

Road Closure in Dedham

Suffolk Highways plans to undertake maintenance to Dedham Mill Bridge on B1029 Dedham Road, Dedham. The work will involve the replacement of the existing bearings at the south end, resurfacing, installation of new movement joints and painting of the barriers.

The works are programmed to start on 5 October and will continue until 4 December 2020. Please note that during this time, it will be necessary for the road to be closed 24/7 to enable the works to be carried out safely. Temporary traffic signals will also be in place, as detailed below.

- 5 October to 11 October 2020 Temporary Traffic Signals
- 12 October to 29 November 2020 – 24/7 Road Closure

30 November to 4 December 2020 – Temporary Traffic Signals


The road will be closed from the junction of Church Road, Stratford, to Dedham Mill Bridge. Pedestrian & cyclist access will not be available during the road closure.

For the duration of the road closure, traffic will be diverted via

Clockwise diversion route - B1029, Birchwood Road, A12, A1232 and B1029

Anticlockwise diversion route - B1029, A12, Birchwood Road and B1029

Please note that Dedham Riverside Car Park (near Mill Pond) will be closed for the duration of the works however, alternative parking is nearby.

RAYDON PAVILION IMPROVEMENTS



You may have noticed that the Pavilion has recently undergone a much-needed refresh including full external redecoration. The building is now looking much better for this - but there is more to come!

The next phase of refurbishment will involve improvements to the carpark which will see the parking area extended and the whole carpark fully resurfaced. No more potholes and hopefully no more street parking. This work is scheduled to start on Monday, 5th October and will take about 3 weeks. During this time the availability of the carpark will be restricted, but the contractors have agreed to schedule the work in order to minimize any disruption to users. It will, however, be necessary to fully close the carpark for 48 hours while the new surface is being laid. Assuming the work proceeds to schedule this is expected to be 22nd and 23rd October.

This work has been financed by an allocation of Community Infrastructure Funds from Raydon Parish Council and the Trustees of King Georges' Field would like to express their thanks to the Parish Council for making these improvements possible.

Raydon and District Garden Club

Autumn has arrived and it's time to enjoy all the lovely colours around us for a week or two before strong winds and possible overnight frosts arrive and we have the leaves drop off. However then it's time if , like me, you collect most of the leaves and compost them down to get the free leaf mulch ready to use on the flower borders next year. I used to put the leaves in black plastic bags with a few drainage holes in bottom but to avoid plastic over the last 3 years have been using a strong rigid wire netting ring to store the leaves in and it's easy to just keep topping it up at any time, also I get much better results. It's easy to open when needed and just fork contents into a wheel barrow so avoiding heavy lifting of wet soggy plastic bags.

Now all through September we have been enjoying the autumn crocus, narines, asters, black eved Susan, verbena, Russian sage to name but a few and watching the honey & bumble bees enjoying the feast along with late damsel and dragon flies around the pond and of course the wasps provided you don't get stung. Last week we had a sighting of our resident grass snake curled up in the grass by the pond enjoying the hot weather, and when sitting in summerhouse enjoying not only a cuppa tea we can watch the birds lining up to come and get a drink, mostly Goldfinch. Bluetit. Green finch. odd Gt tit. Sparrows and have had occasional female Blackcap. Hope you have seen the Buzzards flying over Raydon, sometimes as many as 3 at a time, also occasional Red kite. We also see quite often female mostly Sparrow hawk and a Kestrel hovering over the meadow at rear of darden.

Writing these notes on 18th September with more hot dry weather it is now getting

very dry again so watering cans are fully employed once again just trying to keep everything alive in the flower garden. Most of the vegetable garden has been harvested and reasonable results all round, with tomato and courgette, beetroot, carrots, potato and sweetcorn being particularly good. Runner beans could have been better but not enough rain for them to flourish but the onions & shallots very reasonable.

Now the garden club of course has been mostly cancelled this year but it was hoped to hold a meeting in October but sadly we have had to cancel yet again due to the virus situation. Your committee will be holding (with social distance) a meeting hopefully in October to discuss future events/club meetings & shows for 2021. We must plan for next year and hope that we will be able to hold these with all members involved. At this point I suggest that the AGM/social evening will also be cancelled in November but, provided we can, perhaps it will be transferred to January or even February. All committee members are expected to continue until such time as we can hold a replacement AGM. ** Paid up members from November 2019 will be automatically paid up for 2021 at no cost. Anybody who missed paving their subs but wish to continue a club member for 2021 please pay your membership of £12.50 pp (cash or cheque) before Christmas please and put it through my letterbox at High Elms, The Street, Raydon. I will then pass it on to our treasurer and you will get new membership cards sent to vou.

Any member who has Summer Show cups please return them to me as soon as possible for engraving the winners name etc for 2019 so the history is retained.

Lastly and some of you will perhaps already know this but sadly our long standing Vice President David Gostling has died after a long battle with health problems. A founder member and supported by his wife Vera they have given so much time to our club with selling raffle tickets, to helping at all shows, doing refreshments, being exhibitors, and so much much more. Our sincere condolence goes to Vera and Philip and Tim at this very stressful time.

Members keep positive and we will meet again, just not sure when but hopefully throughout 2021.

Want to book a coronavirus test ? - please don't call 111 or your GP practice

The NHS is urging people not to call its 111 helpline or their GP practice or visit their hospital's emergency department if they want a coronavirus test.

That's the message from health professionals across Suffolk and north east Essex who have highlighted a big increase in call volumes, with some GP practices reporting that one in five telephone calls relate to coronavirus testing.

Instead, tests should be booked via the Government website - https://www.gov.uk/ get-coronavirus-test - or the NHS 119 dedicated helpline.

Kevin Whomes, practice manager at Swan and Forest GP surgeries in west Suffolk, said: "This big increase in call volume is placing an extra burden on our already very busy staff, as well as making it more difficult for patients with primary care needs to contact us.

"It's quite right that anyone with coronavirus symptoms gets tested, and it's clear people are making an effort to arrange a test. But I urge them not to contact their practice if they have an inquiry about testing or are having difficulty in organising a test, as we have no access to the test system."

Belinda White, Regional Manager at Care UK which operates the 111 service across Suffolk and north east Essex, said: "As always the 111 service is here 24/7 for all urgent medical help and advice. What we cannot do is book COVID-19 tests.

"We understand it must be so frustrating for patients who have to sit in a call waiting line to have their query answered only to be told that they have come through to the wrong service so please dial 119 for test

help.

"By dialing 119 for tests you are helping us to ensure we can support those with medical issues promptly at this time of increased pressure."

Anyone with coronavirus symptoms can get a test.

Coronavirus symptoms are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
 - a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste



Circular walk 3:

Holton St Mary to Lower Raydon via Dewlands Farm (8.5 km)

1. Start in Church Square. Go through the black wrought-iron gate and walk past the Church porch to your right and bear right at the War Memorial on to a grassy path to the kissing gate that opens on to the field. Bear half left diagonally across the field. At the tree-plantation that envelops 'Holton Hall', bear half right to enter a narrow tree-lined path through trees with a fence and then brick wall on your right. Head towards Holton Hall Farm (APT Farming)

2. After 80 metres you emerge into the farmyard. With eyes and ears open for moving objects (farm vehicles, not livestock), keep straight and walk through a very wide gap between high hedges into a grassy field and alongside a line of young hedges, behind which is a row of 10 static caravans. Go through a narrow natural archway in the hedge and cross the next field, with or without a crop. Pass through another arch in the hedge and bear slightly left across a grass field towards a stile with a Footpath sign in the corner of the field (I have seen a vixen and cubs in the far left hand side of this field on some early evenings in the late summer of 2018 and 2019... sshh!)

3. Cross the stile and turn left on to Sandpits Lane. Walk down this lane for approximately 900 metres soon passing 'Lark Hall' and 'Laits Barn' on the left. Ignore the Bridleway on the right immediately past 'Laits Barn' and also the Bridleway on the right past 'Pintins'

4. Turn right at the Bridleway towards 'Dewlands Farm'. After approximately 200 metres bear left on an initial dirt track taking care to avoid stubbing your *hallux* on three combination-locked, shiny steel bollards; most of the time they are 'down' and sunk in the ground. Continue walking down this track which quickly degenerates into a hard, rutted and hard (or very muddy) track for a total of 1.3km with a racecourse on your left and maturing hedging and fields on the right. Pass through a wide galvanised steel gate. To the left there is a small enclosure with a tall frame that holds race results and on the right, some fenced-off areas including a horse paddock and other equine-related areas/equipment. Continue walking straight ahead to the end of the racecourse and then bear subtly right on to a more obvious dirt track

5. Where the track meets a tarmac road at 'Mill Farm Cottage' turn right. This is a very quiet road but heavily littered (some plastics dating from the last century) that predictably clings to the edges of fields (on the right) and a shock of tall, dense woodland (on the left). Continue down the hill (Higham Hill) towards Lower Raydon with stunningly beautiful and tranquil views to the right (towards Sulley's Hill) and to the left (towards Polstead)

6. At the T-junction with Sulley's Hill, turn right and then up on to a low bank and follow the Footpath sign that takes you diagonally across a field

7. At the corner of the field, the ground crosses a stream; turn left to walk on a wide grass verge with trees on the left and an upwards sloping field on the right (usually bearing a crop). The verge bends sharp right and then sharp left following the field edge. Continue walking straight ahead to enter a more defined path with the tree-lined stream you crossed earlier on the left and a fenced off gently, upward-sloping and manicured field on the right

8. After about 300 metres you arrive at a newly-constructed rustic bridge. Cross this (rarely with any significant flow to permit Pooh sticks) and now the path becomes narrower and, in wet weather, menacingly marshy. Fortunately there is a long row of double sleepers to maintain dryness and dignity. This area is known as

'Sodom and Gomorrah', not because of previous evil acts, but because the soil is poor and barren. The path meanders (up + down), passing a large, black, still and ominous pond on the right then ascends and eventually emerges on to a wide sandy track. Turn left (to the right is a wooden gate marked 'Private'). Walk along this path for approximately 280 metres

9. You are now at a junction of three paths (to the right is a gate marked 'Private'). Turn left, gently ascending towards a wide steel gate: pass through and walk up a wide, fenced-off grassy path with new hedging and an extensive maturing tree plantation on the left and a field (+/- horses) on the right. The gentle slope gradually flattens out. Continue through a gap in the hedge and across a field to another, slightly smaller and almost accidental gap in a taller and dishevelled tree-hedge hybrid. Continue walking for approximately 100 metres. with now neater hedging to the left and a downward-sloping field to the right

10. You reach another footpathcrossroads; take a WH Davies moment to 'stand and stare', breathe deeply and reflect on who you are, even on where you are going turn right and down the gently-sloping field (often with crop) to merge into a wider grassy, then sandy track that subtly ascends to Sandpits Lane

11. Turn left at Sandpits Lane and walk approximately 130 metres to point 3 (Footpath with stile) to retrace your steps back to Church Square.

Please be patient, we'll let you know about flu vaccinations for those aged 50 - 64

Issued on behalf of NHS North East Essex, NHS West Suffolk and NHS Ipswich and East Suffolk clinical commissioning groups and in partnership with the Suffolk and Essex local pharmaceutical committees

GPs and community pharmacists from north east Essex and Suffolk have welcomed plans to extend eligibility for the flu vaccination to those aged 50 to 64 years.

But, following a reported big increase in inquiries at GP practices, people in this age group are being asked not to book a vaccination appointment at this time. In line with national plans to protect the most vulnerable first, people aged 50 - 64 will be offered the vaccine later in the season so the NHS can first focus on those most at risk – including those aged 65 or over, pregnant women, young children, and those with long-term health conditions.

The flu vaccination offers an important health protection. Flu can lead to existing health conditions getting worse or the development of an illness such as bronchitis or pneumonia, or it could even be fatal. A vaccination helps protect the health of a pregnant mother and her child.

Most GP practices and pharmacies will begin inviting those patients most at risk for a flu vaccination from September onwards, and it is anticipated those newly eligible aged 50 - 64 years will be invited for vaccination during November or December.

Dear Friends

I'm writing this a couple of weeks after my ordination and have now had time to reflect both on what happened in the Cathedral on 5th September and also on what things have changed, either temporarily or permanently during the Spring, Summer and early Autumn of 2020. The repercussions of Covid19 will be with us for many months to come and we know there will be more anxiety and grief to accompany the uncertain times. Some days we feel lost, struggling even to work out what day of the week it is; other days seem as if we are almost back to 'normal'. I hope that returning to physical church services has helped you find some normality. It is not just about seeing friends and fellow worshippers, (albeit with masks on), familiarising yourselves with services once more and feeling comfortable with the changes that have been made. It is also about being able to continue the personal relationship we have been able to have with God during the lockdown and explore it further.

In a peculiar way I was grateful for the way this year unfolded. It gave me the chance to come off the treadmill of meetings, work, services, and prayer time and to find a new order and rhythm of prayer time, online services, meetings, and work. Subtle switches but important ones; changes that helped with preparing to go forward as a deacon. Being ordained a deacon is not just a pathway to being priested next summer, and it is not just about a change of title from Mrs to Revd. It is asking me to continue to serve the people of God, continue to serve my neighbour and continue to serve all our parishioners more deeply. The newly consecrated Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell, said in his book 'On Priesthood' that being a deacon is not a steppingstone but a foundation stone to priesthood.

I know many of you were able to log on and be with me and my family virtually for the ordination service. I valued the warmth of your company and your prayers, thank you so much. Oddly, I felt unable to put on my collar prior to entering the Cathedral and only just before the service began did my fingers nervously thread the piece of white plastic through the top of my shirt. The nerves continued when I was called to kneel before the Bishop, but after that it all just seemed so right. It was thrilling. I had thought at the rehearsal the day before that I was now ready but nobody can quite prepare you for the enormity of that moment, of what you are being asked to do.
