As I write this, we celebrated Easter just a few days ago and we are still enjoying this warm and sunny spring weather. The daffodils are beginning to fade but lots of other flowers have appeared in the garden and the first tender shoots of the vegetables I sowed a few weeks ago have suddenly appeared. Every year I enjoy all these signs of new life in the garden and on my dog walks. Holy Week and Easter was a busy time in our benefice as it is in most churches. We had services every day, and on Good Friday, after missing out for the past two years, we were able to have the traditional Good Friday walk which is always expertly planned by Geoff. Between 30 – 40 pilgrims took part in the different stages of the walk and we finished with a reflective service in Higham Church. Grateful thanks go to Martin and Trudi, our musicians, and to all our singers for their wonderful contributions which made for a beautiful end to the day. I received many kind messages and emails afterwards from people saying how much they had enjoyed the service and how helpful it had been to have time to sit and reflect. On Saturday we gathered round the traditional bonfire in Raydon churchyard (again, thank you, Geoff!) for the vigil during which the Paschal candles of all four churches were lit. We then processed into Church where the candles remained burning during our readings and prayers.

Easter Day was pure joy with good congregations in Raydon and Stratford, and we welcomed Henry, who was baptised in our Easter Praise service in Stratford, into the Church family. The cakes and refreshments afterwards were wonderful, too!

In the Church liturgy we are still in the Easter Season when we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ, but we now look ahead to Ascension Day when we celebrate Jesus' ascension into heaven. This year we will be gathering for the Deanery Ascension Day service on Thursday ,26th May at 10.30am in Higham. Come and meet members from around the Deanery over coffee and cake afterwards.

Plans for Pentecost and the Jubilee weekend (2nd – 5th June) are taking shape in all four villages and details will be shared in the next issue of the Quartet as well as online. Many events are being planned and we hope that everyone in our villages will want to join in to celebrate 70 years of service of our remarkable monarch. We pray for HM the Queen in this her Jubilee year. Our APCMs will be taking place as follows: 27th April Stratford St. Mary, 11th May Raydon, 12th May Higham and 25th May Holton St. Mary, all beginning at 7pm. Let me or one of the churchwardens know if you would like to get involved in the life of our churches. We look forward to seeing you. May the joy of Easter be yours!

Periodic Report - May 2021/ April 2022

The Trust has experienced a challenging two years since the start of the Covid 19 pandemic. Trust property has required significant maintenance investment, which Covid restrictions have made difficult to undertake, and more is scheduled for the coming year.

Notwithstanding these demands on its resources, the Trust retains the capability and the commitment to provide modest grants to help parish residents who might find themselves in temporary need of financial assistance.

Grants can be considered to assist residents who are in temporary "need, hardship or distress or who need funding to assist with access to education*, retraining or redeployment.

Although trying to make themselves aware of situations in which Trust intervention might be appropriate, Trustees recognise that there will inevitably be instances of which they have no knowledge. For this reason, we ask that anyone living, working or playing in our Parish who becomes aware of someone within the Stratford St Mary community who might warrant assistance from the trust, pass the relevant information to the trustees, for consideration.

The trust has a direct e-mail address, trust@stratford-st-mary.org, which can be used for this purpose or for general communication.

All information passed to the trust or to individual trustees will be treated in strictest confidence.

Firstly I would like to say THANK YOU ALL who joined in with the Walk of Witness on Friday 15th April (Good Friday).

It was a fantastic day of warm sunshine, with just a hint of refreshing wind so the walking was comfortable. Hot cross buns and coffee served first at Raydon (thank you) followed by a short service in Church, then we headed towards Holton St Mary Church (3.6 miles across the fields) for second part of the short (Passion of Christ) story which gave use a well-earned rest before setting off again. On route we saw buzzard, skylark, heard white throat, vellow hammer and saw a blackcap and 1 lonely hare. We timed it just right to see the massed bluebells in full bloom and the perfume was very noticeable. In amongst them the first shirt buttons and red champion just showing colour. The male nightingale arrived last week and we heard only its first start of song, by next week it should be in full song. On way to Stratford we saw newborn lambs as we also had great views especially from the top of Stratford Hills looking over the Stour valley and in the distance we could see Stoke by Nayland Church. Somebody asked if that's where we are heading, but I replied thankfully not !!! At Stratford Church the third part of the story was told, followed by a brisk walk down the street to the Parish Room for another well-earned stop for facilities and sitting outside for our picnic lunch with cold and hot drinks supplied by Christine and helpers, Thank you.. We then headed off for the last leg to Higham Church (about ³/₄ hour) seeing on route more buzzards and a couple of Red Kite amongst other nature. The overall walk was 7.3 miles, slightly less this year than in previous years, and only two stiles to negotiate instead of five..

Rev'd. Nicola Tindal was at the last minute unable to join us which was a great shame, but Rev'd Manette was on hand to lead the service in both Raydon and Holton Churches. To all the Churchwardens and Elders thank you for encouraging so many to take part in a fun walk on the wild side, but at each Church take onboard the more serious reason for the Good Friday.

I hope you all enjoyed it as much as I did. THANK YOU ALL for your support.

Raydon and District Garden Club

So the first quarter of 2022 has passed already and we are now well into springtime. Hope you are all enjoying the wonderful sights and sounds of this magical time. The word NEW sums up this time of year as everything renews afresh and grows in abundance, flowers, and the perfumes return as you walk around also watch out for the first young birds as they fledge out into the wider world. Has anybody heard the cuckoo yet? and nightingale? My first nightingale heard singing (not seen) during a walk of 2 hours in Easter week along with these others singing, skylark, blackcap, whitethroat & vellowhammer. At the same time two pairs of buzzards & one pair of red kite flving overhead, along with several butterflies, brimstone (M&F) orange tip (M&F) peacock, green veined white and also a speckled wood.

Back in the garden this winter, we had a considerable number of frosts but nothing too severe but, we also had several misty mornings which reminds me of the old saying "Mists in March, Frosts in May" so watch out and get ready to cover up tender plants especially new potatoes. May is such a great time as the weather warms up, with increased daylight to be able to get outside especially for those who are working to get out in the garden or perhaps have a wander out in the countryside and just take in all around you and enjoy.

What a most interesting subject at our March meeting with Dr Ian Bedford from Norwich area on his Garden Bugs: Cohabit, Control or Conserve ? that was the question. I wonder



which way we all treat this problem? but it was a well attended meeting and most informative.

April 9th was a bit of a milestone for the garden club as it was the first flower show since 2019, in a new venue and it was a very eniovable time. Entry numbers slightly down on previous times due mostly by members suffering with covid (we wish them all a speedy recovery) but this meant we lost between 20 & 30 entries. However considering we also suffered a week before show day high winds, frost, rain & at times hail. the condition of show entries was very good. It was so nice to be able to greet our judges once again and they were all so pleased to come and glad that this garden club has survived. They were able to exercise their skills once again and pick out the winners in each class. I was informed of a rather sad note that over a quarter of garden clubs in Suffolk & Essex have since the pandemic started in 2020 closed down for good.

The day went to plan and our new President Mrs Diana Hunt presided over the prize giving to present all cups, trophies and cash prizes to all the worthy winners and congratulating them all on their splendid efforts. The committee wishes to thank both our President and all who entered the show which helped to make it a great day plus also all who attended in the afternoon. Chernobyl Children's Lifeline and Charity Shop

Although we carry out our work guietly, discreetly and without seeking publicity I would like to update you with some of the things we have been doing in Ukraine with the generous support of those who have donated to our appeal and which we have been doing since the first day of the conflict. We have teams of people who we co-ordinate with "on the ground" in Poland to whom we are able to send money to source and buy many of the urgently needed items and then pass them across the border to our people in Ukraine. Many of the things needed so badly are far cheaper if bought in Poland and the right thing can be bought as and when needed. We are using the money helping our teams relocate people to safety, providing urgent medicines, food & water, care products for children on palliative care. We have setup 2 aid delivery co-ordination points, one on the Polish Border the other the Slovakian Border. Recently we received a desperate request for help to provide specific care items and food for 36 families with severely disabled children stuck out in the villages. They were in desperate need of a mobile ambulance to help move these children, many of whom are immobile. We also managed to provide transportation for a child of 2.5 years who had his legs blown off by an explosion, to a specialist hospital in Germany who have offered to help him. I cannot include the photographs of this child as, with many other photographs we have, it would be too distressing for many to view. Several agencies had said they were going to collect the boy and his father but just did not turn up, this is where we were able to step in and help. We are able to help many people who appear to fall through the net of bigger organisation.

Now we are expanding our operation of evacuating children and young people with specific medical needs, first to Poland where they will be assessed and then arranging onwards transportation to one of the special clinics across Europe that we are liasing with.

I wish I could be bringing happier, more positive news but at the moment, this is the reality of the situation. We can only hope that a resolution is found sooner rather than later and that we can help the people of Ukraine to rebuild their homes and their lives.

Clinicians thank people for using appropriate services as pressures intensify

Health leaders across Suffolk and north east Essex say local services are under intense pressure, more significant than at any time during the COVID-19 pandemic. Clinicians are thanking the public for heeding earlier advice about using services wisely because, they say, it means those in urgent need are prioritised. They point to seasonal pressures and rising number of COVID-19 cases in the community which translates into high numbers of staff who are off work with COVID.
