

Dear friends,

I am writing this on Palm Sunday (20 March) after a

procession around the church at Holton, with us all waving our palm crosses as we sang 'Ride on, ride on in majesty', to remind ourselves that a week before his death Jesus was being welcomed into Jerusalem by the people and proclaimed Messiah. But during the week after that, what we now call Holy Week, events started to take an ugly turn when Jesus upset the Temple casting authorities bγ out moneychangers and the stalls selling wares for the Temple sacrifices. And suddenly the pace of the story speeded up as the mood of the crowd changed, till on Good Friday Jesus was taken before the Roman authorities and condemned to a hideous death by crucifixion.

Children often ask me why Good Friday is called 'Good' if that is what happened on that day. The answer is that Christians know that, because Jesus died for us on that day, our sins have been forgiven and God's love will surround us for evermore. Without Jesus' death, we would have been left in our sins and God would continue to feel the anguish of seeing us all continue to reject his ways and his love. So it is certainly a very good day for

those who commit themselves to following God in their lives, for we know that, with Jesus' death, we have God with us all the time and that at the end, we shall be with him in eternity.

By the time you read this, I hope you and yours will have had a very good Easter, and that April will bring us some spring-like weather as children go back to school and students resume their courses. May this 'summer' term be a good one for all, students and teachers alike.

April 2nd will also bring us a concert in Stratford St Mary church at 7.30 p.m. The Suffolk Church Singers read about the plight of the church roof there and kindly offered a concert free of charge so that we could raise money for the Roof Fund. Please do come and join us for an evening of music and refreshments.



Following the little incursion inland, we returned to the sea front again, and 5 walkers stopped in the Fludver Arms to have coffee. As we passed the Fludver Arms again, the coffee drinkers waved to show they had seen us, before they followed us back to the Ferryboat Inn. As we had such a large group, and the pub was very busy with the Sunday trade, we were split into 2 groups in different rooms for lunch.

SPEEDING - HELP TO MAKE RAYDON SAFER

It is a matter of extreme concern to your Parish Council that speeding traffic in the village is becoming more prevalent by the day - and statistics show an alarming picture.

Your Parish Council is determined to try to alleviate this problem and is considering a number of speed detection devices suitable for our road conditions and effective as deterrents.

Research has involved a lengthy consultation with neighbouring parishes who have already acquired such equipment and operated it for some time. We can report that the most effective means of curbing speeding, based on our consultation, appears to be Community Speedwatch. Some parishes say that the results have been conclusive - speeding has been noticeably reduced.

However, this would require volunteers to operate the equipment. Please contact me if you would be prepared to participate, should the PC decide to go ahead with this initiative – full training would be given.

Weather Watchers

We have just experienced one of the mildest winters I have records for in the area where we live. A few facts and figures follows: The average maximum temperature for the months. December. January and February was 10.0C and the average minimum was 5.6C These compare to the normal values of 6.8C and 2,2C for these months. December was exceptionally warm, the mean maximum and minimum temperature being 12.6C and 9.2C. There were no frosts and not a single flake of snow. January and February were less mild but temperatures remained above normal. February being the coldest month of the winter with 13 frosts including 6 air frosts. Surprisingly the winter was comparatively dry. The total rainfall I measured for the 3 winter months was 110.6 millimetres(4.35 inches), the normal amount one would expect being millimetres(5,71inches) On the late evening of February 8th, there were some loud claps of thunder accompanied by heavy rain(10 millimetres) and I half expected the lights to go off, wondering if any structure nearby had been struck by lightning. Fortunately, it didn't happen but it reminded me of the weather adage that thunder in Spring, cold will bring although February can hardly be called a Spring month but the weather afterwards did change to a colder theme. We have been extremely lucky this winter by not experiencing the floods that occurred in the northern parts of the country, a total of 343 millimetres of rain falling in the Lake District in December and similar amounts in Aberdeenshire during January. Having said this, we do live in the driest part of the country. However, Stratford St Mary, Dedham and Flatford are in the flood plain of the river Stour and the adjacent meadows are likely to become flooded if rainfall exceeds 100 millimetres (4 inches) in any one winter month. The river Stour was dredged some 15 years ago at Stratford to reduce the flooding risks in Lower Street and Higham road. Exceptionally, flooding will occur but few properties are at risk now.

As the evaporation rate is 60 times more in Summer compared to the winter months due to the strength of the sun, flooding is unusual this time of the year apart from flash floods from thunderstorms and underlines the necessity to keep drains free of debris. The occurrence of thunder in Summer has noticeably decreased in recent years with power cuts due to lightning strikes happening less frequently. Is global warming anything to do with this? I leave this thought with you.

We have a number of issues which have been raised with us recently:

Text message reminders – we are aware that people are getting these sometimes weeks in advance of their appointment instead of the day before. This is a computer software issue and the practice has raised this with the software suppliers.

Ongoing problems with getting local phlebotomy appointments due to long term staff sickness.
