

Dear friends.

I am hoping and praying that July will turn out to be a warmer and sunnier month

than June; as I write this in mid-June, we have had thunderstorms, torrential rain and lower than average temperatures. I am not sure what this means for farmers and their crops, but will be thinking of all who work on the land this month. I have just got back from a very hot week in the south of Spain, where the olive crops entirely failed this year owing to the wrong type of weather at the wrong time. Andalucia relies heavily on the export of olives, either whole or processed, so the economy of a whole region will be in dire straits for a while, and the price of olive oil will no doubt have to go up to compensate. For me, it was a very practical lesson in how we are all linked with, and dependent on, each other and on the land that we work across the world.

And of course, that reminded me that, as I write, we are heading into the referendum that may bring about the greatest social changes in a generation or more. People of my generation and younger have never really known a time when we couldn't simply cross the Channel and walk through Customs into the European country of our choice: nor have we ever had to do without all the exotic and luxurious things that come from other regions of the Continent. I am no prophet, nor an economist, so I have no idea what our lives will be like if we vote to leave the EU - will we go back to those rather grey days before our lives were made more colourful by today's easy contacts with our European neighbours? My feelings, if

the vote is to leave, will be ones of deep regret that those who preach fear and suspicion of our neighbours have been allowed to divorce us from ways of negotiating and working in what is, admittedly, a sometimes abusive system, to bring about change from within rather than standing outside and ranting. For me, this is not simply a political matter, but a moral one of how we treat each other in society as a whole.

So I shall be waiting with bated breath to hear the results and how whatever they are will make a difference to our everyday lives. Will the politicians learn to speak more respectfully about each other and give us all a rather better example than they have done recently? Will the tragic death of MP Jo Cox make them reflect on the kinds of feelings that they have stirred up in our society over the last months? Who knows? We can only pray.

And finally, good wishes to all who are at the end of their school or university careers and moving on to new adventures; to all who are moving on to new jobs, or retiring; and to all who are anxious about what the future may hold for them. May God be with you.


More than 200 knitted hats were delivered to the Felixstowe Seafarer's Centre recently.

HMQ90 - Rain! What rain?

Our Queen's 90th Birthday would seem to be more than sufficient reason for Stratford St Mary residents to come together in celebration and on Saturday 11th June, they did just that. With this being the day of Her Majesty's Official Birthday the village joined communities across the country in staging events to commemorate this most memorable occasion.

Stratford's party which started with the passage of the Official fly-past on its way to Buckingham Palace was literally set in motion by the Family Fun Run which set off at 1.15 from the Magna-Games arena at the School Playing Field, With the route being entirely within the village, the runners returned some twenty minutes or so later to be presented with their well-earned participants medals.

With the fun-runners safely returned, local band 'The In-Firm' opened what should have been the first of two sessions of their inimitable and highly enjoyable music - but the rain came!

Remarkably those already at the event continued to socialise in the VillageLife Tavern and the Tea Marquees, perhaps enjoying a glass or two of prosecco or locally brewed ale generously provided by the Swan. Many took the opportunity to browse the exhibition of old photographs of the village and its residents kindly made available from the Parish Archives and to view the display of portraits of the Queen, painted by children from the Primary School for a competition organised by VillageLife and judged for them by Maz Wheelhouse.

Unfortunately, the rain continued, continued indeed with such intensity that the In-Firm was forced to disconnect its sound system and retire to the tavern and the Magna-Games, a programme of light hearted

sporting events planned for the afternoon, was initially abandoned.

The focus of the afternoon, the 'birthday tea' was however smiled upon. Despite the downpour, village residents had continued to arrive and at about 4pm the skies cleared and nearly 300 people sat down to a wonderful tea prepared by Christine Cousins, her daughters Ann and Sarah, Sue Ablett, Karen Suddes and other ladies who each month lay-on such an excellent village lunch in the Parish Room. On this occasion, with so many people to cater for, extra volunteers had been welcomed and the resulting tea-time spread was well up to standard. During tea, party-goers were entertained by Janet Drake and her FunDancers and by Zena Tibbenham on accordion and Mike Strudwick on guitar who together, played a variety of music as a fitting accompaniment to a splendid tea.

After tea, and with the sun still shining, the more energetic partygoers called for the reinstatement of at least some of the planned sporting events. The first, the cabbage and shovel race, attracted a field of 16 entrants, requiring four heats before the final was deservedly won by Ellie 'Tossing Nevard. the Sand understandably attracted a smaller number of entrants with the result being a repeat of the 2015 event with Paul Fountain again achieving fame as the 'village tosser'. The climax of the games, The Magna Endurance Race, a time trial over a series of obstacles, had six entries with the outcome again being a repeat of the 2015 result, an emphatic win for Chris Jones.

Event winners were duly presented with their medals and Chris Jones became the first holder of the Andy March Memorial Trophy, presented in respectful memory of Andy March, a village resident, benefactor and founder member of VillageLife who sadly passed away somewhat prematurely, earlier this year.

VillageLife records its grateful thanks to R & D Schofield Limited and the Stratford St Mary Parish Council for their financial and physical support for HMQ90, to GreenSpark and Adam Clark for the loan and installation of public address equipment, to Mark, Jane and their team at the Swan for the provision of fine ales, to the Head Teacher, Staff and Pupils of Stratford St Mary Primary School for hosting HMQ90 and to June and Derek Round for their generous contribution to VillageLife's ongoing efforts in the community.

We particularly thank village residents who contributed time and physical effort to setting-up and taking down the various marquees and other installations. We cannot run these events without you.

Weather review.

After a promising first half, the April temperatures dropped significantly towards the end of the month. On the 25th the maximum temperature was only 6.5C with a low of 3.5C and the following day the values were 7.8C and 1.9C respectively. Low night temperatures continued for the rest of the month. The net result was that the mean maximum temperature for the month was 12.5C and the corresponding minimum was 5.1.

The poet, T S Eliot in 1922 wrote that April is the cruelest of months if my quotation is correct, I am no literary scholar, April this year being full of promise but hopes only to be dashed towards the end of the month. What is interesting is that April was colder than December 2015, mean maximum temperature 12.6C and minimum temperature 9.2C. Even November 2015 was marginally warmer than April this year. The only compensating factor was that April had an estimated 170 hours of sunshine whilst December only had 19 hours, a very dull month

On May the 31st, I recorded a total of 32 millimeters of rain, the heaviest rainfall in a 24 hour period for a very long time. May had been a comparatively dry month until then but this fall of rain brought total for the month up to 56 millimeters (2.2inches)

June, the first official meteorological summer month, has started well after forgetting the first 3 days.

By the time this article appears in the next Quartet it will be July. St Swithin's day is July 15th and supposedly if there is widespread rain on this day, the likely hood is that the next 40 days could be wet or have above average rainfall. Conversely, if it is dry, we may be experiencing a very good summer. There is a certain amount of truth in this because

by the middle of July, meteorologically speaking, the weather could have developed a stable pattern and which is not easily shifted.

High Summer is usually recognised as the last week in July and the first week in August when the highest temperatures are very often recorded.

Hours of daylight recede quite quickly during August, losing about 3 minutes a day by the end of the month.

The chances of a hot summer are not that great. There has been only 6 very hot summers in the last 100 years. July 1911 was torridly hot and the death rate in the elderly was extremely high. One must remember that air conditioning and refrigeration was not available then. August has also brought some very high temperatures at the start of the month in some years with France, which usually has even higher temperatures, overwhelmed with hospital admissions.

Many people suffer from pollen allergies. The height of the grass pollen season is the last week in June and the first fortnight in July. No problem if it rains, windy sunny conditions causing the most problems.

Lastly, I should mention that UV radiation levels are at their highest during the summer months. This problem has become worse due to the depletion of the ozone layer. People, particularly those with a fair skin complexion, are advised to use high factor sun cream on areas of their bodies exposed to the sun for any length of the time. Early mornings and evenings are the better times to be outside with those who have a sensitive skin and burn easily.

We are heading towards the longest day (21st June) as I write these notes and time is flying past so guickly, it's hard to believe that we are already at the half way stage of the year. Some of our migrant birds will soon be heading back to their winter guarters once again. SPEEDING - HELP TO MAKE RAYDON SAFER

It is a matter of extreme concern to your Parish Council that speeding traffic in the village is becoming more prevalent by the day - and statistics show an alarming picture.

Your Parish Council is determined to try to alleviate this problem and is considering a number of speed detection devices suitable for our road conditions and effective as deterrents.

Research has involved a lengthy consultation with neighbouring parishes who have already acquired such equipment and operated it for some time. We can report that the most effective means of curbing speeding, based on our consultation, appears to be Community Speedwatch. Some parishes say that the results have been conclusive - speeding has been noticeably reduced.

However, this would require volunteers to operate the equipment. Please contact me if you would be prepared to participate, should the PC decide to go ahead with this initiative – full training would be given.
