates from a number of sites, the nearest to the practice being Stowmarket (Stow Health), Ipswich (Riverside) and Felixstowe (Felixstowe General Hospital). Typically, services are offered from 18:30 to 21:00 during the week and through the day on Saturday and Sunday. 15 minute GP and Nurse Practitioner appointments are available but can only be booked by the practice or other healthcare organisations. At the time of booking, patients will need to provide their consent to share their medical notes with the clinician they see. This service is proving to be very popular as it relieves pressure on the practice on busy days and also provides patients with alternative options for addressing a medical problem. You may be offered an appointment with GP+ or you can ask the receptionist for current availability.

#### **Nurse Practitioners**

I'm delighted to announce that we have an additional Nurse Practitioner joining the practice. June will be joining us at the end of April. She is an experienced Nurse Practitioner who also specialises in the treatment of diabetes. Our two Nurse Practitioners, June and Sarah, are able to address a wide range of medical conditions. On contacting the practice our reception team can advise patients whether it is appropriate for them to be seen a Nurse Practitioners or if they need to see a GP.

#### **Repeat Prescriptions**

Please note that it may take the practice up to 72 hours to process a repeat prescription. When issued they can be sent immediately to the patient's nominated pharmacy but it may take up to 72 hours for the pharmacy to have your medication ready for

collection, depending on workload and the availability of the items required. In the majority of cases your prescription will be processed and ready for collection much sooner, but please allow ample time by ensuring the practice receives repeat prescription slips a week in advance of when the items are required.

#### Wheelchair

The Practice has wheelchairs available at both Capel and East Bergholt to assist patients with mobility problems getting in and out of the practice. Unfortunately, one of the chairs at East Bergholt has broken and is not repairable. If you have a wheelchair you no longer need, and it is not on loan from the NHS, the practice could make very good use of it.

#### **Training Days**

Just a reminder that in 2017 the practice will be closed from 1pm on the following dates for staff training:

7th June (wed)

On these afternoons the doors will be closed so please ensure any prescriptions are picked up well beforehand. If you phone the practice the recorded message will ask you to ring 111 for medical assistance if your problem cannot wait until the next day.

#### The Church Door

There is, in one of the many churches in Bruges, an anonymous notice or 'flyer'. The Church is Roman Catholic, small, used for regular worship and not a particular tourist attraction. The notice is entitled, 'The Church Door' and reads:

#### The Church Door

'He asks us:

Have you reflected on what happens when you enter through a church door?

Have you ever experienced that such a door is a connection between two worlds? On the one side, there is the hustle and bustle of daily life, with work and with business, with its sorrows and its conviviality, a life that we enjoy with its abundance of good things, but also a life where we encounter evil, misery, lies, deceit and suspicion.

And on the other side, this space where we can come with our restlessness and sorrows, to find peace and tranquility.

Here the light is different, softened by an atmosphere of reflection and prayer, where our look becomes different and deeper.

With its strong walls, rising pillars and high vaults, it is an impressive space.

We are in the house of God, where everything speaks of his goodness and his merciful love. This is what many visitors, pilgrims and tourists feel.

May this experience be shared by every person passing through this church door.'

Many readers will recognise and appreciate this reflection and perhaps nod in agreement, probably in silence.

Many people will enter church to come close to God and look for a time of quiet prayer before a service. Others, after a week of hard work, stress, temptations and challenges, look forward to coming to church to open themselves to God in a time of quiet reverence and reflection. The general chattering and conversation before

a service often denies people the opportunity for this quiet, personal and almost intimate reflection with God.

The concept of silence within Anglican liturgy (what we say and do and the order in which we say and do them) could be taken more seriously and become an integral part of the service - as important as the hymns we sing or the corporate prayers we offer. Mother Theresa eloquently said, "We need to find God, and he cannot be found in noise and restlessness. God is the friend of silence. We need silence to touch the souls". Jesus also understood this, taking himself away to guiet places to be with his Father ('But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed': Luke 5: 15-16'). God commands us in Psalm 46; 'Be still and know that I am God' and explains in Isaiah (30: 15) that; 'In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength'.

For many, silence is much worse than noise or a constant background of chattering or mumbled conversation; they need something to mask or even obliterate the discomfort of silence. Some would even consider silence morbid. It has been said that; 'Men (and presumably women) fear silence as they fear solitude because both give them a glimpse of the terror of life's nothingness' (Andre Maurois, French author). For this may well be the reality of life without a living God. The author of Ecclesiastes (who many believe to have been Solomon) wisely said that there was, "A time to be silent and a time to speak" (3:7). This is as relevant in our Christian lives as well as our secular lives and as disciples of Jesus, both individually and corporately, we should practice this pearl of wisdom both in and outside Church.
