

The Village Emergency Telephone

The Stratford St Mary Village Emergency Telephone System (VETS) is now up and running.

If you are with a person who you suspect has had a cardiac arrest, immediately call 999 as normal. An ambulance will be dispatched as soon as possible, however due to the location of Stratford St Mary, this may take a while

You will probably be alone with the patient and cannot leave them to go and get the village defibrillator, so we have a group of 10 volunteers who will respond to a telephone call from you. All the volunteers are on the same number and if a volunteer is available you give them your location, they will collect the defibrillator and come to your location, they will then assist in CPR and using the defibrillator until the ambulance or medics arrive.

Broadband Issue

The Parish Councils of Holton St Mary and Raydon have jointly been considering the issue of broadband connectivity in the villages and particularly performance and reliability.

To take this forward requires two key actions:

- 1 Check your own system if it is not set up properly or capable, the bandwidth from your service provider will not reach your screen.
- 2 Check the line speed this has to be done at the point of entry to remove issues from point 1 above.

In order to gather information on performance we have set up a shared site to gather data.

If you have any familiarity with google and spreadsheets you will be able to access the form online at Google Drive.

Feel free to complete the form with as much information as you wish to share. Note this is a public access site and all data will be open access. Please provide your email address to raydonpc@gmail.com and access to the site can be sent to you.

Once we have a few weeks of information we should be able to ascertain if there is a pattern to the problems encountered to support any action with the service providers.

The form contains a tab with information on how to action points 1 & 2 above.

Good News!

St Mary's Raydon has been awarded a grant towards the cost of repairs to the gutters and associated roof elements on the north side of the aisle roof. This has been a worrying issue for some time as it is helping to cause damp within the lavatory/Vestry. The grant comes from Historic England who are running a project for the Department of Digital, Culture, Media and Sport called the Taylor Review Pilot. The aim of the Pilot. which is taking place in Manchester and Suffolk. test some of the is to recommendations of a Review on the sustainability of English Churches and Cathedrals. Unlike some Continental churches there is no automatic funding from Government for places of worship in Great Britain, except for the reimbursement of VAT. Various organisations provide grants for 'Heritage' buildings but these are reducing and for some very small parishes a daunting task for which to apply. And of course Heritage is much more than ancient churches!

The grants being awarded at the moment are designed as 'just-in-time' solutions to problems, that if not tackled will become major ones in a few years. St Mary's are delighted that we have been able to satisfy the requirements of Historic England and so can deal with exactly this type of problem, keeping the church in good order for many years to come.

Raydon and District Gardening Club

Autumn time once again is here, so we can all enjoy natures colours of yellow, orange, reds, and even brown made especially better on the brighter, sunny days at this time of year. The daylight hours are getting shorter and plants are starting to shut down so it's time for a bit of tidying up (but don't do too much, spare a thought for wildlife) as they need somewhere to hibernate, or hunt for food in the winter months ahead.

Fallen leaves always seems to be a problem for some people, but why not collect them and store them to produce free leaf mould ready to mulch around plants and shrubs etc next year. I use a open wire container so as I collect leaves I can just tip them in loose, tamp down, and just leave. October is the time to re-arrange those plants that perhaps are in the wrong place due to size, or colour clash with its neighbouring plants, perhaps did not perform very well, or even died through lack of rain or disease.

Bulb planting for next year's display but if it's tulips, November is a better time to plant, also ensure they are planted at the correct depth, this helps to avoid disease and you get stronger plants and better flowers. It looks likely that we are going to need more water for our gardens each year as climate change progresses and water restrictions may result, so I have invested in two more 270 litre water butts (already have five) to collect free water whenever we get any.

So onto club news.

October 24th will see a familiar guest speaker in Matthew Long from Monks Eleigh, subject of Bulbs- Autumn & Winter Flowering for gardens and house. Now as you mostly will know, Matthew runs a bulb centre supply store/ sales and collection, or they can be delivered (carriage cost involved).

An exhibition on the fascinating history of Partridge's shop in Hadleigh will be displayed in The Guildhall, Market Place, Hadleigh, on Saturday 19th & Sunday 20th October.

Mounted by Hadleigh Archives Group of the Town Council, it charts nearly 200 years of trading on the same site.

Mention Hadleigh to anyone who has been to this Suffolk market town and they will invariably say something along the lines of: "Ah, Partridge's, what a wonderful shop". It has built its reputation as the sort of place where a person can go in and buy anything from a single lost nut, to a lawnmower or a teapot.

In fact, it started off as an ironmongers in 1819 when the then owner, Thomas Pritty, "Respectfully informs the inhabitants of Hadleigh and the Public in general" that he had commenced business as an ironmonger, but selling china, glass, earthenware, as well as "goods of every description". That pretty well sums up the range of products today.

Over the centuries the business changed hands several times and grew to be a major supplier of agricultural implements ranging from Ransome's ploughs to combine harvesters — delivered by train to the Hadleigh branch line. Items such as "chaff engines" and "oil-cake breakers" also featured. At one time its foundry, the manufacturing section, employed no less than 15 men and boys, including one apprentice.

Interestingly, the owner was targeted as a wealthy man. On 27th October 1838 the Ipswich Journal reported a daring highway robbery a mile out of Hadleigh during which Mr Pritty was stopped by "two foot-pads" who knocked the lamps on his four-wheel chaise to pieces and robbed him of a silver watch and £3-£4 of gold and silver while holding him down with a strong neckerchief.

Not a word was spoken during the episode and the thieves were never caught.

Another tale involved the "dreadful murder" of a shoemaker and corn chandler who lived in two cottages, 3 & 5 George Street, which later became part of Partridge's, retailing area. He was shot with a musket by a neighbour, while locking up his storage premises at night, having just sold some oats. "The musket was loaded with a marble, which passed through his neck, struck the door, (which is indented) and ultimately broke in half," said a report. The neighbour, Edward Offord, 65 and retired, once a sergeant in the Suffolk Militia, then tried to take his own life by slashing his throat. However, he was apprehended. sewn up, and subsequently faced trial where he was found quilty, but insane.

Few people will know about this grizzly crime while browsing through the household and gardening sections of the delightfully timbered building!

The owners having moved away, the future of M W Partridge & Co is yet to be determined. Many Hadleigh residents hope that at least a part of the iconic shop will be retained and some of the unique 'Partridge culture' will be maintained.

Several bundles of old property deeds, no longer required for legal purposes, were generously donated to the town by the owners Mr Keith and Mrs Ann Young. They are now stored in the Hadleigh Archives' office at The Guildhall where they are kept securely, have been catalogued, and are accessible to any member of the public.

The exhibition will be open from 1.00 am to 4.00 pm. Entry, via the churchyard entrance, £2, children over 12 free, with all proceeds going to the Hadleigh Market Feoffment Charity.





Dear Friends

Now in the season of mists and mellow fruitfulness, the harvest is safely gathered in and the children safely back at school after the summer break. The churches of the Benefice have all celebrated the harvest with thanksgiving services and lunches, with good support from the communities.

As we move through this month we are beginning to think about the time turning back, the coming of the darker nights and cold winter days, and possibly how you should design the carving of your pumpkin in readiness of Halloween.

Growing in popularity Halloween is almost exclusively an American secular holiday, spending over \$5 billion dollars annually, making it the country's second largest commercial holiday. Many who celebrate have no concept of its religious origins or pagan heritage. Christians however are enlightened by the truth of God's word, and maybe we need to remind ourselves of its Christian roots. Celtic people of Europe and Britain were pagan Druids whose major celebrations were marked by the seasons and where, in Northern Europe, people made preparations to ensure winter survival, harvesting the crops and slaughtering animals that wouldn't make it. Life slowed down as winter brought darkness, and the imagery of death symbolised by skeletons, skulls and the colour black remains prominent in today's Halloween celebrations.

Halloween for the early Christians was a day set aside (All Saints day or All Hallows' day 1st Nov), for the solemn remembrance of the Martyrs and saints. All Hallows' eve (31st Oct) began this time of remembrance and was eventually contracted to Hallow- e'en which became 'Halloween'.

Mercifully God has shined the light of the gospel into the dark, superstitious pagan world and early and newly converted Christians armed themselves with truth denouncing former pagan spiritism in accordance with Deuteronomy 18. 9 -13

On that note as we think on how we can celebrate and enjoy all the good gifts around us, giving thanks to God for the light of His love.
