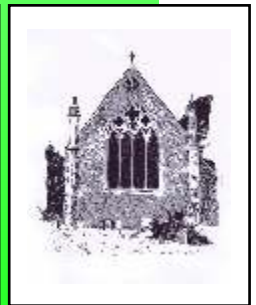

# Welcome



Dear friends,

The late Henri Nouwen's writings on the spiritual life have been an inspiration to

thousands all over the world, and continue to influence by means of a daily email sent out by his estate. As we come to this period of remembrance, with All Saints on 1 November and All Souls on 2nd, I was particularly struck by the following message:

'When we have been deeply hurt by another person, it is nearly impossible not to have hostile thoughts, feelings of anger or hatred, and even a desire to take revenge. All of this often happens spontaneously, without much inner control. We simply find ourselves brooding about what we are going to say or do to pay back the person who has hurt us. To choose blessings instead of curses in such a situation asks for an enormous leap of faith. It calls for a willingness to go beyond all our urges to get even and to choose a life-giving response. Sometimes this seems impossible. Still, whenever we move beyond our wounded selves and claim our God-given selves, we give life not just to ourselves but also to the ones who have offended us.'

This is a clear echo of a passage from the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy, where God says, 'I call heaven and earth to witness against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live.' Quite often in our lives molehill feelings of resentment

are allowed to grow into giant mountains. This kind of holding on to resentments is an example of choosing death and curses. Choosing life and blessings would be to feel and say sorry and then move on into a different kind of future that doesn't continue to bear that terrible heavy weight of past hurts.

As we prepare across our Benefice for commemorations of the end of the Great War on 11 November 1918, we are all called to think about what causes violence of thoughts, words and actions in our own lives. Instead of taking out our grievances on others, how can we be the cause of bringing life into their lives and ours? How can we find a way of saying that things don't need to be like this, there is a way to find a middle ground, and that way is by seeking forgiveness from each other and from God? Let's use this season to remember in a positive way, to find the good in each other rather than the bad, and to extend the hand of friendship when people have the courage to say sorry.

As I leave you at the end of this month, I seek your forgiveness for anything that I haven't been able to do in our Benefice over the last 9 years - it's a tough ask to be all things to all people all of the time! The one message above all that I would like to leave with you is the Great Commandment that Jesus left for us - 'Love one another as I have loved you'. It is only love for one another that will ensure that our parishes continue to thrive in a future that is God-, rather than self-, directed.

May God bless you all.

Stratford St Mary Primary School continues to take part in the Junior Road Safety scheme. The JRSOs have recruited two new members and have taken part in a competition to STOP IDLING to protect our health and planet. The JRSOs will be asking parents to stop idling outside our school during drop off and pick up times. The JRSOs would also like to ask the community to think about stopping idling too.

Concerns are because an idling vehicle:

- **Contributes to air pollution**
- **Emits air toxins**
- **Elevates air toxins during school pick up times when many vehicles may be idling**
- **Increases risk of developing asthma and respiratory problems especially to children**

Some of the facts that people may not be aware of are:

- **10 seconds of idling uses more fuel than restarting**
- **2 minutes spent idling is equal to 1 mile of driving**
- **An idling engine can produce up to twice the emissions of a car that's in motion**
- **"Stationary idling is an offence under section 42 of the Road Traffic Act 1988," Doing this can incur a £20 fixed-penalty fine under the Road Traffic (Vehicle Emissions) Regulations 2002.**

## INSECTS THIS SUMMER & AUTUMN

The autumn is the time when spiders emerge from their holes and are most in evident. There are 8 varieties of spiders that you may come across in your house from the large House spider, the Cardinal spider and the very small Money spider to name but a few. Let's be clear that in the UK, out of all the 650 species, there are none that are venomous so there is no need to be frightened. Some may give you a bite but that's all. They are more scared of you. A rather unusual feature is that they all have eight legs. Their intricate webs catch insects such as flies, mainly the responsibility of the larger female. When you see a spider running about, it is more likely a male looking for a female to mate.

There has been a small invasion of Harlequin ladybirds into sheds and outhouses this autumn, attributed to the hot summer. This ladybird is a migrant from the continent and a bit bigger than our 7 spotted variety and identified by prominent black spots. Ladybirds feed on aphids and do good in this respect.

I have had no ant excavations on my patio this summer and no flying ants took off at the end of July and start of August, probably succumbing to the extreme heat in July. I have neither seen any Daddy long legs (Craneflies) this autumn; they also have probably succumbed.

It has been a bonanza summer for the Cabbage White butterfly. At least 90% of all butterflies seen in my garden from late April to mid September were these. Strictly speaking, this butterfly consists of 2 varieties, the Large White and the Small White. The Small White was the most prominent variety. The larger females lay their eggs with preference for Brassicas and Nasturtiums which the caterpillars, when they emerge, readily devour and can

decimate these plants. Can anything be done? It is suggested that planting African Marigolds and Tagetes amongst them discourages the butterflies; this is known as so called companion gardening but the snag is that slugs and snails like these plants. Difficult to win!

Regrettably, some of the more colourful butterflies have only made rare appearances namely the Peacock and the Small tortoiseshell. The worrying thing is that they lay their eggs on nettles which dried up in the heat. On the other hand, the Small Holly blue butterflies were about in good numbers during April. They lay their eggs on Holly. The second brood was also about during August, this time their eggs are laid on ivy flowers. So not all bad news.

Like the last of the Summer Wine, the Red Admiral is the most likely butterfly you will see during October and sometimes early November. Some perish, others hibernate but don't usually survive the spring when they emerge.

Please realise these observations have been in my garden but hopefully representative of the area as a whole.

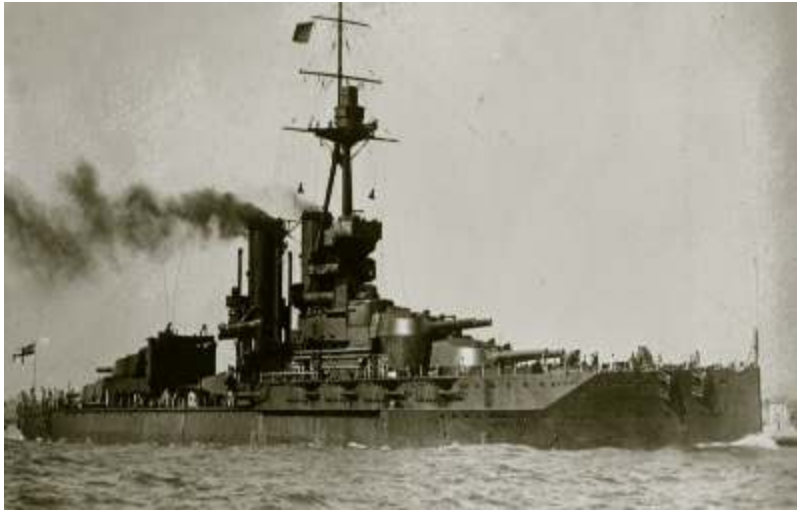

## Is It Me?

I have just started looking into primary schools for my daughter, who will be starting school in September 2019, it's a bit of a minefield!

In addition to everything else I need to consider, Suffolk County Council has changed its transport policy. Starting from next year they will only provide transport to your nearest primary school if it is over 2 miles away.

For residents of Raydon this means that if you live one end of the village they should provide transport to Hadleigh Community Primary School. For the other end of the village this means they should provide transport to East Bergholt Primary, and if both are full they should provide transport to Capel St Mary. (They have helpfully provided a postcode search function so you can check which three primary schools are closest to you...)

They will only be providing transport to our catchment primary school of Stratford St Mary for existing pupils as it is not our closest primary school.

Does that bother anyone else as well as me?

Raydon children have traditionally gone to Stratford St Mary, since our own school closed down. I appreciate Suffolk County Council needs to save money and as most schools are now academies they can set their own catchment areas, but bizarrely SCC could well end up supplying three school buses to Raydon rather than just one?

I'm sure all the schools I've mentioned here are lovely, but by splitting the primary school children up in Raydon it stops them developing local friendships and a sense of community spirit.

If you are in the same predicament and like me need to decide on a primary school before the 15th January deadline, it would be great to hear from you, my email address is [pyall.family@gmail.com](mailto:pyall.family@gmail.com).

## Headway Suffolk

has launched ambitious and exciting plans to build a new rehabilitation hub and housing for clients in Ipswich – with the centre to be named after renowned physicist Professor Stephen Hawking.

The Stephen Hawking Neuro Centre will be built on the edge of Ipswich, on Ravenswood Estate, and will include facilities for rehabilitation and support for clients with brain injuries and other neurological conditions.

It will replace the current hub at Epsilon House on Ransomes Europark, which will be sold to support the new project.

The new centre will also include 24 homes where Headway Suffolk clients will have the opportunity to live as independently as they are able to. Helen Fairweather, Chief Executive of Headway Suffolk, explained its essential need: "Life after brain injury is difficult for the person and their family. The change of personality and loss of function means many partnerships end. "It is usually Headway clients who have to move out of the family home and become homeless, or end up in inappropriate provision, such as mental health or older people's services. This leads to depression and prevents rehab. Headway has, for some time, been looking at how to solve this problem, and now we have a very exciting solution."

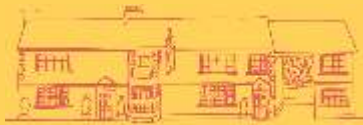

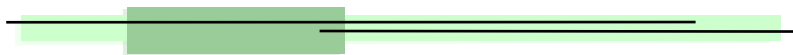


