

# COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS.

CFR's are trained volunteers who are dispatched by the ambulance service to life threatening emergencies local communities. The volunteers normally work within a radius of 8 minutes drive from their location but depending on circumstances this could be further afield. They can normally get to a casualty before an ambulance can get there, assess the patient and start possible life saving treatment immediately. If the situation changes the CFR can update Ambulance Control to give them an updated assessment of the patient.

The Local area is covered by a CFR bag located in Langham (the bag was supplied by Stratford St Mary Parish Council) and also other bags in Dedham, East Bergholt, Capel St Mary and Manningtree. The bag is presently used by only one volunteer in Langham.

A volunteer can be on call whenever they want, if you are logged off duty, you do not get called.

At the moment the Stratford St Mary bag is not utilised as much as it could be and I would like to improve this. Ideally I would like some volunteers in the Langham, Stratford St Mary, Boxted and Dedham areas to complete the training and then join me in covering our area. The more hours we have the bag active the better cover we have for ourselves.

### **RNIB Stamp Appeal**

Well done everyone - a great effort! Our first carrier bag full of postage stamps has now been sent off to the RNIB. Although it has been quite a few decades(!) since I collected stamps as a hobby, it was very interesting to note where all the foreign stamps had come from. I counted 27 different countries including:

Australia, Bermuda, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Eire, Falkland Islands, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Grenada, Guernsey, Hong Kong, India, Italy, Mauritius, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Singapore, The Solomon Islands, South Africa, Spain, Tanzania, USA, Zimbabwe.

It is nice to think, in this age of email and paperless post, that we are still communicating across the world in a more tangible way.

Please keep collecting your used postage stamps for the RNIB, supporting people with sight loss. Collection boxes are located in the church and the parish room.

On Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> January 2019, a band of 6 ringers from the Suffolk Guild of Ringers came to St Mary's Church to ring the church bells in tribute to Charlie Ablitt who, as many local people will already know, played a major part in keeping bell ringing alive in Higham and Stratford St Mary for over forty years.

The band, consisting of Brian Whiting, Christine Knight, Neville Whittell, David Stanford, Thomas Scase and Alan Mayle, rang a peal of 5040 changes incorporating 4 minor methods (1 extent of Kent Treble Bob, 2 extents of Oxford Treble Bob, 2 extents of Cambridge Surprise and 2 extents of Plain

Bob), taking 3 hours and eight minutes to complete the peal.

The band recorded the following tribute in the belfry visitor's book: *In fond memory of Charles H Ablitt, former Tower Captain and much loved tutor of many ringers.* Some three weeks later, on the morning of Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> February, a band of ringers perhaps more closely associated with Charlie, rang a quarter peal (1260 changes) of plain bob doubles at Higham, which took some 42 minutes.

The band (see picture below), was made up of three members of the Ablitt Family, (daughter Sarah, son Peter and niece Lynn), two of Charlie's trainee ringers (Brenda and Brian Such) with the peal being conducted by Richard Hobson who was also taught to ring by Charlie. In celebration of the life of our much-loved Tower Captain Charlie Ablitt, his instruction to always lead with open hand-stroke' will not be forgotten.

Boards recording these tributes will be installed in the respective ringing chambers in the coming months.

New ringers are always welcome and anyone (of any age) who thinks they might like to follow in Charlie's footsteps by giving ringing a try, should call Martin Carr 01206 337 325, Brenda or Brian Such 01206 323 091. Practice sessions are held on Friday evenings 7.30 to 9.00pm, at Higham and Stratford church towers (alternately).
