The Village Emergency Telephone

The Stratford St Mary Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS) is now up and running.

If you are with a person who you suspect has had a cardiac arrest, immediately call 999 as normal. An ambulance will be dispatched as soon as possible, however due to the location of Stratford St Mary, this may take a while.

You will probably be alone with the patient and cannot leave them to go and get the village defibrillator, so we have a group of 10 volunteers who will respond to a telephone call from you. All the volunteers are on the same number and if a volunteer is available you give them your location, they will collect the defibrillator and come to your location, they will then assist in CPR and using the defibrillator until the ambulance or medics arrive.



Update from Constable Country Patient Participation Group March 2020

First Aid awareness session for parents and carers

We will be running a First Aid awareness session on March 18th at 7.30 pm in Capel Methodist Church (IP9 2EF). This is aimed at parents and carers of babies and children up to age 11. The session will be two hours and we had excellent feedback when we ran one at East Bergholt primary school at the end of last year. There is no charge for this session. We will also be asking if people would like to sign up for a First Aid course, which would result in a First Aider qualification.

New appointment system

We are aware of the difficulties some people are experiencing with the call back system and continue to discuss these with the practice manager and GPs. The Constable Country practice website (www.constablecountrymedicalpractice.c o.uk) lists a number of alternatives for patients to get in touch, including the e-consult service. The Benefice House Group

(This is an ultra-short summary of the eightweek House Group course on Peter)

Peter: learning to be like Jesus

Peter faced a very steep learning curve from being found by Jesus to becoming the person to establish the Christian Church throughout the world. His learning included having to: Obey; Pray; Trust; Believe; Follow; Serve; Love; Persevere; Witness; Change and ... never stop Learning.

He was a simple, Jewish fisherman and, with his brother Andrew was the first to be called to be a disciple of Jesus. In the lists of the named disciples cited three times in the Gospels, Simon (or Simon Peter) is always mentioned first.

When Jesus and Simon (Peter) first met, Jesus told him he would be thenceforth be called Cephas (Aramaic for 'rock'), or Peter (Greek for 'rock') (1). Eventually, Jesus not only changed his name but his self-image, his prejudices, his expectations and his priorities. However, Peter only fully understood these changes well after Jesus's death and resurrection, and probably only when filled with the Holy Spirit (2). Peter illustrates God's promise outlined in Paul's letter to the Philippians (chapter 1, verse 6): "God, who began a good work in you, will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus".

Peter was the leading spokesperson for and on behalf of all the disciples as he was the one always prepared to voice his, and others' thoughts (3,4,5). However, there is no evidence that in the early days of the disciples' work he had been given any particular authority do this. Peter was impulsive and often spoke or acted without thinking (6); he was confused, rash, fickle and weak and made promises that, under pressure, he did not keep (7); he challenged Jesus and frequently got into trouble (8,9);

said he understood but in reality didn't until filled with the Holy Spirit (2). In short, very much like us.

Importantly, Jesus never stopped loving and never gave up on Peter, restoring him as the future (the 'rock'), on which the Christ's Church would be built (10,11).

Peter's journey is that of a typical disciple. Discipleship is never static but dynamic, until our physical death. We can and never should stop learning. All disciples should continually be challenged; 'what more should - and can - I do?' Jesus' hopes and desires following our repentance and acceptance of him move from the general to the more specific. Our call to follow Jesus involves a deeper commitment, and, if necessary, a greater sacrifice; we should be thankful that in Suffolk, it is highly unlikely this sacrifice will end in death. Discipleship should be an attitude as well as a journey as we progressively follow and grow into Jesus. We, like Peter, are called to share and explain the Gospel with others. This does not necessarily mean shouting it from strret corners, but in any way that brings others to Jesus and the love of God

Although it may be tempting to use Peter as a 'role model' that would in some way explain or even excuse our own mistakes, this would be wrong, if only because we know how he behaved. However, we do need to learn from his mistakes and not reproduce them, because we will, inevitably and perhaps even today, say or do something wrong, and sin. Turning the situation around, we can also use the Jesus-Peter relationship as another valuable learning experience, namely that, when we are faced with a Peter-like figure, we should try and show them the grace, mercy, faith, trust and love that Jesus showed himand us.




