Following a recent chat with Rev'd Manette about my involvement in various refugee support initiatives, she asked me if I would write a piece for the Quartet.

The generous response of local people towards those fleeing the war in Ukraine, has been immensely heartwarming. Hopefully, this response will have helped to bring about a better understanding of the similar situation faced by people fleeing conflicts in other parts of the world, such as Afghanistan, Svria and South Sudan, The Refugee Council website (refugeecouncil.org.uk) useful has information about people seeking asylum in the UK under the 1951 UN Refugee Convention. 72% of refugees live in countries neighbouring their country of origin; the UK is home to only 1% of the 27.1 million refugees who were forcibly displaced across the world as at the end of 2021. Those who come to the UK mainly do so either under UK Gov. refugee schemes, or because they have family in the UK, or because they speak English. There is nothing in international law to say that refugees must claim asylum in the first country they reach.

In our area there are a organisations seeking to help to resettle refugees from Afghanistan. Those people who were airlifted from Kabul had been involved with the UK military in Afghanistan. Others made their way to France and now have no option but to attempt to cross the Channel. There are no "safe routes" for Afghan refugees. A refugee support group made

up of parishioners from several Catholic parishes in the Colchester area. sponsored by Caritas Brentwood (caritasbrentwood.org), has been able to provide a house for one of the Afghan families. Other Afghan families have been helped by Essex Integration (dnanetworks.org), а church-based initiative in Colchester providing free advice, support and practical help to refugees, asylum seekers and migrant workers throughout Essex. RAMA (Refugee Asylum Seeker and Migrant Action) (rama.org.uk), a voluntary organisation based in Colchester, offers assistance to individuals and families in need, supporting newcomers who are navigating the challenges of resettlement, and including providing English language lessons. Finally, Calais Light UK (www.calaislight.com) is a volunteer organisation which provides practical support to refugees based in Essex bridging hotels. They are seeking volunteers to help the refugees to settle into life in the UK. All of these groups would be very grateful for any support. As the Refugee Council's website makes clear, refugees make a huge contribution to the UK: for example, there are about 1,200 medically qualified refugees on the British Medical Association's database. Refugees are not a burden but an opportunity for us to welcome those fleeing persecution and conflict abroad, and to help them to make a positive contribution to this country.

Please find below some bullet points of information from the meeting:

Michael Pearce was co-opted and welcomed as a Councillor onto the Parish Council – we still have 1 vacancy left, please contact the Parish Clerk for more information.

- Lack of maintenance by both Babergh and Suffolk County Council was discussed, and the Parish Council have sent letters out with their concerns.
- The Parish Council have signed a new lease for The River Garden.
- Noticeboards it was agreed that the noticeboards in the village need some maintenance work, and this will be arranged.
- Proposal to put a bollard in front of the gate at The River Garden to stop cars from driving on and to move the noticeboard sideways to make it more accessible.
- Councillors all in agreement to arrange regular scheduled walks around the village to look at the condition of assets, potential problems, and opportunities.
- The Parish Council are looking into purchasing a new speed sign for the village with a solar panel to prolong the battery.
- · Purchase of maintenance equipment is being looked at to assist with village maintenance.
- The date for the Annual Parish Meeting was agreed this will be held on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April 2024.

# Raydon and District Garden Club

Mid-way through another month (Oct) as I write these notes and we are looking at November already. Each year seems to go guicker than ever, which reminded me of a poem from many years ago, I will print next month. Autumn comes quickly and must remember it's time for muddy boots complete with attached fallen leaves to be removed before heading indoors for a coffee or tea etc. Hope you members have all enjoyed another great gardening year so far. Just think back to last year and we had all been worn out by the constant carrying of water cans just to keep things alive, whereas this year except for a few weeks we have received enough water thankfully to keep everything growing and fresh. As the summer flowers fade so Autumn colours take over and what a fantastic sight to behold and enjoy before the colder, duller days of winter set in. Don't be in a rush to tidy up the odd wilder parts of the garden as nature (Insects. mice, volves, ladybirds and other creepy crawlies) need places to sleep over. Just think if you went to bed but found somebody had removed the duvet!!! we would not be happy, We all need nature and nature needs us, so be considerate and leave the odd places for them. The wild birds that visit the gardens are feeding up for the long cold nights ahead and of course it's time to start wrapping up tender plants (if not already done). November is the time to plant tulip bulbs ready for next Spring display. It's also time to plant trees. shrubs, or move plants around to a new spot in your garden if needed. Now is the time to remove all the dead rhubarb leaves and any straw covering from last winter to leave the crowns exposed till after Christmas, making sure the soil is sloping away from the crowns to take excessive water away to avoid crown rot. November is of course the start of the new gardening year as far as preparation is concerned,

with digging and the incorporation of good quality "farmyard muck" or compost to help enrich the soil ready for the next growing season. Don't forget the leaves when raked up, instead of throwing away or burning, put them in a plastic bag or better still make a leaf bin with wire surround and store them for use next Autumn as a garden mulch (and it's all free).

Our October meeting was a very interesting evening all about the "Bamboo" with our guest speaker Helen Chenn, giving out lots of advice on this possibly mis – understood plant. I for one did not realise there were so many different varieties, should have guessed I suppose. One has to be careful and check when buying that you get ones that do not spread too much, unless you have a very large garden, then it's not so critical so best to ask an expert like Helen (who grows about 100 different ones) for advice first.

On Thursday 23rd of November it's our members evening with wine, cold buffet, Any offers of food gratefully received, and please inform Wendy Mumford what you will bring (to avoid duplication), table top quizzes, and of course a short (half hour



max) A.G.M. Please come along and vote for your existing committee or perhaps you would like new replacements !! (a new Chairman perhaps) to take your club forward into 2024 which will be our 44th year. The evening will finish with a grand raffle as usual.




