

Dear friends,

I would like to say a big thank you to all who have expressed

their support at this difficult time in our local churches' history. I have had to rearrange my life quite a bit to take on my new duties as Acting Rural Dean, but I am glad to say that I have wonderful colleagues across Deanery, and not least the Ministry Team in our own Benefice. So please forgive me if I am not able to do everything I would wish to in our own parishes because of having to minister across a wider area. I hope you know that I am still there for you all in any time of need - do just give me a call or email me.

As we head into the month of November, we are once again getting close to Advent - the period of 4 weeks before Christmas when we think about waiting for the birth of Jesus. It's a time when that birth should make us look at our own lives and how we could improve them in the light of his teachings about love, healing and justice for all.

This year we are all beginning to feel the bite of the Brexit vote - my 500 litres of oil have cost me nearly £100 more than they did last time, and a recent pilgrimage to Belgium brought me up

short when I only got 1 Euro to the pound. We are told that the price of food and many other commodities will start to rise inexorably. Most of us are still able to lead the lives we have become used to, but I wonder if those who voted to leave the EU thought about how their vote would radically affect the needlest in our society, besides leaving vital services like the NHS depleted of core workers.

There is a movement that began in America some years ago called WWJD - What Would Jesus Do? That's what we need to be thinking about at this time of year, as the lives of our poorest neighbours become more stressful. Jesus would look around at the weakest in the world and encourage us all to offer our help whenever we can.

And if you are one of those who are finding it increasingly hard to make ends meet, please don't be too proud to ask for help. We are here to support you in any way we can.

Closure of Public Telephone Kiosks

BT has advised us of its intention to disconnect the telephone lines in many public phone boxes in South Suffolk owing to a lack of use by the public. We have two kiosks in Stratford St Mary, one in Upper St and the other in the Ipswich- bound lay-by on the A12 just outside the village.

Do residents have any opinion on whether we should ask BT to keep the telephone lines operational for possible future use in the event of an emergency given the indifferent mobile phone coverage experienced in the past throughout the Dedham Vale or should we simply agree to having the phone lines disconnected? Would anyone like to see the phone boxes taken over by the community for alternative use or simply have them removed completely?



SPEEDING - HELP TO MAKE RAYDON SAFER

It is a matter of extreme concern to your Parish Council that speeding traffic in the village is becoming more prevalent by the day - and statistics show an alarming picture.

Your Parish Council is determined to try to alleviate this problem and is considering a number of speed detection devices suitable for our road conditions and effective as deterrents.

Research has involved a lengthy consultation with neighbouring parishes who have already acquired such equipment and operated it for some time. We can report that the most effective means of curbing speeding, based on our consultation, appears to be Community Speedwatch. Some parishes say that the results have been conclusive - speeding has been noticeably reduced.

However, this would require volunteers to operate the equipment. Please contact me if you would be prepared to participate, should the PC decide to go ahead with this initiative – full training would be given.

Hooting!

I am writing this short article to ask if anyone in any of the surrounding Villages is having the same experience as Holton St Mary.
