

We have had a very peculiar summer in terms of weather, but I have been fascinated

to watch the harvest being gathered in by huge, monster-like machines in the fields behind my house and around our villages. As we celebrate God's good gifts to us in our Harvest Services this month, please continue to think of all who work on the land as 'Brexit' continues to create uncertainties about subsidies and about how the UK will produce food for its own people in future.

I trust that you have all had some time to relax and be with your families, and to prepare for going back to work or school, or starting at school, college, university or a new job. I shall look forward to meeting the new children in the school at Stratford St Mary. I've met guite a few more children on the streets of our villages in recent weeks thanks to the Pokémon Go! craze that has hit us, with churches apparently being targeted as sites for discovery of the various kinds of Pokémon location. If Pokémon had only warned us in advance. I'm sure we could have provided something a bit more interesting for adventurous children to enjoy!

This year, we would very much like to start having children more involved in our church services. The sort of thing that children currently do is to take up the Communion bread and wine, or take the collection. They also occasionally read lessons and lead the prayers. But in future our PCCs have also voted that children could be trained to help give Communion in our services, alongside

me. It would be wonderful to see children taking up this possibility, so if your children would like to get involved in taking some real responsibilities in our services, they would be very welcome. Please do just let me know if this is something that would interest you and your children (of any age upwards of 5, I should think).

This month we continue our Prayer Walks once a week, walking round the parishes and praying for those whose houses we pass. I hope you have felt prayed for! From October we shall be reverting to a pattern of Morning Prayer in the four churches, so look out for next month's centrefold, which will have the details.

It also contains the histories of each of our churches, and I would be happy to add any other pages that you might feel would be appropriate.

Meanwhile, I wish you all a very happy September as life gets back to 'normal' after the summer.



SPEEDING - HELP TO MAKE RAYDON SAFER

It is a matter of extreme concern to your Parish Council that speeding traffic in the village is becoming more prevalent by the day - and statistics show an alarming picture.

Your Parish Council is determined to try to alleviate this problem and is considering a number of speed detection devices suitable for our road conditions and effective as deterrents.

Research has involved a lengthy consultation with neighbouring parishes who have already acquired such equipment and operated it for some time. We can report that the most effective means of curbing speeding, based on our consultation, appears to be Community Speedwatch. Some parishes say that the results have been conclusive - speeding has been noticeably reduced.

However, this would require volunteers to operate the equipment. Please contact me if you would be prepared to participate, should the PC decide to go ahead with this initiative – full training would be given.

New Electricity National Phone number

On 6th September a new national phone number "105" will be launched by electricity network operators for customers to call should they need to report or get information about a power cut in their area.


Key points to note about this service are:

- Dialling 105 will put customers through to their local electricity network operator the company that manages the cables, power lines and substations that deliver electricity into homes and businesses in their area.
- 105 is just one of the ways that customers can contact their electricity network operator. They can also contact them by phone or via their website, and most network operators are on social media too.
- 105 is a free service for people in England, Scotland and Wales.
- · Customers can call 105 no matter who they choose to buy electricity from.
- Customers can also call 105 if they spot damage to electricity power lines and substations that could put anyone in danger. If there's a serious immediate risk, they should call the emergency services too.

As previously reported, our first Public and Patient Engagement Meeting under the auspices of the PPG took place last month, on the topic of the Prevention of Diabetes and its Complications. The feedback we have had from that meeting has been very encouraging such that we firmly intend to hold further similar meetings on topics of general health interest. In response to the number of requests for a meeting on the Prevention of Heart Attacks and other related heart topics, we will be asking an eminent cardiologist to give the talk at our next meeting. More details of this event. which we intend to hold in Capel, will follow shortly. A range of different health related topics will be considered by the PPG for our subsequent events, but suggestions from patients or from members of the public on topics they would like to see covered - and to which they feel they would like to come - will be very welcome. Please use a comment card and drop it into one of our PPG comment boxes in the two waiting room areas, or let me or Kathy Pollard, PPG Chair, or, indeed, any member of the PPG, have your suggestions. Do, please, continue to use these comment cards on any issue within the practice that you feel we should know about - good or not so good. We pursue them all and our contact details are displayed in both surgeries.

A lot of the update article by Pete Keeble, the Practice Manager, this month refers to prescribing issues and the proper use of medicines is something which members of the PPG strongly support. Nationally, a huge amount of money is spent on drugs supplied within the NHS, many of which are required on a long-term basis. The repeat prescription facility is something we all need to give some thought to, as it is well recognised that some of us tend to stock pile medication that we don't really need – yet. Just look inside your bathroom cabinet,

or wherever you keep your medicines, and check that you really do need a routine repeat of everything that is on your repeat prescription request form this month. For all sorts of reasons, including (let's be honest) occasionally forgetting to take the medication, or because of a variation in pack sizes. you might find that you have more than enough of one or more of your drugs to last you another four weeks, so you really don't need to order any more. And it does matter for a number of reasons why over-ordering of medicines is not a good idea: for example, they may go out-of-date, your doctor may change your treatment, or you might unpredictably develop side effects. So it makes good practical sense, for repeat prescriptions, only to order what you need for the following four weeks and to submit or drop in your request form a clear 72 hours before you need to receive. or to pick up, the dispensed medicines.
