



Dear friends.

A quick reminder that our first two morning services in March will be in a different

rotation from usual because of Mothering Sunday on 11th. You may notice that the Church calls it 'Mothering Sunday' rather than 'Mother's Day' - that's because we believe that the kind of care that is known as 'mothering' isn't only done by mothers! Indeed, one of the most famous saints of East Anglia. Dame Julian of Norwich. talked about Jesus as our mother in her 'Revelations of Divine Love': 'It is a characteristic of God to overcome evil with good. Jesus Christ, therefore, who himself overcame evil with good, is our true Mother. We received our being from him, and this is where his maternity starts. And it comes with the gentle protection and guard of love, which will never cease to surround us.

In this day of extreme awareness of gender relations, let's celebrate kind, gentle, non-abusive support from whatever source we get it; we all need 'mothering' from time to time. So we do hope families from around the Benefice will come and join us at SSM at 10 a.m. on 11th for a special service during which children of all ages will be given posies for their mothers - and those who mother them in other ways - to say thank you.

And speaking of caring for those we love, it has been on my mind for a while now that I would like to do something to help preserve the sanity of all those in our villages who care for loved ones at home.

I come across more and more of you who are doing a heroic job of looking after relatives with dementia or a terminal illness, and I know how tired you get. physically, mentally and emotionally. So I am inviting you to give yourselves a break one morning a month by coming to a 'Carers' Coffee' at the Rectory to let yourselves be looked after for an hour or so and to share your stories with others who will understand all too well what you are going through. Carers can often become very isolated from the wider world around, and depression is not uncommon, so please come and offload in a safe and caring environment. We will start up after Easter, and I will put further details into the April Quartet.

However you are approaching it, may the next few weeks of Lent bring you new insights into yourself and how you can move forward with God, till we come to the outburst of joy that is Easter morning on 1 April. Then we shall celebrate the new life of the one who gave himself for us, a life that he is longing to share with us all. On that morning there will be a service at both SSM and Holton, and Easter eggs will abound!



'Ministers all dressed up with no one to listen'

This headline in the 'Faith' section of the Times in early February highlighted the decline in church congregations and how the Church of England must respond, particularly in rural areas. The article focused on Northamptonshire, but the phenomenon affects all rural communities. Jesus did tell us that, 'When two or three are gathered in my name ... there will I be'; this promise is clearly not restricted to the inside of a medieval church and applies equally to a house, field, football stadium or street-corner. However, nothing can replace the building that is the 'Church', a sanctuary from earthly exasperations for worship, fellowship and prayer. The evening service is at greatest risk of 'congregation no-show' but the morning ('Principal') Sunday service not spared. Multiple factors are responsible for this situation including: an aging population with either no, or a slowlyemerging younger population; a perceived lack of need for a Sunday Church service or God, or both (discussion of the latter merits a separate article). Many rural communities would unequivocally cite the church as being the village focal point, either through conviction or a rosy optimism. Sadly, there is a real danger that within a decade (two at most), many rural churches will be congregation-less and risk decommission. thereby obviating dedicated work of many charities that have strived to maintain them, as well as depriving the village of what many perceive as its heart and soul.

Some consider 'Festival Church' (FC) a solution to this inexorable decline. This is perceived, if not broadly defined as a Church that is not needed for weekly worship, but is still loved. Its religious role becomes limited to religious festivals, typically Christmas, Easter and Harvest, but also for Mothering Sunday, Remembrance Sunday and some Rogation Day services.

It would remain available for the habitual 'rites of passage' (weddings, funerals and baptisms) and would also accommodate appropriate complementary and community uses, for example, 'Mums and tots'; 'Craft, chat and coffee', and concerts. This would provide excellent opportunities to establish or reconnect the church building with the community and, crucially, nurture future congregations. Practical and potential financial benefits of an FC are outside the remit of this article.

The concept of an FC is unlikely to receive universal acclaim. I would be saddened if my village church was unavailable for worship on a weekly basis. However, the principle behind a FC demands serious consideration and, like the proverbial curate's egg, is good in parts. What is clear is that the Church must do more to understand both the religious and secular needs of the rural community and to adapt to meet these needs. Consequently, it will better serve the entire, and not just the aging and disappearing village congregation. This can only be effected by open, honest and collaborative work by the whole community, whether practising and believing Christians or not, and the ordained and lay ministry teams. If we really love and champion our village Church, we must show it.

Programme of talks for 2018

We are currently planning a series of talks on a variety of health topics suggested at our previous talks on diabetes, heart problems and men's health. If you have any other topics you would like to suggest please get in touch via either of the methods above. Childhood ailments is the next planned talk.

Patient Research Project

We are currently working with the University of East Anglia to carry out research on patient views in the practice. Thanks in particular to Dr. Frank Wells, the Vice Chair of the PPG, for his determination to find a local university willing to take this on.

Managing NHS pressures

Pressure continues to increase on all NHS services. Receptionists in the practice have been on "Care Navigator" training, which helps them to direct patients to the most relevant clinician, as well as to local support services. So there may be times, for example, when they suggest you see a Nurse Practitioner, rather than a doctor.

PPG "cluster" meetings

We attend meetings with PPG groups from other practices to discuss what we're all doing and to hear presentations from local organisations and the East Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group. At a recent meeting representatives from OneLife Suffolk spoke about the importance of improving patients' lifestyles, concentrating exercise. on regular stopping smoking and reducing weight. This could be the subject of a future talk organised by the PPG. Your views welcome.

Patient Transport Capel St Mary, East Bergholt and surrounding villages

Unfortunately the patient transport scheme has had to be suspended until all volunteers have completed a "DBS" check. This is a routine check which has to be done for a variety of jobs where people have one to one contact with the public, including children. It checks whether someone has a criminal record, for example. Taxi drivers have to go through this and, although our drivers are volunteers, it's been thought best that they undergo this screening.

Capel surgery refurbishment

The refurbishment of the Capel surgery will be starting soon, so please bear with it while improvements are made.

Toys return to the waiting rooms

After a long period of discussion we at last have agreement that toys will be available in the waiting rooms. They will be regularly cleaned to avoid infection risk.






