### **Community First Responders**

CFR's are trained volunteers who are dispatched by the ambulance service to life threatening emergencies in local communities. The volunteers normally work within a radius of 8 minutes drive from their location but depending on circumstances this could be further. They can normally get to a casualty before an ambulance can get there, assess the patient and start possible life saving treatment immediately. If the situation changes the CFR can update Ambulance Control to give them an updated assessment of the patient.

The Stratford St Mary area is covered by a CFR bag supplied by Stratford St Mary Parish Council. This bag is presently used by 2 volunteers in Stratford St Mary and one in Langham. The area is also covered by other volunteers with different bags from Dedham, East Bergholt, Manningtree, Brantham and Bradfield.

A volunteer can be on call whenever they want, if you are logged off duty, you do not get called.

At the moment the Stratford St Mary bag is not utilised as much as it could be and I would like to improve this. Ideally I would like some volunteers in Stratford St Mary to complete the training and then become CFR for Stratford St Mary and the surrounding villages. The more hours we have the bag active the better cover we have for ourselves.

## The Highway Code: an essential read for all road-users

When did you last read the Highway Code? Probably in preparation for your driving test, after which it was discarded, burnt or deleted (on-line). This may have been decades or weeks ago, but, whatever the period, memories can be very short. As pedestrian, cyclist, driver (of any motorised vehicle, irrespective of energy source) and rider of horse, donkey or camel, we should be aware of the Code's contents, if only because much of it has legal implications – as some of you may have experienced.

The majority of the fatal and near-fatal vehicle-vehicle and person-vehicle incidents arise from drivers breaking the Highway Code – and the law. A significant minority result from poor, or no driver observation and anticipation, occasionally meeting the criteria for 'dangerous driving'. The smallest group result from genuine 'accidents'; when I was 11 years old, my father was killed by a glass-punctured exploding tyre and the resulting head-on collision with a van; tragically, this pre-dated the mandatory use of seat-belts.

Driving standards throughout Great Britain are poor, and deteriorating. Paradoxically, advances in vehicle-safety technology mask these poor standards; without them the incidence of deaths and irreversible. life-changing disabilities would be much higher. Passing the Advanced Driving Test opened my eves, literally and metaphorically, to how many road-users drive without care, sense, or responsibility, whatever the post-code. For over twenty vears as a Consultant in Paediatric Neurology, I supervised a Regional Head Injury Rehabilitation Team and service at Alder Hev Children's Hospital whose role was to rehabilitate children 'fortunate' enough to have survived a severe head injury following a road traffic accident.

For all of us, and particularly children and the elderly (who have relatively immature risk-awareness and risk-avoidance behaviours), I offer some observations on what I feel represent some of the more dangerous driving practices. Hopefully, this might reduce your risk of a heart attack, guilt, increased insurance premiums and losing points; as everyone knows, 'points can mean licences'.

• Approximately 60% of all 'accidental' deaths of children (<16 years of age) are due to road accidents with most involving the child as a pedestrian rather than cyclist

• The risk of a child dying following being hit by a vehicle is almost doubled from 30mph to 40mph

• The speed limit is the 'absolute maximum'; it should only be used when the road conditions, weather, and immediate environment are safe to do so. The recurring numbers of smashed or wrecked cars between Holton St Mary and Hadleigh is testament to this wisdom. The 60mph limit between East Bergholt and Holton St Mary is dangerously inappropriate and encourages poor driving

• When overtaking, before moving back into the left-hand lane, ensure you can see the entire front of the car and its wheels in your driving mirror, indicate and then return to that lane. This specific instruction is not in the Code but reflects wise advice

• When joining a dual carriageway (specifically the Essex-Suffolk race-way otherwise known as the A12) one should understand the traffic on your right, has right of way; you should join only when safe to do so and 'safe' refers to both yourself and the traffic on the main carriageway. Be patient...

Driving whilst using a 'non-hands free' mobile 'phone causes physical and visual distraction and is a major cause of road traffic-related fatalities. No one is that important to have to drive and telephone or text simultaneously.

You may feel family and friends, as well as other drivers from outside the Benefice may

benefit from this offering; please feel free to pass it on, but only when safe to do so...

Just a reminder for house names/numbers to be visible. If an emergency vehicle needs to find your house at night, will it find it easily?

Lots of names/numbers are hidden behind bushes - it would only take a few minutes to clear it but those few minutes might make a huge difference if the emergency vehicle finds your house first time.

The River Stour Trust is looking for volunteers to join its team of skippers and crew operating its fleet of electric launches on the River Stour in Suffolk, made famous in John Constable's paintings. Full training and familiarisation with the river will be provided, but the 21ft launches are simplicity itself to drive, with smooth, quiet electric motors, and maximum speeds of 4mph. And if you don't fancy getting afloat, we also need people ashore to handle the bookings, meet the visitors, cutting the grass and general maintenance.

They run most weekends and some midweek days from April to October and raise funds vital to the work of the Trust in restoring and maintaining the navigation for all to enjoy. Over the past 50 years it has restored or rebuilt four of the 25 mile waterway's 13 locks, two slipways, and a Visitor Centre.

Visitors from all over the country and world, as well local residents, enjoy observing the wildlife and tranquillity of the river on our boats Trusty II and Kathleen who operate between Stratford St Mary, Flatford, Dedham and Brantham with Rosette, Francis J, Edwardian Lady and the John Constable Lighter operating between Sudbury, Great Cornard and Great Henny.

## Launch of Emotional Wellbeing Hub to support young people

A new Emotional Wellbeing Hub for children, young people and their families is set to officially launch as part of Mental Health Awareness Week (14 -20 May).

The hub, which is one of the first of its kind in the country, will provide a unique, onestop point of information and support for people concerned about the mental health or emotional wellbeing of anyone aged up to 25.

Specially-trained Emotional Wellbeina Practitioners - including five staff from the Norfolk and Suffolk NHS Foundation Trust (NSFT), two of whom are experienced mental health nurses - will respond to telephone and web-based contact from young people, family members and health professionals from across east and west Suffolk. The practitioners will provide support and guidance and, when needed, referral to an appropriate service such as NSFT's community mental health teams, Wellbeing Suffolk, Suffolk County Council's Early Help Team or School Nursing Team or one of the county's voluntary sector services.

"This is a service that Suffolk should be very proud of and marks a turning point for how services are developed. It has been a long and, at times, difficult journey which has required us all to re-evaluate the way we work and challenged us to trust each other. But the journey doesn't stop here as we hope that our collaborative relationships will continue to transform and develop services that place children, young people and families at the very centre of what they do and which meet the needs of the population of Suffolk."






