Dear friends,

It was an absolute iov to see that HM the Queen has been able to fulfil some public duties again after she had to cancel several engagements due to mobility issues. She was smiling and seemed to eniov the finale of the Windsor Horse Show, even thought there were some emotional moments when Princess Louise drove her grandfather's carriage and when the Queen's own horses and fell ponies were led round the arena. I hope that HM is able to look forward to the Jubilee celebrations as much as we all are. Only three other kings worldwide have been able to celebrate a platinum jubilee, Louis XIV of France in 1713, Johann II, Prince of Liechtenstein in 1928 and King Bhumibol of Thailand in 2016. This is the first time a British monarch has marked a 70 years on the throne and therefore our nation is right in marking this occasion with great joy. Elsewhere in this newsletter you will find information on all the celebratory events that have been planned in our villages. On Sunday, 5th June our churches will mark the occasion with joyful civic services, concluding with an evening celebration in Holton at 5pm.

On 5th June we also celebrate Pentecost even though this important festival is somewhat overshadowed by the jubilee celebrations this year. At Pentecost we remember how the disciples and many others received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is regarded as the birthday of the Christian Church and the start of the Church's mission to the world.

Last month, we had the privilege of hearing Julian Crisp, a former Raydon boy, talk about his calling to mission in Guatemala. He gave us a fascinating insight during our morning service in Higham and our Sacred Space service in Raydon into the wonderful work he is doing for and with the poorest people of Guatemala. He is involved in projects to provide clean drinking water by the digging of wells and the installation of a water purification plant. He has also been able to gain support for the installation of stoves with flues to avoid the smoke from cooking on open fires filling people's huts with smoke and leading to respiratory illnesses, especially in women. Another project is a soup kitchen for the children in the poorest communities in the mountains of Guatemala. All of this amazing work is supported by local volunteers, and his charity, Feeding Faith, aims to help people to help themselves whilst being respectful of local culture and traditions. We continued to think about mission and how we are called to Christian discipleship on Christian Aid Sunday in Holton. We are all called 'love one another as Jesus loves us'

Village Life

Periodic Report 2020-2022

For obvious reasons, **VillageLife** has not been operational during the period of the pandemic although it did fund the provision of a notice board at the River Garden and members have continued to maintain the Millennium and River Gardens for the village. Time has nevertheless marched relentlessly on and the members of the organization's Executive Committee have inevitably grown older and less active with its passing.

VillageLife (VL) was created, following the demise of the Friends of Stratford St Mary Church, as a vehicle for ongoing stimulation of community activity in our Parish and from it's formation in 2013 to the start of lockdown in 2020, it did, we believe, have some modest success in doing so.

Many of you may recall the series of annual Constable Country Fairs organized by the Friends and hosted at Hall Farm and it was the success of these that encouraged a residual group of Friends Committee members to commit to a new organization that would focus, not on fundraising but on the generation of an ongoing sense of community in our Parish. Over the following years, VL staged 2 Village Gatherings at Stratford Hills, a Mediaeval Fayre and HMQ90 at the school, The Village Open Day (2017), the annual Quintuple (pub-games) Challenge at the Swan, the 'Christmas Light-up' at the millennium garden and various social events including traditional country dancing evenings, Race Nights and periodic 'Stories by the Fire' evenings;

The Interruption of the lockdown years has however taken its toll and our Executive team members (who were in any case all in the vulnerable person category at the start of the pandemic) now find that they no longer possess the energy and drive required to initiate and organise the social

events that they once had such success with.

But the **VL Executive** don't want to see **VL** sink into oblivion if that can be avoided. We believe that it still has a valid purpose and that with an injection of new blood in the form of younger members, **VL** could rise to the challenge and again enhance the social life of our community.

VL has a bank balance, not a fortune but still a meaningful sum that would help to support and underwrite, ongoing activity. It also has a stock of more or less useful equipment that together with the cash could be available to assist rebirth, provided VLs objectives were broadly carried on.

The **VL Executive** therefor invites an approach from seriously interested individuals or groups who might feel able to take such a project on.

We look forward to hearing from you.

Our 42nd year is moving forwards too fast. Here we are 6 months through the year already. June is a wonderful month for gardens and fields as well provided the old Suffolk saying follows :- "A dripping June keeps things in tune". but we do not want a month of wet days, just a nice mix of showers and warm sunshine. June of course is the month of "Roses" which are now starting to appear and will of course continue right through summer and autumn with fantastic blooms and fragrance. I hope you are all getting out into your gardens as much as possible to enjoy all the flowers that just keep following one after the other. If you're lucky enough to be able to go for country walks, now is the time to see and hear many different birds including Nightingale, Skylarks, Yellow Hammer, Linnets, and many more. You may also spot fledgings taking their first flights, and perhaps a cuckoo flying passed.

April 28th was our normal monthly meeting and another fantastic speaker in Matthew Tanton -Brown who has given us many great talks accompanied by slides over the years. KEY POINTS FROM RAYDON PARISH COUNCIL'S AGM HELD ON TUESDAY 3 MAY 2022

- Sue Newton was re-elected Chairman and Amanda Pyall was reappointed Vice Chairman.
- Public Forum parishioners raised several issues, including CIL money funds for the current year had not yet been allocated but councillors would be discussing this at a future meeting. To date, a large proportion of CIL funding had been spent on resurfacing the Pavilion car park and the lay-by outside the church, during the financial year 2020/21. The questionnaire circulated to all residents in 2018 had highlighted the problem of speeding the PC had introduced a Community Speedwatch scheme but this had been suspended by the police due to a number of issues; it was hoped to be

able to reinstate the scheme later in the year. Grass verges - letters had been sent to all those residents affected, inviting their views on what should be done; contractors had been approached to quote for various different options. Communications – the PC had set up a communications working group which would be meeting shortly.

- Colin Chapman was co-opted onto the Parish Council with immediate effect.
- Babergh DC The Government's energy rebate payments of £150 had been made to households who paid council tax via direct debit; those who did not would receive their payment later in the month. The Women's Cycle Tour in June would be passing through Raydon and Upper Layham.
- Suffolk CC with regard to the campaign urging households to recycle glass properly, changes to the current arrangements were being considered, including kerbside collections. Visit https://www.suffolkrecycling.org.uk/ for more information about where to recycle glass currently.
- It was agreed that the Parish Council should make an additional donation of £100 to Quiet Lanes Suffolk, bringing its total contribution to £250. The PC thanks everyone who responded to our public consultation lead to be a consultation between

- Quiet Lanes Suffolk, bringing its total contribution to £250. The PC thanks everyone who responded to our public consultation last year regarding this initiative for your information, the signs have been ordered and will be installed by our volunteers over the next few months.
- National Grid's 'East Anglia Green' consultation it was agreed to set up a working group to prepare a response to the consultation; the deadline for responses was Thursday 16 June. It was noted that Sir Bernard Jenkin MP was setting up a group to look into an offshore option.

Called **Welcome to our friends from Ukraine** the handy 16-page guide is available in Ukrainian, Russian and English language formats. It can be download <u>HERE</u> and will be distributed as hard copies by health and care partners to host families throughout the area.

The guide is aimed at helping people establish themselves in our local area so they can live as happily and healthily as possible, and to ease their transition to living in the UK.

Features include how to register with a GP practice, how pharmacies are a good source of help and advice, where to access mental wellbeing support, the 24/7 support available from NHS 111 and advice on keeping physically well.




