

Stratford St Mary's Charitable Trusts Merge

Stratford St Mary's two historical charitable trusts. The Lettice Dyke Foundation and The Stratford St Mary Welfare Trust, have, this month, been merged to create a single trust under the name 'Stratford St Mary Community Trust'. This is because the assets of the Foundation have diminished over the years, to an extent that makes it no longer viable as an independent trust. The Stratford St Mary Parish Council as trustees of the Foundation, in liaison with the Charity Commission for England and Wales, have therefore agreed to relinquish their responsibilities in this respect and the new combined trust will operate under the trusteeship of the existing Welfare Trust Board. The Parish Council does however have ongoing influence on the activities of the new trust through nomination of two trustees.

The new trust has been granted a remit that incorporates the objectives of both of the original trusts but in a more flexible context. This is now recorded on the web-site of the Charity Commission as:

TO ASSIST PERSONS RESIDENT IN THE PARISH OF STRATFORD ST MARY TO PARTICIPATE IN AND ENJOY THE BENEFITS OF, THEIR COMMUNITY, PARTICULARLY THROUGH:

- PROVISION OF RELIEF IN CONDITIONS OF NEED, HARD-SHIP OR DISTRESS;
- FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR AT-TENDANCE AT OR ENGAGE-MENT WITH, EDUCATIONAL ESTABLISHMENTS:

 ASSISTANCE IN ACCESSING NEW OR ALTERNATIVE EM-PLOYMENT

The trustees are of the opinion that this will allow them to respond to instances of required assistance in a less restricted manner than formerly, and in a way that will be more suited to life in the 21st century.

Although trying to make themselves aware of situations in which Trust intervention might be appropriate, trustees recognise that there will inevitably be instances of need of which they have no knowledge. For this reason, anyone living, working or playing in our village who is or becomes, aware of, a resident within the Stratford St Mary community who might warrant assistance from the trust under the above remit, is asked to pass relevant information to the trust, for consideration

The trust has a direct e-mail address, trust@stratford-st-mary.org which can be used for this purpose or for general communication. All information passed to the trust or to individual trustees, will be treated in strictest confidence.

- 2 Check the line speed this has to be done at the point of entry to remove issues from point 1 above.

In order to gather information on performance we have set up a shared site to gather data.

If you have any familiarity with google and spreadsheets you will be able to access the form online at Google Drive.

Feel free to complete the form with as much information as you wish to share. Note this is a public access site and all data will be open access. Please provide your email address to raydonpc@gmail.com and access to the site can be sent to you.

Once we have a few weeks of information we should be able to ascertain if there is a pattern to the problems encountered to support any action with the service providers.

The form contains a tab with information on how to action points 1 & 2 above.

Column from James Cartlidge MP

I believe that our very special part of the world has the basis for a brilliant tourism offer and every upwards tick in local visitor numbers adds to the positive prospects of our small business owners, who depend so heavily upon traditional trade through their doors rather than clicks in a virtual domain. Tourism is worth about £2bn to the Suffolk economy and in 2017 nearly 250,000 people were employed by hospitality businesses in our region. I would also add anecdotally from my experience of enjoying our various pubs and restaurants that the hospitality sector offers a key chance for young people to sample employment for the first time, even if many then go on to careers in other sectors.

As such, as the Chair of the South Suffolk Taskforce, I have made one of our workstreams the visitor economy and the industries that it supports. In particular, we have focused on what we can do to make more of our unique cultural offer, with my constituency containing rich, rare links to two of our most famous painters: Gainsborough and Constable.

Certainly, there is much to be positive about. On the Shotley Peninsula, the tourism action group is creating exciting events that have drawn more visitors to the area, in particular celebrating the association with Arthur Ransome's 'Swallows and Amazons' adventures. At Flatford, the real-life scene of Constable's world famous 'Hay Wain' painting, the National Trust have recently purchased the last privately-owned property in the hamlet. In Hadleigh, Benton End House, once the home of Sir Cedric Morris who opened the East Anglian School of Painting and Drawing - has been purchased with the view of opening it to the public and artists. Artists who have previously studied at the property include Maggi Hambling, Warburton and Bettina Shaw-Joan Lawrence.

Finally, there is the planned redevelopment of Gainsborough's House in Sudbury which will create an impressive new gallery and act as a national cultural centre. My first ever Prime Minister's Question to Theresa May celebrated this ambitious project and I hope it will help to crystallise a resurgent local tourism sector, boosting vital footfall in our shops.




