Speeding is a general problem. In Stratford St Mary we reported 519 vehicles speeding in the first 6 months of this year

In Dedham, the Speedwatch Team reported 1,453 drivers at speeds up to 65mph in the 30mph limits for the same period

In June alone, 3 families had to deal with the loss of a loved one on Essex roads and a further 70 families are having to adjust their lives to deal with a serious injuries.

Speeding is the biggest single cause of road traffic accidents and our rural roads have the highest level of serious accidents.

LIVE SCREENING OF SPORTING EVENTS AT RAYDON PAVILION

Following successful trials, Raydon Pavilion is planning to host regular sporting evenings with live broadcasts of selected matches.

The bar will be open from 7:00pm offering a draught ale, in addition to the usual range of bottled / canned beers, wines and spirits. Entry is free for Raydon Sports & Social Club members (membership open to village residents).

DOG FOULING

Dog fouling in the village, and particularly on King George's Field, is on the rise. To combat this anti-social behaviour, the Parish Council have recently paid for and installed an additional dog bin to give owners leaving the playing field at each exit point the facilities needed but some owners are still not clearing up after their pets. We do ask that owners who enjoy walking their dogs in the village also respect the village. Additional signage has been installed, highlighting that it is an offence not to clear up after your dog, with a fine of £1,000 on conviction. Be warned!



NEWS FROM KING GEORGE'S FIELD TRUSTEES

As many of you may know the Raydon pavilion was erected in 2000 by a dedicated group of residents. The building is actually made up of several portable structures bolted together. These date back to the 1980's and unfortunately a recent survey, undertaken by a qualified surveyor, has uncovered corrosion to the metal subframe which means the building now has a very limited life expectancy. We are therefore facing an urgent need to develop a new building to ensure that the village is not left without a community space and so that we can all continue to enjoy the many varied activities which currently take place in the pavilion. A new structure will benefit us all and be there for future generations to enjoy.

We hope to keep everyone informed on how our plans are progressing by posting regular updates, especially as we start to talk with architects to draw up some concepts. We anticipate this project will require significant investment both in time and money with the potential cost likely to be in excess of £500,000 based on current estimates of building costs. Funds will need to be sourced from several different organisations and bodies to achieve this and the trustees are currently in discussions with a number of potential funding sources including the Village Hall Committee to try and pull together the budget needed.

Against this background, we have decided it does not make sense to spend what very limited funds we have on upgrading the current facilities (toilets, kitchens etc) as it is unlikely this could be transferred to a new building.

We welcome any feedback and suggestions you may have so please do speak with any one of the trustees - we all live in the village and are happy to talk with you. The current registered trustees are: Sue Newton Nev Davenport Mark Smout Stephen Coe Jo Brothers Helen Abel

BULLET POINTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PC MEETING HELD ON 13 SEPTEMBER 2022

Babergh DC

Cllr Ward confirmed the discretionary fund for those unable to access financial support through the Council Tax Energy Rebate Scheme had now closed. Babergh was planning to allocate a dedicated Locality Officer to groups of parish councils.

Suffolk CC

Cllr Hall said SCC was working on a list of ways to help residents with the energy crisis.

Parish trees, hedgerows and wildflowers scheme

Cllr Ward confirmed that this scheme was not the same as Babergh's own trial of wildflower verges - part of an effort to tackle biodiversity and climate change. It was agreed to consider trees and hedgerows when the 2023 scheme was launched. In the meantime, the Clerk would apply to Babergh for some wildflower seed mixes.

Fireworks

It was agreed to make a donation towards the annual KGF fireworks display on 5 November; this had been allowed for in the budget.

Lga Councillor Code of Conduct

It was agreed to formally adopt the new LGA Councillor Code of Conduct. It was also agreed to consider putting in place a Social Media policy.

• CIL expenditure

It was agreed that addressing speeding through the village was a priority and the October meeting would consider the purchase of a Speed Indication Device (SID) - a speed survey would be required before any action could be taken; Cllr Hall said she might be able to help with some locality funding. In the meantime, JC would write to the KGF Trustees to ask for their views on new play equipment for the Plaving Field, and possibly some fencing to keep dogs away from the play area.

Insurance

The Clerk's paper was noted; the current insurers had withdrawn from the market and she had obtained three alternative quotes. It was agreed to accept the quotation from Zurich Municipal for twelve months commencing 1 October 2022.

• Litter bin for Playing Field

It was agreed that, subject to approval from the KGF Trustees, the Parish Council would purchase a litter bin for the Playing Field.

War Memorial

It was agreed in principle that the War Memorial should be cleaned professionally before Remembrance Sunday; the Clerk would obtain quotes.

Resignation

It was noted that Trevor Sayer had resigned as a Parish Councillor, owing to increased business commitments. The Notice of Vacancy from Babergh would be displayed for the requisite period before considering co-option.



Households urged to get Food Savvy and plan ahead to save money and avoid waste

As the cost of living continues to bite a new campaign has been launched in Suffolk to help families reduce food waste and save money. Back To Savvy is a Suffolk Waste Partnership initiative which advises people on how to reduce food waste through planning out meals and storing them effectively. The campaign will advise on planning meals and batch cooking, storing prepared meals so they are ready for work/school, and repurposing leftovers into new meals.

The three main top tips are:

- 1. Cook today, eat tomorrow cook multiple meals together using batch recipes and store in a fridge or freezer for later
- 2. Love your leftovers turn dinner leftovers into tasty lunches or even remix them into fun new recipes.
- 3. Plan ahead organise your lunches by planning and buying in advance. Even a minute planning your meals will save you a tonne of time and money.

Back to Savvy launches on Monday September 5 and is part of the wider Suffolk and Norfolk Food Savvy campaign, which offers a range of advice and information on how to save food and money.


Households across the UK waste 6.6 million tonnes of food annually, of which it is calculated 4.5 million tonnes are good to eat. In Norfolk and Suffolk, this equates to 118,000 tonnes of wasted food across the two counties annually. The average family with children could save more than £730 per year if they were to reduce their avoidable food waste. Food waste also contributes to climate change as the greenhouse gases associated with food

waste in the UK are the equivalent of those produced by ten million cars.

Councillor James Mallinder, the chair of Suffolk Waste Partnership, said: "Family budgets are under huge pressure, so this is one way of helping ease the financial burden. With a little forethought and planning it is possible to make what we buy go further, last longer and help protect our environment."


