

Welcome



Dear friends.

As I write this, we seem to be plunging into a belated winter, with freezing

temperatures, and even a glimpse of some snow in Raydon. My beloved cat 'Baby' (very Freudian) is not amused and has been snuggling up on my bed at nights, with his head on my pillow for warmth and comfort (for us both)!

This year Easter is coming early - Easter Sunday is on 27 March, and I do hope the cold will not persist, as we have lots of outdoor activities to offer you, from our annual Good Friday walk, to the Easter Vigil at Higham on Holy Saturday, to an Easter egg hunt for the young 'uns after our Easter morning services.

As usual, Geoff Horrex has been planning interesting routes for our walk on Good Friday, which will start at St Mary's Raydon with a very short opening act of worship at 9 a.m. We shall then walk to Holton, where we shall enact the 2nd part of the great drama of 'the Passion' - the story of Jesus' arrest and crucifixion. Then we shall go down to Higham, where, after the 3rd part of the drama we shall be greeted with soup. bread and cheese for our lunch, and then finally we shall head off to Stratford St Marv. where we shall have the final part of the drama and some short prayers to end the day by 3 p.m. If you are planning to join us, the easiest thing is to find someone else who is coming, and one set leave their car at Raydon and the other at Stratford, so that you can get back home easily afterwards.

The Easter Vigil on Saturday starts with a bonfire in the churchyard at Higham, at which the Paschal (Easter) candles for all 4 of our churches are lit, followed by some short readings and prayers inside the church. The candles are then taken back to the churches by our Churchwardens, and are used at our Easter services and at baptisms for the next year.

Both our Easter morning services - at Holton St Mary and Stratford St Mary - will be at 10 a.m. and will be specially aimed at families, so do come and bring your children, grandchildren, nephews, nieces, etc etc. And, speaking of families, please don't forget to come to our special family service at Stratford St Mary for Mothering Sunday at 10 a.m. on 6 March, led by the Youth Team from Hadleigh. It should be fun!

Finally, for those of you who are wondering what we are doing about the roof at Stratford St Mary church, we are continuing to fundraise, and are about to submit an application to a governmental fund. If we are successful at the latter, we shall not receive their contribution until July, so until then we shall keep the tarpaulin up. However, I can now report that, if we are permitted by the Diocese to do so, the PCC has decided to replace the stolen lead with Terne-coated steel so that we do not become subject to yet another lead-theft. Thank you to all who have donated so far.

God bless you all in this time of Lent as we lead up to the joyful celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Day.

STRATFORD ST MARY CHURCH An update on the Roof!


We are currently in the process of applying for a grant from the Listed Places of Worship Roof Repair Fund (an initiative from the Government) to help with the cost of a replacement roof. The deadline for the application is 26th February and we will know by early July if we have been successful.

At our recent Parochial Church Council meeting we voted in favour of replacing the roof with Terne coated steel as opposed to lead (subject of course to the relevant planning permissions). We have taken advice from our Diocesan Architect who feels this is the best course of action. Lead is still being stolen from church roofs despite an alarm being fitted! Terne coated steel has little value to thieves.

We are of course still continuing to raise money ourselves to help with the costs involved, and we are very grateful to everyone who has already made donations- a huge thank you!

We will keep you updated as and when we have further developments to report.

Burglaries – Other Buildings, These relate to sheds, garages or outbuildings where items such as ride on mowers, power tools, bicycles and hand tools are stolen.

Protect your **Shed & Garage** by following these simple steps...

- Fit a strong hasp and staple secured to the door and frame with coach bolts reinforced on the inside with washers.
- Use a good quality closed shackle padlock,(some have an integral alarm built in)
- Door hinges should also be secured with coach bolts reinforced on the inside with washers.
- Windows can be secured and obscured by fitting internal bars or grille and net curtains.
- Keep doors and windows locked.
- Fit additional locks to up and over garage doors. Anchoring and garage defenders.
- A battery operated audible alarm can be used to deter intruders.
- Security mark items of value with your postcode and house number or name.
 Do not leave valuable equipment unattended.
- Install external lighting with Dusk to Dawn automatic sensors.
- Expensive items should be chained to a ground anchor or post securely fitted to the floor.
- Photographs of expensive items, a record of their model and serial number will assist in their recovery if stolen.



Bonfires

We've been asked by a few people to highlight nuisance bonfires in the area. Here is an extract form the advice sheet found on the Babergh council website.

There are no specific controls, such as permitted times, over the lighting of bonfires to burn waste. If only dry waste is burnt the occasional bonfire should not cause a problem. If the bonfire is more regular, a lot of smoke and ash is being produced, or the material being burnt is potentially hazardous to health, it may become a 'statutory nuisance' and action could be taken under the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 (as amended) it is an offence for people to dispose of their domestic waste in a way likely to cause pollution of the environment or harm to human health. In practice you should not burn waste that is likely to create excessive smoke or noxious fumes. If only dry garden waste is burnt, your bonfire should not cause a problem.

Most bonfire problems are addressed under nuisance legislation. Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990, a statutory nuisance includes "smoke, fumes or gases emitted from premises so as to be prejudicial to health or a nuisance." In practice a fire would have to be a recurrent persistent problem, interfering substantially with neighbours' well-being, comfort or enjoyment of their property.

If a bonfire of industrial or commercial waste is emitting black smoke it is dealt with under the Clean Air Act 1993 – this includes the burning of such material in your garden! Under section 34 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 it is illegal to dispose of waste that is not from your property – for example from your workplace or from a neighbour. For example, small tradesmen must not burn waste from site at home.
