

# Welcome



Dear friends.

I am writing this in the wake of Hurricane Ophelia, which on 16 and 17

October struck the Pembrokeshire coast, amongst other places. It's an area I know very well, as I have been going there on holiday since I was 14, to stay in a tiny little cottage up on an isolated mountainside. It was very odd to think of the beautiful beach below the cottage being lashed by huge waves, and the winds - which always blow pretty strongly around the cottage - wreaking havoc around that whole area. I haven't heard of casualties there, but please do pray for all who have been affected, both there and elsewhere across this island, as well as more profoundly on the island of Ireland.

The effect here in Suffolk, apart from slightly higher winds than normal, was visible in the extraordinary yellowish-brown colour that the day took on, followed by a dazzlingly brilliant red sunset - all apparently caused by sand from the Sahara and smoke from the fires in Portugal being taken up in the winds. This earth and its weather and atmosphere are at times very strange things - who could have dreamed them up?!

We are sorry that we had to cancel the Suffolk MIND course on 7 October owing to the illness of the speaker, but here is advance warning that it will take place on 27 January instead; more news about that nearer the time.

We had a wonderful morning with Magdalen Houlihan on Silent Prayer in SSM on 10 October, and following on from that we are going to resurrect our own Silent Prayer Group, starting on 6 November at 11.30 a.m. at the Rectory. It's a time to be silent before God before sharing some time together talking about what is important in our lives at present. If enough people are interested, we could also have a light lunch together afterwards. If you plan to come, it would be good to know, so please be in touch.

Here is another reminder that on 10 November at 7.30 p.m. in Holton church we shall be doing a reading of St Luke's Gospel in the King James Version. As you sip a glass of wine (or something else!), readers from around our parishes will take turns in reading the beautiful stories that we all know and love from that Gospel. Please bring a cushion for your own comfort!

Please don't forget to read the pull-out pages in the centre of this edition so that you will know all about the events and services coming up over the Advent and Christmas season.



RAYDON PARISH PLAN SURVEY 2017 - RESULTS OF THE QUESTIONNAIRE

The Parish Council received 62 completed questionnaires – 140 residents were represented, which is 28% of the population. Typically a survey of this type gets a 10% return rate so we are particularly pleased with this response.

It is worth noting that approximately 15% of children under 16 were represented; 19% of working age adults were represented; 63% of people aged 60+ were represented. It was very pleasing to note that nine children aged 11- 18 completed the questionnaire.

The survey results include a lot of valuable information and opinions on transport, housing, facilities and the environment around Raydon. The Parish Council will be able to use this to guide our decisions on future activity.

Thank you to all those parishioners who completed the questionnaire.

The full results can be found on the website: www.raydonpc.org – and are also displayed on the noticeboards (next to the church, and on Sulley's Hill).

I would like to thank everybody who gave donations at Cliff's funeral. The total amount donated was £1,060 - a cheque for £582.50 will be sent to St. Elizabeth Hospice and a cheque for £477.50 will go to the Boxford & Hadleigh Health Centre. I am so pleased with the amount, also thank you for all the cards and letters you sent, they are greatly appreciated.
