

Welcome



Dear friends.

It is with a sense of great thanksgiving that I can tell you that the roof on Stratford

St Mary church has finally been repaired with Terne coated steel, which we are assured has no re-sale value! We are very grateful to all who gave us donations and to all who have been so supportive in the two and a half years that it has taken to get this done. Especial thanks must go to Chris Cousins and his team who have kept us going with tarpaulins etc over that time, and to our Churchwardens for looking after the building so faithfully. I trust and hope that this new roof will keep the church watertight for many more years to come.

In the month of May the Church celebrates various great festivals. The first is Rogation Sunday (6 May), during which we ask God (rogare means to ask) for a blessing on all those who work on the land and produce food for our benefit. Rogation-tide leads up to Ascension Day on 10 May, which is when the Church celebrates Jesus going back to be with his Father after spending some time with his friends and disciples after his rising from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Then on 20 May we celebrate the Feast of the Pentecost, the 'pente' bit referring to the fact that it comes 50 days after Easter. It is often thought of as being the birthday of the Christian Church, for it was the day on which the Holy Spirit came in the form of flames of fire and a rushing wind to the disciples who had witnessed Jesus going back to his Father God.

Jesus had promised that they wouldn't be left completely alone after he had gone, and the Holy Spirit was his replacement. Jesus' existence was limited in time and space, whereas the Holy Spirit can be with anyone anywhere at any time.

The last big festival in May is Trinity Sunday on 27 May. It's a time for us to think about the three different 'faces' or 'essences' of God - Father, Son (Jesus) and Holy Spirit. They are all one God, but they appear to us in different forms and we pray to or through them in different ways. To some of us God the Father might seem like too awe-inspiring a character, so we might feel more comfortable praying to his Son, or we might pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us because the Spirit is the way that we can see both God and Jesus working in us at every moment of our daily lives.

Stratford St Mary Institute Committee

Community First Responders

CFR's are trained volunteers who are dispatched by the ambulance service to life threatening emergencies in local communities. The volunteers normally work within a radius of 8 minutes drive from their location but depending on circumstances this could be further. They can normally get to a casualty before an ambulance can get there, assess the patient and start possible life saving treatment immediately. If the situation changes the CFR can update Ambulance Control to give them an updated assessment of the patient.

The Stratford St Mary area is covered by a CFR bag supplied by Stratford St Mary Parish Council. This bag is presently used by 2 volunteers in Stratford St Mary and one in Langham. The area is also covered by other volunteers with different bags from Dedham, East Bergholt, Manningtree, Brantham and Bradfield.

A volunteer can be on call whenever they want, if you are logged off duty, you do not get called.

At the moment the Stratford St Mary bag is not utilised as much as it could be and I would like to improve this. Ideally I would like some volunteers in Stratford St Mary to complete the training and then become CFR for Stratford St Mary and the surrounding villages. The more hours we have the bag active the better cover we have for ourselves.

VillageLife Annual Report 2017/2018

VillageLife (VL) is a volunteer organization in Stratford St Mary, formed some five years VL's purpose is to provide ago. opportunities for community/ social interaction for all who live, work or play, in and around the village. The only financial objective is that, as far as may be possible, events should be managed so as to fund themselves at the lowest possible cost to individual participants, with the intention that no one who wants to attend will be prevented from doing so by the cost. In this context, anything that has the potential to enhance community life in the village is considered to be within VL's remit.

Over the past five years, VL has been responsible for staging: 4 Summer Fairs and the Village Open Day (2017), the annual Quintuple (pub-games) Challenge at the Swan; the 'Christmas Light-up' and various social events including traditional country dancing evenings and periodic 'Stories by the Fire' evenings;

Overall, 2017 was another successful year. Starting with a Race Night in April, a social event with an overtly fundraising objective, which was held in part to provide funds to underpin future events, but particularly to support the Stratford St Mary First Responders with their plans for community defibrillator training.

In conjunction with the Church Fabric Committee, VL undertook the organization of a Village Open Day instead of a themed fair, as its summer event for 2017. From all the reports received, the various activities in Stratford St Mary on 24th June seem to have generated an ambiance in the village that was warm and welcoming. For VL and I am sure for many others, that in itself was success. The financial outcome however, was also pleasing, with £1000 being raised for the Church Fabric Fund and a small surplus retained by VL to support future community activity, including the on-going restoration and maintenance of the Millennium Garden.

Activity in the second half of 2017 included the Quintuple Challenge in September and the Christmas Light-up in December, both of which were also successful events and in the organization of which VL received both support and encouragement from Mark, Jane and their team at The Swan. We also gratefully acknowledge the invaluable financial contribution from the Parish Council to help stage Summer Fairs during our formative years and to the ongoing maintenance of the Millennium Garden.

Regrettably, we have to report that at the present time the future looks less than certain. VillageLife was always a small team (with big ideas) but during recent months various members have experienced a succession of health related issues that have prevented the planning and preparation that should have been ongoing, if we were to provide a full programme of social events for 2018.

It is therefore with much sadness that we confirm that we are not able to organize a Summer event this year. We are however intent on returning to the public arena in September with the Quintuple (pub games) Challenge and in December for the Christmas Light-up.

We intend to hold an open meeting in the near future to consider future plans and hopefully recruit the assistance and support of other like minded residents, in the planning and implementation of future community activities in Stratford St Mary.

There is however, no need to wait until that meeting.



Weather Lore

When the wind is in the North East it is neither good for man nor beast.

We have all now experienced the Beast from the East. March 1st and 2nd were the coldest days of the winter, with maximum temperatures -1.9C of and respectively. Officially the start of March is the beginning of the meteorological spring. It also proves another saying that as the days get longer, the cold gets stronger. If March comes in like a Lion, it goes out like a Lamb which is true this year. March mists, May frosts, not what fruit growers wish to have. April showers bring forth May flowers. The Merry month of May is justly celebrated on May 1st heralding the freshness of new life

June seldom lives up to its reputation as flaming. June despite the summer solstice on June 21st when the sun at midday is 61.5% above the horizon at latitude 52 degrees north, high summer is usually considered as the period last week in July and the first week in August when the highest temperatures are likely to occur. We come to Swithin's Day on July 15th. If it rains on this day, the next 40 days are supposed to be wet. It is more likely to be true if the preceding and ensuing day is also wet. Conversely, if it happens to be dry at this time, a barbecue summer could be on the cards. The weather at this time of the year often has established a pattern. The wind blows from a westerly direction from the end of June to the start of September more than any other time of the year.

Rain before seven, finishes before eleven is often true in the summer and the start of many cricket matches depend on this. It never rains but it pours is true for late summer and early autumn when the air is warm and holds more moisture.

Cows lying down on a meadow can indicate coming rain as they sense an increase in humidity and by doing so, reduce the surface area of their bodies exposed to the elements. A proliferation of berries late summer and early autumn is no indication of a severe winter ahead, the berries result from previous favourable weather conditions nor does ice fit to bear a duck in November indicate harsh conditions ahead.

Red sky at night, Shepherds delight, Red sky at dawn shepherds warning. Both these sayings which have a biblical origin have a certain amount of truth. In fine still conditions, dust particles in the air can cause the sun's rays to give a red appearance at dusk and moist humid conditions in the atmosphere can give a similar effect at dawn, high level cirrus clouds being the forerunner of deteriorating conditions.

Some of these sayings have come about from Shakespeare's time and are relevant where we live in northern Europe.

However, with the discovery of the Jet Stream during the last war, satellite photographs and sophisticated modern computers, the weather can now be forecast for up to a week ahead and slightly less reliably for a fortnight ahead.



The River Stour Trust is looking for volunteers to join its team of skippers and crew operating its fleet of electric launches on the River Stour in Suffolk, made famous in John Constable's paintings. Full training and familiarisation with the river will be provided, but the 21ft launches are simplicity itself to drive, with smooth, quiet electric motors, and maximum speeds of 4mph. And if you don't fancy getting afloat, we also need people ashore to handle the bookings, meet the visitors, cutting the grass and general maintenance.

They run most weekends and some midweek days from April to October and raise funds vital to the work of the Trust in restoring and maintaining the navigation for all to enjoy. Over the past 50 years it has restored or rebuilt four of the 25 mile waterway's 13 locks, two slipways, and a Visitor Centre.

Visitors from all over the country and world, as well local residents, enjoy observing the wildlife and tranquillity of the river on our boats Trusty II and Kathleen who operate between Stratford St Mary, Flatford, Dedham and Brantham with Rosette, Francis J, Edwardian Lady and the John Constable Lighter operating between Sudbury, Great Cornard and Great Henny.

The river is peaceful, with just swans and occasional rowing boats to negotiate, and you will find yourself drifting back 200 years to the days when it was a busy

commercial waterway, with 50ft lighters towed in pairs by horses through 13 locks from the sea at Manningtree to Sudbury.

New telephone number for nonemergency patient transport bookings

The telephone number to make a booking for the Non-Emergency Patient Transport Service (NEPTS) in Suffolk and the Great Yarmouth and Waveney area is changing from April 1.

NEPTS services are used by patients whose physical or mental health conditions mean they are unable to travel from their home to planned NHS appointments at a hospital or clinic without staff to support them.

From April 1 the number to call to make a booking will be **0300 999 6666**.

The criteria to use this service is set nationally, so that each time a person calls they are asked a set of questions to establish their eligibility. Anyone who does not qualify will be signposted towards community or public transport options.

Dr Zohra Armitage a GP in Bury St Edmunds and NEPTS lead for NHS West Suffolk Clinical Commissioning Group, said: "I would encourage people to take a note of the new number for NEPTS.

"NEPTS has an important role in the community and helps those people who need specialist support to access their planned healthcare appointments."
