





# Welcome



Dear friends.

When you get this, I shall have just come back from a 3-week pilgrimage to north

India, and no doubt I shall be very ready to bore you with stories and photos of my time there. As I write in early February, I am thinking of all that has gone into preparing for my trip, not only physically so that I don't go down with some horrible disease, but also spiritually, because despite - or perhaps because of - its British legacy, parts of India are sometimes actively hostile to the Christian faith. But I am reminded at the same time that I am nowhere near to suffering the plight of the refugees from the Middle East who had counted on a safe haven in America but have been denied that last vestige of common humanity by the (almost literally) incredible policies of President Trump. I hope that, by the time I get back, those policies will have been thoroughly overridden by the American courts, as they are beginning to be as I write.

Let's get to some good news - we have decided that this year's Mothering Sunday service will be celebrated by all 4 parishes together, in the Parish Room at Stratford. As it falls on a 4th Sunday, which is usually the Family Hour Sunday, we shall meet at 9.30 for bacon butties, followed by a short family service with dressing up and acting out of a Bible story, and we shall of course have the usual posies for children to give to their parents. Do come and join us for the fun.

March sees the start of Lent, a time when we take a look at ourselves to see how we could do better in future, especially in offering our lives to God. To help us to do that, we shall be running a Lent Course, using a leaflet called 'Living our Gifts'. We will start on 7 March at the Rectory from 2.30 to 4 p.m., finishing with tea; the 3 following sessions will be in other houses around the Benefice (venues tba), and then we shall end at the Rectory again on 12 April. Please do come and explore the gifts that you can offer to God through his Church.

Finally, another reminder that on 1st Sundays we now run a 'Sunday School' (a prize for anyone who can come up with a better name!) during the 10 a.m. service at SSM for primary age children to listen to a story and do some activities that they will then show to the grownups when they come back into the service. If you would like your child(ren) to know more about God, please bring them on those Sundays. You will be more than welcome.

#### A note for Everyone

Just a reminder for house names/numbers to be visible. If an emergency vehicle needs to find your house at night, will it find it easily?

Lots of names/numbers are hidden behind bushes - it would only take a few minutes to clear it but those few minutes might make a huge difference if the emergency vehicle finds your house first time.



#### Hall Farm support to the Village

Our Community First Responder Service is struggling to cover the number of hours it would like because of the difficulty of finding volunteers with available time.

One way of addressing this issue is to have public access to a life saving defibrillator available 24 hours a day in the village. Hall Farm have contacted us with an opportunity to provide just such a facility.

Just over 2 years ago a lady died at Hall Farm, in spite of great efforts to save her. As a thank you for those efforts the lady's family wish to donate a defibrillator to Hall Farm in memory of their mother, and also of a loved sister.

Although it is bequeathed to Hall Farm, and hence will be sited there, John, Myra and their family wish it to be available to the whole Community.

For this reason we are liaising with the Ambulance service to have it adopted as a Community defibrillator site. The defibrillator will be externally mounted in a heated box safe with a code lock which is accessed through the 999 service; Hence it will be available to all of us 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

However we will need to raise some additional funding for the external box, so are approaching the village community for help. We are organising a raffle with some very attractive donated prizes and selling them via a door knock which will also give an opportunity to explain what is happening. We will give you a draw ticket for every pound donated and then we will enter these into a raffle. If we are lucky enough to raise more than is required, the extra money will go to the ongoing village Community First Responder service. The Draw will take place on Saturday 1st April at the Race Night.

We believe this will be a key development for the village and we hope we can count on your support.

We would, however, welcome a few more volunteers into the scheme so if you could spare just 1 or 2 hours per month please consider joining us.



# Elizabeth Garrett Anderson (1836 – 1917)

Who knows the story of this lady, celebrating the centenary of her death this year? Many people will have seen her name above the entrance to the A & E unit at Ipswich Hospital, but are they aware what a remarkable woman she was, or even who she was?

She was born in London but spent most of her childhood in Suffolk, Leiston, where her father was a successful business man. He had a barley and coal merchanting business at Snape Maltings and moved to Aldeburgh where he built Alde House. But what an amazing daughter he produced – so many firsts to her name.

The first woman to pass the exams to become a doctor, opened the first hospital for women in London, first Dean of the London School of Medicine for Women and finally first female mayor in England – Adleburgh. Through all this she was constantly fighting the Victorian prejudice against women doing anything but bear children and manage the home. Needless to say she was a leading political campaigner for women's rights. # Gifts for Mother's Day given from the heart

The exact origins of Mothering Sunday are unclear. Some have even linked it with the spring festivals for various mother goddesses held in ancient Greece and Rome.

However, it is certainly known that by the 16th century during Lent there was one Sunday when all returned to their "Mother Church" - the main church or cathedral of the area. This custom evolved over the years to become the day when those working away from home, often in service, or as apprentices, returned to visit not only their mother-church, but also their own mother and family. They would bring handpicked flowers or cake; a precursor to the tradition still observed today of the giving of gifts to mothers on Mothering Sunday.

Beneath the cards and the flowers gifted to 'that caring and supportive someone' there is a simple message of love and appreciation that can be given on Mothering Sunday. For many years now Mothers' Union have supported this act through our fantastic Make a Mother's Day Appeal where our ethical gifts have the added benefit of making a difference to mothers and communities around the world. On Mothering Sunday, this year (25th March 2017) why not give a gift that will transform a life. Marie Claire says, "Thank you for training me in crafts such as sewing, knitting and jewellery. I now buy all I need and have my workshop to teach children how to weave

I am currently a member of the Action and Outreach committee at Mothers' Union central base in London. I hear directly from our members across the world about the impact of our project work and play a role in monitoring and supporting new projects. I have a particular interest in projects that promote self-reliance and resilience. In Gikomero Parish, Rwanda, 105 young single mothers joined our Mothers' Union parenting skills group. Many knew little about parenting and were being shunned by their families

One mum from the group says, "We are so thankful. We felt excluded as single mothers but your support brings us together and we find strength in each other. We have learnt practical skills like growing vegetables for a healthy diet. We have even started a savings group to help each other care for the needs of our children."





#### Verbal abuse of receptionists

We were very sorry to hear that receptionists have recently been victims of an increase in personal abuse from patients. You may be frustrated, worried and angry when you call but please don't take it out on the receptionists.

Two of our PPG members spent a morning at Capel and East Bergholt surgeries. They were impressed by the helpfulness and attitude of the staff, and the systems in place. Phone calls were constant and answered on average in 30 seconds.

There were many requests for input from the doctors (from prescriptions to urgent queries). These requests are immediately passed on electronically, and an 'urgent task' pops up on the doctor's screen.

One bit of feedback from patients was acted on immediately - you will notice that your name is now on the screen for much longer!

#### Follow-up appointments

If a doctor wants to see you again, ask him/her to book this for you, as receptionists aren't usually able to do this.

#### **Problems with prescriptions**

The recent changes to electronic prescriptions have meant there is increased delay in providing the prescribed medicine. Please ensure that you get your repeat prescriptions in early.
